

Confession

I have heard this all my life from my Protestant and Jewish friends about the Sacrament of Reconciliation: "Why do you Catholics have to confess your sins to a priest? Why not just confess them straight to God and avoid the middle man?" On the surface, that may be a reasonable supposition to ones outside the Catholic faith; after all, we all turn to God for mercy and forgiveness.

However, if we examine the logic of this supposition, there are a couple of flaws. One flaw is if we take it even a step further in confessing straight to God, why even bother confessing if we rightly claim that God is all-knowing. Since God already knows our sins, what is the point in confessing. In fact, let us go straight from the commission of the sin to God's forgiveness, bypassing things like confession, contrition, and atonement.

Another flaw in the logic of that statement is the assumption that if we look up to the sky and confess, all will be forgiven and we will be healed. If we do that, do we really know that God has forgiven us? How is that communicated? Do we really and truly feel forgiven and healed?

Jesus gave his apostles the authority to forgive sins, and that authority has been passed on through the centuries to where we are at 2000 years later. Before healing the paralytic, Jesus told him his sins are forgiven. If we truly desire healing, we need to hear those words, "your sins are forgiven." It all begins by confessing them to a priest.—TB

Remember the Synod?...Focus Areas

In Year I of the Synod, over 8,000 faithful attended the 30 Prayer and Listening Sessions. We prayed together and listened to one another. Over 35,000 comments were shared on what was working well in the Archdiocese and what areas needed strengthening. (Thank you to all of you who were able to participate in those sessions and share your feedback!) Based on this feedback, other consultations and discernment, Archbishop Hebda has determined the three focus areas that will shape the Year 3 Consultation process.

Forming parishes that are in the service of evangelization.

Forming missionary disciples who know Jesus' love and respond to his call.

Forming youth and young adults in and for a Church that is always young.

While these focus areas may seem quite broad, during Year 3 on the consultation process, we will have the opportunity to learn, pray, discuss and break it down further in small groups (more on this later). In the meantime, refer to insert which provides a deeper dive into the three focus areas.

Due to the pandemic, and the inability to gather, the two year Synod process expanded to three years. Year II focused on "The Church Prepares", in which the Archdiocese provided many free video series, on various topics, for the faithful to take advantage during lockdown and quarantine. 




