

## LITURGICALLIFE

### Jesus Preaches in His Hometown

Coupled with last Sunday's Gospel reading, Jesus gives his inaugural address. He is portrayed as a pious Jew performing his religious duties. Yet he is also a prophet who wins the immediate attention of people who come to understand his words as judgment.

Today and now are stressed as Jesus fulfills the Scriptures; universal amazement and praise are mixed with wonder at Jesus' words. He heralds God's jubilee, bringing healing and release for the downtrodden and those overburdened with debt. He produces a reversal of worldly values when God's predilection for the poor, the weak, and the oppressed is manifest to all.

Luke has this event at the beginning of Jesus' public ministry and making Jesus' first words a commentary on the Isaian prophecy. This happens on a sabbath in the synagogue, the local place of worship. People reject Jesus because he is so familiar to them. Readers familiar with the ordinary but extraordinary events of Jesus' origins will not miss the irony of this reaction. Some version of Jesus' lament about a prophet's being rejected by his own appears in all four Gospels. But the One who proclaims the advent of God's kingdom cannot be silenced.—TB

#### Mass Times Follow-Up

I was expecting some negative feedback from last week's article, but received not. Folks who bothered to comment told me it makes sense and to go for it. However, someone did express concern about confessions. I have been thinking about confessions in the sense of adding confession times one half hour before each daily Mass. But since one confession time would be eliminated on Saturday evening, how do we make that up? Then I got to thinking

about my "Private Masses." I started those Saturday and Monday mornings when Covid hit as another option for folks to receive the Eucharist when the ten people in the building was implemented, and it has taken on a life of its own. These private Masses are more of an expectation now, and something should change.

So, without any objection, here is what we are going to do: Starting in Lent, both at Saint Pius and Saint Joseph, we will have confessions before each daily Mass. Starting on the weekend of Trinity Sunday, Saturday Morning, daily Mass will be at Saint Pius at 8:00 AM, with confessions to follow; the Saturday evening, vigil Mass will be at Saint Joseph 5:00 PM with confessions at 4:00 PM. Then on the weekend of the First Sunday of Advent, the Saturday morning daily Mass will be at Saint Joseph at 8:00 AM with confessions to follow; the Saturday evening vigil Mass will be at Saint Pius at 5:00 PM with confessions at 4:00 PM.

Finally, since we have not had the "no more than ten people in the building" rule, starting the Monday after Pentecost, scheduled private Masses will be eliminated.—TB



#### LIVE THE LITURGY

#### Inspiration for the week

Prophets possess an intimate knowledge of God and act on their experience of God. Prophetic messages usually challenge the status quo and draw us up and out of ourselves, focusing us on the bigger picture. We often think of ourselves and our own needs first. When we listen to someone speak, we judge the merit of the message by its degree of usefulness. If the message or vision contains no personal benefit or profit but a call to stretch and grow, we can become indignant. Prophets are usually the ones whose message challenges us and calls us to see things differently and love more perfectly and deeply. God is love. When listening to St. Paul speak about love we witness the unfolding of this type of unconditional, other centered, self-sacrificial perfect God. It is an invitation to life, freedom, and happiness that can be offered to us only by God. Jesus, who is God and Love incarnate, calls us to this richer expression of love. Are we ready to listen and be challenged and stretched?



#### SAINT OF THE WEEK

You may be familiar with the annual "blessing of throats" that many parishes in the United States use to commemorate the beloved bishop and martyr. St. Blaise lived in the fourth century in Turkey and Armenia. Due to religious persecution, he was forced to flee and hide in a cave in the back country in order to save his life.

History has it that one day a group of hunters stumbled upon where St. Blaise was living. They found the bishop kneeling in prayer, surrounded by wolves, lions and bears that he had tamed. The legend has it that as the hunters dragged Blaise off to prison, a mother came with her young son who had a fish bone lodged in his throat. At Blaise's command, the child was able to cough up the bone and thus lived.

Today we remember the saint on his feast day by taking two candles, crossing them against the throat, and saying the following prayer:

Through the intercession of St. Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from ailments of the throat and from every other evil. In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.


