#### PASTOR'S COLUMN

Wednesday, February 2, we celebrate the Presentation of the Lord and Candlemas Day.

February 2nd is the fortieth day after **Christmas**, a number that marks a time of significance especially in regard to conversion and celebration. Although the blessing of candles did not begin to occur until the 11th Century, the Feast of the Presentation of Jesus in the Temple was connected with the procession of lit candles since the fifth century. The Christ child, who is the Light of the world, was brought into the Temple of Jerusalem forty days after His birth; the candles of course signify His light. The Presentation of our Lord is celebrated concurrently with the Feast of the Purification of Mary and has been since early times.

The Roman Church, up until recently, called this Feast the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary while the Greek churches have called it the Presentation or the Meeting. Joseph and Mary brought the child Jesus to Jerusalem in order to fulfill two Old Testament Mosaic commandments. First, the ritual purification of a mother after the birth of her first son. Second, the presentation and redemption, or buying back, of the first born son who was to be specially dedicated to God as a thanksgiving sacrifice in remembrance of the saving of the Israelite firstborn sons at the time of the Exodus.

At this propitious meeting, the prophet Simeon gives us the beautiful canticle, Nunc Dimittis: "Lord, now you let your servant go in peace; your word has been fulfilled: my own eyes have seen the salvation which you have prepared the sight of every people: a light to reveal you to the nations and the glory of your people Israel."

We are scheduling an additional Mass at 5:15 pm in the Chapel that day (in addition to the 6:30 am Mass and the All-School Mass at 8:45 am—Please note change in time. This Mass is open to the public).

We will have Blessing of Candles at all Masses. You may bring your own candles and have them blessed. We will also have a small supply of candles you may pick up for a donation.

Thursday, February 3, we celebrate the Feast of St. Blaise and will also schedule an additional Mass at 5:15 pm in the Chapel. Throats will be blessed at both Masses, 6:30 am and 5:15 pm.

Friday, February 4 is the First Friday of the Month and we will have Adoration in the Chapel following the 6:30 am Mass. Confessions will begin at 3:30 pm and Benediction follows. Mass is at 5:15 pm—also in the Chapel.

#### CHORALE AND ORCHESTRA NOTES

#### W.A. Mozart, Missa Brevis in F (K 192)

This Mass was composed when Mozart (b. Salzburg 1756; d. Vienna 1791) was 18. It was completed in Salzburg, in June of 1774, while Mozart was employed by Archbishop Colloredo, who decreed that Masses—music and all—not last more than 45 minutes. This accounts for Mozart's designation of eight of his Masses as *missa brevis* or "brief mass." Arthur Mendel, the editor of the score used by the Chorale for this Mass, notes that "The work is one of the miracles of music—a miracle of brevity and of childlike simplicity of spirit." A miracle, ironically, that might not have occurred without the archbishop's strict 45-minute rule.

The Twin Cities Catholic Chorale is a non-profit organization that depends solely on the generosity of its patrons. Programs are available at the church entrances, and they are
