

➤ From Father Barlett ◀

Taking a quick break from our walk through the Catechism, the next few weeks we will take a look at some devotions coming to St. Rose. Part of the purpose of a local parish is to foster devotional life so these treasures can be brought into the home, the domestic Church. No devotion is necessary for salvation, but each one offers a unique aspect of the faith to help us deepen our love for God and His Church. In addition to deepening the faith, most devotions have promises attached to them so that, if the faithful fulfill what is requested of them, God will provide unique graces.

This may sound superstitious at first, but it is very much in keeping with Christ's teaching. We look to the Sacraments to see that God promises grace when mankind fulfills what is asked of him. In the Sacraments, if the right person says the right prayers using the right materials, then God's grace comes, no questions asked! This is a huge blessing that we have aspects of our faith we can turn to so as to ALWAYS receive grace no matter what. Think of the promises attached to devotions in the same light.

With this being the year of St. Joseph I think it would be best to start with the First Wednesday Devotion. St. Joseph has promised that, "those who honor me in this way will be consoled by my presence at their death, and I myself will conduct them safely into the presence of Jesus and Mary." This fits with the tradition that St. Joseph is the patron of a happy death. We should pray to him regularly that he will be at our side, as the promise states, leading and guiding us into eternal life. He is also known as "Terror of Demons" and so is one we want near at the time of our death as many souls have professed seeing the devil approaching the dying knowing that this is his last chance to try and steal this soul out of the hands of God.

To fulfill the First Wednesday devotion we are asked to: 1) Recite the Joyful Mysteries of the Rosary in honor of Joseph's role in the hidden life of the Holy Family, focusing on Joseph's love for Jesus and Mary and the sorrows Joseph shared with them, and 2) Receive Holy Communion in a state of grace in union with Joseph's love for the Christ Child.

To implement this devotion at St. Rose, we will continue with the practice of praying the Litany of St. Joseph after Mass and then pray the Rosary. Mass will be moving to 8:00am on Wednesdays to both work with the Newman Center's schedule and try to open this morning time up for more people to come to Mass. This devotion can be implemented in your home by making an extra effort to go to Mass (Cathedral has an evening Mass on Wednesdays if the morning does not work for you) and by praying the Rosary together as a family. No matter what your situation, I invite you to make First Wednesday Rosary as a family part of your home life, most especially in this year of St. Joseph.


