



Faithful People of Saint Thomas More,

This week marks the two year anniversary of the shut-down brought upon by the pandemic. Evidence remains of this disruptive event, and I thought this would be a good chance to review what a few of those consequences have been for our community, how we have responded, and some proximate plans on the horizon.

How we've responded thus far:

+ **Our STM School** has fine-tuned its policies toward handling COVID exposures or positive cases in the community, over the last two years, especially since moving to a mask-optional policy in mid-January. That process came through much feedback and guidance from our school parents, and should help us navigate the transition into an endemic.

+ **Our daily-postings of online Masses** began on March 21, 2020, and we have continued, even as the faithful have returned to in-person worship. We continue to get "views" as well as unsolicited appreciation from parishioners who use those offerings as a lifeline of connection to the community. While there are strong arguments that an online presence can enable people who could be with us but simply remain away from the assembly, there is also evidence that our offering is connecting the disconnected, and perhaps providing some needed evangelization to those who might not grace our doors. At this juncture we will continue with our daily postings, through the exceptionally devoted cadre of parishioners who record/post.

+ **Weekly email blasts.** We started these (March 16, 2020) as a way to communicate during the 2020 spring lock-down of the ministry that was continuing, even as it could feel like everything in the world had ground to a halt. It has become surprisingly appealing, with about a 52% open rate every week (roughly 750 people opening the email and allowing graphics to load), and so will likely remain an arrow in our quiver of communication channels.

+ **QR Codes.** Discussions with our Finance Council encouraged us to look for "touchless" ways to contribute, especially as taking up a physical collection at Mass was eliminated for a long stretch, and more of our younger families have become savvy with making online offerings from their phones. In ad-

dition to the code for giving purposes on the laminated cards in the pews, we have one for additional information about ministry opportunities we promote during the week.

+ **Hiring of Coordinator of Evangelization and Discipleship.** It became apparent that some new, creative ways of ministry were being asked of us, and in that spirit, hired our Evangelization & Discipleship Coordinator at the end of 2020. While Dana might have connected with some of you through ministries like Confirmation, Sacramental Preparation, or our Living Waters offerings, I suspect many in the community are unaware of the largest investment of her work through small group development. Last weekend, Dana completed the second offering of a weekly, months-long process to help forge our parishioners in their ability and responsibility to lead others to Jesus. Some of the fruits of these sessions with your friends and neighbors are already ripening and beginning to quietly display themselves in parish life.

How we will respond moving forward:

+ **School enrollment** took a loss of about 60 students in the first year of the pandemic (2020-21), but regained over half of those losses this year, including adding a fourth kindergarten class. We anticipate drawing close to our pre-pandemic numbers for the 2022-23 academic year. (Additional note: We hired our principal at the beginning of the pandemic, and she has only known our community in the pandemic. We have great anticipation for her leadership as we transcend these times.)

+ For the moment, **our Ministers of Communion** - both lay and clergy - will continue to be masked for the distribution of communion.

+ **Offering both species** - i.e., returning the Precious Blood to distribution - remains on hold per the diocese.

+ While a number of **social offerings** have been affected, (e.g., coffee and doughnuts; funeral lunches; Saint Joseph Table), our youth and family offerings outside of the school - as the school provides a well-regulated environment - have been the most impacted. Delays in vaccine-availability to the youngest in our community (still unavailable for those 5 and under), mean that these ministries (e.g. availability of the nursery) have been the most muted.

At this month's Finance Council meeting, the Council members will be looking at preliminary budget items for 2022-23, including growing the areas that address our youth and family offerings at the parish.

While these remarks only cover a handful of areas, know that I remain grateful for the fidelity and versatility of our parishioners during these bewildering two years. May we see, in time, that God has borne much good for us through this experience.



8th Grade: Project Cure's Kits for Kids Program

Kits for Kids works through the Franciscan Mission Warehouse to provide personal hygiene and basic medicine cabinet items to parents in developing countries. Volunteer health professionals take the kits on clinic trips and do extensive health education with parents on the appropriate use of the supplies and preventive care in general. These basic supplies can mean the difference between life and death for kids around the world.

If you would like to help the 8th grade collect items, they are getting band-aids, combs, ace bandages, toothbrushes, toothpaste, travel-size tissues, blunt ended scissors, tweezers, nail clippers bars of soap, face masks...and contributions for shipping.

These items may be dropped off at the school or parish office. The 8th grade students will assemble the bags during Holy Week.


