Our Lady of the Rosary, pray for us!

As I write this column, I am looking at a photo sent to me of Fr. Patrick Peyton, C.S.C., founder of Family Rosary, who is now recognized by the Church with the title "Venerable," which indicates he's on the road to canonization. It was Fr. Peyton who popularized the phrase, "The family that prays together, stays together." And of course, his prayer was the rosary. He was also famous for the phrase, "A world at prayer is a world at peace." In 1971, he held Rosary Rallies in El Salvador with more than two million people attending! Throughout the pandemic, I have encouraged the faithful of the Diocese of Springfield-Cape Girardeau to consider their home to be the "Domestic Church," where the faith is lived and supported long before the family comes to Mass at the "Parish Church." In the Domestic Church, parents give the example of faith to inspire the faith of their Children. In the Domestic Church religious activities occur such as the Family Rosary, reading the Sunday Gospel in preparation for Sunday Mass, or night prayers, etc. These activities compliment and culminate in the Sunday celebration of Mass. And the Sunday celebration of Mass compliments and flows into the activities of the Domestic Church.

THE DOMESTIC CHURCH

So, do you consider your home to be a Domestic Church? Are there Domestic Church activities that celebrate the liturgical seasons? Is there a sacred space for an altar, or a crucifix, or statue of Our Lady? Do you have a set time for family prayer, such as before and after dinner, before homework or before you go to bed? There are endless possibilities. If you Google, "Ideas for Building Your Domestic Church," the Knights of Columbus have great ideas. In addition, the US Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) has "Tools for Becoming a Domestic Church." The last thing we want to do is go back to "normal" once the Pandemic is over. Our "New Normal" should be a beautiful fostering of faith between home and parish. Let's not go back to "normal." I've stated numerous times: once the pandemic has run its course, I hope we can look back on this experience and be proud of how we conducted ourselves. Let us avoid the acrimonious debates. What should we do? How about committing to an hour of Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament at your parish or Adoration Chapel? And while you are there, pick up the greatest weapon known to humanity – the Rosary!

MONTH OF THE ROSARY



October is the Month of the Rosary, with the Feast of the Holy Rosary on October 7. The message of Our Lady at Fatima is challenging. 1) Offer sacrifices to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, through the Immaculate Heart of Mary; 2) Pray the Rosary daily for world peace; 3) Consecrate yourself to the Immaculate Heart and wear the Brown Scapular of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel as a sign of your consecration; 4) Offer up Holy Communion

of Reparation on the first Saturday of the month. This is our Lady's "peace plan from heaven." We Catholics have been entrusted with the instruments of peace and if there is no peace in this world it is our fault for not heeding the message of Our Lady. We have no one to blame but ourselves. Have you ever Googled quotes about the Rosary? There are many inspiring thoughts from many people. My favorite is from Pope Pius IX, "Give me an army praying the Rosary and I will conquer the world." How about "If you desire peace in your hearts, in your homes, and in your country, assemble each evening to recite the Rosary" (Pope Pius XI). Finally, from Sr. Lucia herself, "There is no problem, I tell you, no matter how difficult it is, that we cannot resolve by the prayer of the Holy Rosary." Our Lady of the Rosary, pray for us! ©TM

Breaking the Stewardship Mold

Have you noticed how we always tend to pigeonhole one another — and ourselves? “I could never serve on the Parish Council. That’s for Rick and Ellen and that whole group of people who have done it for years.” “Greg takes care of faith formation in the parish — he always has. He doesn’t need my help.” “I can’t afford to give the big bucks like those families who sit up front can. My offering wouldn’t matter even if I did increase it.”

Thinking like this is a good indication that we aren’t in conversation with God about what His will is for our lives. If we have already decided what we are and are not meant to do, we aren’t likely to pray over it, to discern it.

We have to be open to the spirit of the Lord wherever it leads us, regardless of what we or others have come to expect from us. We human beings come to believe that we are such good judges of what others can offer — or what we ourselves can offer. But God has plans for us to which we aren’t privy. God calls everyone to serve Him in the way that pleases Him best, and only He can decide what that is. Everyday Stewardship demands a continual accounting of who we can be, what we can offer — even if it’s outside our comfort zone, even if it’s something that never occurred to us before.

There’s only one Person who can tell us what God wants from us. Do we even think to ask Him?




