





Faithful People of Saint Thomas More,

Next weekend, Blest Art will be with us for the first time since 2016. For those unfamiliar with them, Blest Art works to maintain the Christian presence in the Holy Land, by taking the olive-wood crafts made there and making them available for purchase in the US. For many Christians in the Holy Land who depend on the pilgrim and tourist trade, disruptive forces (e.g., pandemics) jeopardize their ability to keep their families in the land where Jesus lived and ministered. We've timed their arrival to take the place of the annual Saint Joseph Table, which was canceled this year due to safety concerns.

Blest Art will have their items available for both perusal and sale in the narthex this weekend.

This upcoming week will mark the two year anniversary of the 2020 shut-down brought about by the pandemic. Next week in my column I'll give an overview of how we've responded to those realities here at STM, lingering impacts from the pandemic (e.g., the annual Saint Joseph Table), and plans for our continued response moving forward.

Haunted by God: Life of Dorothy Day



When praying the Seven Sundays devotion, it is customary to pray **for a specific intention,** asking Saint Joseph's powerful intercession for your needs.

Introductory Prayer

O glorious Saint Joseph, pattern of all holiness, when you lost the child Jesus, you sought him sorrowing for the space of three days, until with great joy you found him again in the temple, sitting in the midst of the doctors. By this sorrow and this joy, we ask you, with our hearts upon our lips, to keep us from ever having the misfortune of losing Jesus through mortal sin. Grant also that we always may seek him with unceasing sorrow, when we commit a serious sin, until we find him again, ready to show us his great mercy in the sacrament of Reconciliation.

Gospel Reading | Luke 2:41-50

Now his parents went to Jerusalem every year at the feast of the Passover. And when he was twelve years old, they went up according to custom; and when the feast was ended, as they were returning, the boy Jesus stayed behind in Jerusalem. His parents did not know it, but, supposing him to be in the company,

they went a day's journey, and they sought him among their kinsfolk and acquaintances; and when they did not find him, they returned to Jerusalem, seeking him. After three days they found him in the Temple, sitting among the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions; and all who heard him were amazed at his understanding and his answers. And when they saw him they were astonished; and his mother said to him, "Son, why have you treated us so? Behold, your father and I have been looking for you anxiously."

And he said to them, "How is it that you sought me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" And they did not understand the saying which he spoke to them.


