### Synod 2021 - 2023

In a nutshell, the 2021-2023 Synod is a series of listening sessions held by the bishop across the diocese. The bishop then submits this feedback to the United States Council of Catholic Bishops, who will in turn discuss this when they travel to the Vatican in 2023 to meet with the pope. More specific information (including dates and locations of the listening sessions) will be posted over the coming months. Below is a prayer for a successful and fruitful 2021-2023 Synod.

#### **Marguerite Ritzinger Scholarship**

Applications for the Marguerite Ritzinger Scholarship of the Diocese of Davenport are being accepted through Feb. 15th. Catholic individuals who plan to attend a college or university next fall may apply for a \$1,000 scholarship. The award is named for the late Marguerite Ritzinger, who left \$388,770 to the diocese to help with scholarships for students attending colleges or universities. Applications must include an essay, copy of a high school or college transcript and two reference letters. All items must be sent together. #### **Scams and Fraud**

Scams seem to be more prevalent this year, so please be cautious. Common scams include: an email or hardcopy bill stating, "your loan has been approved", or your "subscription has been updated". The email usually has a phone number for you to call. If you call, they will try and get your financial info – Don't give it out! A few things to remember: Fr Bill would never email/text to "ask for a favor" (he would call or visit in person); double-check with family and friends if you have been offered an item or service that seems too good to be true and see what they think; elderly people who live alone are the most common targets.
