If you were here on Wednesday, you know we did brisk business welcoming the faithful into these forty days of Spiritled reflection.

A number of Lenten activities are already in full swing, including fish frys (Fridays in More Hall, 5-7PM); community-led Stations of the Cross (Fridays in the church @ 5:30PM); and our \$20 for Lent campaign. Our STM School junior high students are beginning weekly time in Eucharistic Adoration, and all students will experience weekly Stations of the Cross as part of their Lenten formation. \$20 for Lent



1 MARCH 8 INTRODUCTION TO Spiritual Warfare and the Discernment of Spirits

Spiritual warfare is not only about Rosaries and prayers to Saint Michael. These are some of its most potent weapons, but as Cassian reminds his monks: without the use of discretion, even the holiest and stoutest of monks can be brought down. More than a pitched battle, spiritual warfare is about listening and being attentive to the presence of God and His angels and identifying the attempts of the evil spirits to draw us from the path our Father created for us. We will begin opening this world of discernment and the spiritual life looking at the Church Fathers and our long-standing tradition in discerning God's presence and Will.

2 MARCH 15 THE BASIC PRINCIPLES OF DISCERNMENT

God is speaking to us in every moment and is attentive to even the smallest details of our life. Once we turn our attention toward the discernment of spirits, we quickly find that almost everything we've been taught and have done in discernment is wrong. The first part in re-shifting our attention is to recall the key ingredients: identifying consolations and desolations; using and being guided by virtue, discerning along the way through God's blessings and our companions; and being confident that God is speaking in every moment.

3 MARCH 22 Rules 1-4: Identifying Desolation and Consolation

We begin to look closely at Saint Ignatius' Rules of Discernment. In the beginning, the focus lies in identifying desolations and consolations, and choosing to flee desolation while pursuing consolation.

A |MARCH 29 | Rules 5-9: Responding to Desolation

In rules five through nine, Saint Ignatius focuses his attention on the challenge of responding to desolation. While the basic advice is to avoid making decisions while we are in desolation, Saint Ignatius and others offer practical insight in how to actually respond and how these desolations can help one move closer to God.

5 APRIL 5 Rules 10-14: Strengthening and Growing in Discernment

In the final session, we look at the final rules that Saint Ignatius gives us, as well as how this discernment also helps us in our relationships, responding in day-to-day situations, and in deepening our spiritual life all together.



Sorrow in the return from Egypt and Joy in life with Jesus and Mary in Nazareth

When praying the Seven Sundays devotion, it is customary to pray **for a specific intention,** asking Saint Joseph's powerful intercession for your needs.

Introductory Prayer

O glorious Saint Joseph, you marveled to see the King of heaven obedient to your commands. Your consolation in bringing Jesus out of the land of Egypt was troubled by your fear of Archelaus. Nevertheless, being assured by an angel, you lived in gladness at Nazareth with Jesus and Mary. By this sorrow and this joy, obtain for us that our hearts may be delivered from harmful fears, so that we may rejoice in peace of conscience and may live with Jesus and Mary, and, like you, may die in their company.

Gospel Reading | Matthew 2:19-23; Luke 2:40

But when Herod died, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared in a dream to Joseph in Egypt, saying, "Rise, take the child and his mother, and go to the land of Israel, for those who sought the child's life are dead." And he rose and took the child and his mother, and went to the land of Israel. But when he heard that Archelaus reigned over Judea in place of his father Herod, he was afraid to go there, and being warned in a dream he withdrew to the district of Galilee. And he went and dwelt in a city called Nazareth, that what was spoken by the prophets might be fulfilled, "He shall be called a Nazarene."
