THE PASTOR'S PEN

Faithful People of Saint Thomas More,

Over the next few days, every household in the diocese will be receiving a letter from Bishop Johnston, making us aware of a scholarship program provided by the State of Missouri, which has the ability to be transformational in its application towards our Catholic schools...including some families at STM School. Here at the parish, our principal, business manager and I have attended meetings over the last several weeks with the Bright Futures Fund, which is one of only nine entities in the state designated to allocate these funds. We have begun to put in place some of the groundwork to connect our parishioners with this opportunity, so just know we'll be communicating more about this, ahead of the July 1st roll out by the State of Missouri.

A reminder that this upcoming week is the traditional celebration of the Ascension of Jesus. In our diocese (and the Archdiocese of KCK), and in nearly every diocese in the nation, Ascension is annually transferred to next Sunday, May 29th. No "Ascension Thursday" for those old enough to remember this Holy Day of Obligation!

Thank you to those who supported last weekend's Tomorrow's Priests Collection. We have several ordinations on the horizon in our diocese, including one to the transitional diaconate (May 28th), sixteen to the permanent diaconate (June 18th), and one to the priesthood (June 25th). The priesthood ordination will be for Deacon Paul Sappington, who spent last summer with our STM community, so we are particularly excited about his return from Rome to begin priestly ministry in the diocese.

Along with these men - who will all get parish assignments - this is the season when our priests are notified about new assignments. A summer rarely goes by without some change in our clergy-staffing here at STM, so expect shifts here too.

The novena in honor of the Holy Spirit is the oldest of all novenas since it was first made at the direction of Our Lord Himself when He sent His apostles back to Jerusalem to await the coming of the Holy Spirit on the first Pentecost. It is still the only novena officially prescribed by the Church. Addressed to the Third Person of the Blessed Trinity, it is a powerful plea for the light and strength and love so sorely needed by every Christian.

ACT OF CONSECRATION TO THE HOLY SPIRIT

(Recited daily during the Novena)

On my knees, before the great multitude of heavenly witnesses, I offer myself, soul and body to You, Eternal Spirit of God. I adore the brightness of Your purity, the unerring keenness of Your justice, and the might of Your love. You are the Strength and Light of my soul. In You I live and move and am. I desire never to grieve You by unfaithfulness to grace and I pray with all my heart to be kept from the smallest sin against You. Mercifully guard my every thought and grant that I may always watch for Your light, listen to Your voice, and follow Your gracious inspirations. I cling to You and give myself to You and ask You, by Your compassion, to watch over me in my weakness. Holding the pierced Feet of Jesus, looking at His Five Wounds, trusting in His Precious Blood and adoring His opened Side and stricken Heart, I implore You, Adorable Spirit, Helper of my infirmity, to keep me in Your grace that I may never sin against You. Give me grace O Holy Spirit, Spirit of the Father and the Son, to say to You always and everywhere, "Speak Lord for Your servant heareth." Amen.

PRAYER FOR THE SEVEN GIFTS OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

(Recited daily during the Novena)

O Lord Jesus Christ Who, before ascending into heaven did promise to send the Holy Spirit to finish Your work in the souls of Your Apostles and Disciples, deign to grant the same Holy Spirit to me that He may perfect in my soul, the work of Your grace and Your love. Grant me the Spirit of Wisdom that I may despise the perishable things of this world and aspire only after the things that are eternal, the Spirit of Understanding to enlighten my mind with the light of Your divine truth, the Spirit on Counsel that I may ever choose the surest way of pleasing God and gaining heaven, the Spirit of Fortitude that I may bear my cross with You and that I may overcome with courage all the obstacles that oppose my salvation, the Spirit of Knowledge that I may know God and know myself and grow perfect in the science of the Saints, the Spirit of Piety that I may find the service of God sweet and amiable, and the Spirit of Fear that I may be filled with a loving reverence towards God and may dread in any way to

displease Him. Mark me, dear Lord with the sign of Your true disciples, and animate me in all things with Your Spirit. Amen.

The Novena begins on the day after the Solemnity of the Ascension, Friday of the 6th Week of Easter, even if the Solemnity of the Ascension is transferred to the 7th Sunday.

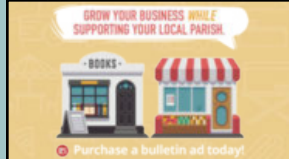

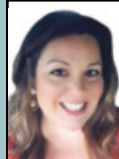
