

Baptism Is About Forgiveness

Two years ago, we heard Matthew's version of the Baptism of the Lord. John complains by saying to Jesus, "I need to be baptized by you, yet you come to me?" Eventually the baptism happened.

Last year, we heard Mark's version of the Baptism of the Lord. Mark merely mentions Jesus being baptized by John without any protest from John.

This year, we hear Luke's version. The strange phenomenon in Luke's version is that Luke does not recount explicitly that Jesus was baptized by John. Rather, he stresses that Jesus was baptized only after all the people, and was praying when the heaven opened and the Holy Spirit descended upon him and he received the commission as Son and Servant. Jesus at prayer is particular to Luke. Luke emphasizes the importance of prayer by having it foreshadow every major event in throughout his Gospel and Acts.

Today's readings stress the universal importance of Jesus' commission as the servant Messiah. Jesus embodies and proclaims a way of justice, peace, and liberation. Of all the Gospels, Luke's emphasizes that this quest for justice must unfold in a non-violent manner that involves acceptance of the marginal and excluded, and culminates in the forgiveness of enemies. Christians today should think of their own baptism as a mission and a commission to be a light to the nations.

So, what are we to learn from all this, that we should apply to us today? Even though we are called to pray every day, prayer should always precede any major event in our life. Our baptism calls us to seek justice always. Our

baptism calls us to look out for each other especially the marginalized. Our baptism calls us to forgive everyone, especially our enemies.—TB





Inspiration for the week

Jesus stood in line with everyone else and was baptized. There is something incredibly humbling about how this must have played out. Then, God did something truly awesome and inspiring. Through a very gentle and simple action he let the world know about the special relationship He shares with Jesus. That's exactly what is so incredible about our baptisms as well! Through those holy waters God announces to the world the special place we also occupy in His heart. We no longer have to wonder about the purpose of our lives or struggle to find our way. We do not need to fumble around, tripping over ourselves and wondering why we are even here. The answer has been given. All we have to do is live out the vocation we have received, to live the Gospel in fidelity to our Creator. There is nothing to fear and worry has no place. Standing in line with other sinners, we have our anchor and God is very pleased.



SAINT OF THE WEEK

Born a pagan, St. Hilary (c. 315 – c. 367) studied philosophy and the meaning of life, eventually making his way through the bible. He became a convert and was appointed bishop of Poitiers in 353. Sometimes referred to as the Hammer of the Arians, St. Hilary defended the Nicene Creed against a popular heresy, Arianism. He was exiled to Phrygia for opposing Roman emperor Constantius II, who preferred the heresy which denies Christ's divinity. From Phyrgia St. Hilary fought with his pen, zealously writing against the heresy.

Eventually he was allowed to return to Poitiers, but did so by a circuitous route, preaching against Arianism all the way. St. Hilary was likely the first writer of hymns in the West, his writings on the Trinity, Psalms and Gospel of Matthew survive today. St. Hilary was created Doctor of the Church, a title given to those who provided important contributions to theology and doctrine, in 1851 by Pope Pius IX.





erfect prayer always gives to God first, then asks to receive, and the Our Father, coming from our Lord himself, sets the paradigm for this perfection. Saint Thomas Aquinas and Saint Augustine both pointed out that all prayer should be modeled on this perfect example, which even teaches us those things for which we should ask, and the order in which we should ask them.

This illustration sums up the seven precepts of the Our Father prayer. The first three concern God, while the other four concern us. It is through these last four—that is, through the grace of the Eucharist, the forgiveness of sins, the resisting of temptation and the deliverance from the penalty of sin-that we are best able to accomplish the first three, and thus to give glory to God by doing His will.
