





Prayer and Worship

Reflection on the Twenty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time Love would solve all the world's problems.

In 1970, I was stationed in Boston in the Navy. We were decommissioning my ship, the USS Yorktown, at the Charlestown Naval Shipyards. One day, our officer-in-charge called us all together telling us that sailors were sneaking off base, out of uniform, to one of the many sandwich shops around the perimeter of the base (the chow was awful at the shipyard!). We were not allowed off base unless we were wearing our dress uniforms, but most of the



time we were in our work clothes. Shortly after being warned, I decided I simply had to have a hero sandwich for lunch. I slipped through a break in the fence, planning to be back inside the shipyard within 10 minutes. Just as I finished sneaking through the fence, the Shore Patrol drove around a corner and caught me. I remember pleading with them to release me; I did not want to go to the brig nor face the officer whom I got along with so well. They showed mercy, and with my promise to never do it again, they dropped me off at the break in the fence where I slipped back on base. This was the first and only time I disobeyed a direct order—you see, I just had to have that delicious sandwich!

What is it in our DNA that we sometimes do things that we have been told directly not to do? In his letter to the Romans, St. Paul said, "What I do I do not understand. For I do not do the good I want, but I do the evil I do not want." I am sure each of us has done something in our lives we know we should not do. Yet, we did it anyway.

This leads into our first reading: Just before God allowed the Israelites to enter the Promised Land, Moses commanded the people to **hear** and **keep** God's decrees so that they may live. Moses commanded the people to observe these laws carefully and not to add to or subtract from them. At this point in time, Israel's tragic situation during the last 40 years was the result of infidelity and disobedience. The answer to Israel's problem was conversion and obedience. Unfortunately, Israel continued being unfaithful and disobedient. It seems that listening and obeying God was too difficult. Today, we have the same problems—an example of history repeating itself when we are told not to do something and do it anyway. We do it even with the Word of God!

Next, in the New Testament Letter of James, we find that the Word of God has been planted in us. It is able to save our soul. We are told to be doers of the word, taking care of anyone around us who needs help, like orphans and widows. To be doers of the Word, we must listen and obey God's decrees, which encompasses taking care of the less fortunate. St. James implies that the evidence of our faith in Christ is seen in how we deal with others as well as in our obedience to God. Are we doing everything we can? What about the Word of God planted in our souls? Are we listening?

The Pharisees in today's Gospel were the most influential religious-political party in New Testament times. They were consistent opponents of Jesus Christ throughout His ministry. Why? They focused on the Mosaic Law, but over time it had expanded with cumbersome human traditions, rejecting Jesus' message focusing on love of neighbor.

Jesus, led by the Holy Spirit, was revealing to them His mandate to love and serve others. This is embedded in the New Covenant, which Jesus initiated and sealed by His passion, death, and resurrection. However, many still would not listen.

To grow in holiness we need to listen, keep God's commandments, love one another, and practice charity. We must strive for these virtues whether we are at war, peace, or in a world-wide pandemic.

St. Augustine said, "Love and do what you will." If humans would only "love," all the problems in the world could be solved.

Sharing Your Faith

Question: My friend has never heard of Christ and I want to share the Gospel with her but I'm afraid to. How do I share my faith?

Answer: There are a lot of ways to bring up the topic of religion, without being judgmental or pushy. Begin by asking what her thoughts are about religion, or what her experience was growing up. Finding common ground is often easier than you think, because the questions and problems we have about God, the presence of evil, our purpose in life, and our relationship with God are universal concerns. Why are you afraid? If you do not want to insult or offend someone, don't be pushy or judgmental. If you are uncertain about how to explain your own faith, do a little reading or practice with a friend. If you measure success only by this person converting, focus your attention more on beginning the conversation, not on bringing it to a perfect close! Faith is a journey of many acts of belief, many discussions about God, and many choices about how we practice what we preach. In some we will have great success; in others we will need forgiveness and perseverance. The most important thing to keep in mind is that the Holy Spirit is always at work and our most humble efforts can bear great fruit. Have faith in God because he has faith in you!

Blessing of New Cross at St. Mary's Cemetery Springfield on Sept. 10

Bishop Edward M. Rice will bless a large new cross in the center altar area at St. Mary's Cemetery on **Fri., Sept. 10, at 10:30 a.m., at the cemetery**, located in the 2400 block of W. Mt. Vernon (between Kansas Expressway and Scenic Ave.). In 1998, vandals stole an earlier cross that had long stood in that area. The new cross was donated by William B. Johnson, owner of Prestressed Casting Co., which constructed it. Due to the pandemic, the cross was installed in July of last year with little fanfare. The public is invited to this blessing and dedication. St. Mary's Cemetery was established in 1872 and incorporated within Greene County in 1895.




