

## Do Whatever He Tells You

Our Gospel passage brings us to the Wedding Feast at Cana, the sight of Jesus' first miracle: changing water into wine. I have a couple of stories that relate to this passage.

So, at the wedding feast, the wine ran short and Mary tells Jesus. Jesus replies, "Woman, how does your concern affect me? My hour has not yet come." Mary said to the servers, "Do whatever he tells you." That line Mary said sounds like something good enough to put on a poster. Every year in the fall when I was in seminary, we would wait with baited breath for the new vocation poster to come out, filled with smiling seminarians studying for the Archdiocese. Along with the faces of major and minor seminarians, would be a line from scripture. One year the

line from scripture was what Mary said to the servers, "Do whatever he tells you." Hundreds and hundreds of posters were printed out with smiling seminarians and "Do whatever he tells you" and were ready to be distributed. However, cold water was poured on the event of distribution when someone took offense and voiced their objection. The objection was that some people would not connect the line "Do whatever he tells you" to the Wedding Feast at Cana, but to priestly misconduct. My, my. Some people can be overly sensitive. Fortunately, the line appeared at the bottom of the poster and all they had to do was chop off "Do whatever he tells you." The poster was distributed without a scripture passage.

The other thing the Wedding Feast at Cana does for me is bring back fond memories of my pilgrimage in the Holy Land. We went and visited many sights. Some sights took on a sacramental theme. We went to the Jordan river and renewed our baptismal promises. And we indeed went to Cana to a church which legend has it was built on the very site of Jesus' first miracle. Many of the group I was in were married couples. It was an opportunity for them to renew the wedding vows, which they did and received a nuptial blessing. Yes, fond memories.—TB





## Inspiration for the week

Relationships are hard to clarify. Determining whether people in our lives are simply acquaintances and associates or a deeper level of friend is a journey that takes time. Identifying and celebrating those people who really care about us is a lifelong adventure that involves both moments of intense elation and heartache. Some relationships are more easily definable than others. Two people who are in love must decide whether the love they share has the freedom and depth necessary for lifelong commitments. Other relationships may look like friendship but may harbor grave dysfunction and toxicity. Discernment is needed on all fronts. Our relationship with God also needs definition and discernment. God has taken creation as His spouse and human beings as His children. God delights in us and all that He has made. The wedding feast at Cana demonstrates God's investment in all of this, especially our happiness. Life is a time for celebration and great rejoicing!



#### SAINT OF THE WEEK

Not much is known about the life of St. Sebastian (256 – 287), except that he was a Roman martyr whose name has been mentioned throughout history since early 350.

We see St. Sebastian many times in art, especially from iconic paintings from Guido Reni, Andrea Mantegna and Hendrick ter Brugghen. Historical scholars now agree that a spiritual story has the beloved saint entering the Roman army because only there could he assist Christian martyrs without arousing suspicion on himself. Eventually he was found out, brought before Emperor Diocletian and delivered to Mauritanian archers to be shot to death. Pierced with arrows, he was left for dead, but managed to survive. He recovered from his wounds but still refused to leave.

One day, St. Sebastian took up a position near where the emperor was to pass. He confronted the emperor, condemning him for his cruelty to Christians. This time the sentence of death was carried out, and St. Sebastian was beaten to death with clubs. Today he is the patron saint of athletes.






