

Weekly Meditation

They... offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. (Matthew2:II)

Gold, frankincense, and myrrh: these are the gifts fit for a king. Through them, the Magi were not only acknowledging Jesus as Israel's king, but they were also showing Mary and Joseph how honored they were to be in the presence of royalty.

Today is the feast of the Epiphany. At Mass on this special day, you'll also be in the presence of royalty: Jesus, the King of all creation. So how can you honor Jesus? You won't have gold, frankincense, or myrrh to offer, but here's what you can give him:

"Jesus, King of kings, in place of *gold*, I honor you as my king by offering you my obedience and making you the Lord of my life. Out of love for you, I want to be your loyal subject by spreading the good news and building your kingdom on earth. Help me to listen to the promptings of your Holy Spirit, and give me the grace and courage to carry out your every command.

"Jesus, Son of God, instead of *frankincense*, I offer you my praise. Let it rise as incense to your throne (Psalm I4I:2). I praise you for coming to earth as a human being so that you could save me. I praise you for suffering and dying for me so that I could live with you forever. Give me the grace to praise you not just in good times but in my difficulties and challenges as well.

"Jesus, Lamb of God, in place of the *myrth* that anointed your body (John 19:39), I offer you myself, body and soul, along with all my joys and sorrows. I trust that as I surrender myself to you, you will carry me through every temptation and trial and one day bring me safely home to your eternal kingdom."

"Jesus, you are my King, Lord, and Savior: May these gifts honor and glorify you."

Mass Intentions

The Mass Intention Calendar is kept by the Parish Secretary and arrangements for a particular day can be made through her (274-8828 ext. 21, Tues., Wed., Thurs.). Usually, designated masses are assigned on a first come first serve basis. Special dates (the anniversary of death, parish remembrances, etc.) will always be given precedence over randomly assigned intentions. Masses are not assigned for major holidays (Easter/Christmas). The parish reserves the right to change a date if necessary, the person making the original request will be notified of the change. The Archdiocesan prescribed donation for a Mass Offering is \$7.00. The purpose of assigning a mass intention is to join the specific intention to the intentions of the whole worshiping community. It is not meant to imply that the Mass is offered for the intention of the priest and donor alone. The obligation that the priest undertakes by Canon Law is to celebrate the Mass with the donor's intention in mind.

As per Church Law, one of the Masses each weekend is designated as Pro populi (for the whole community) and therefore cannot be designated for a particular intention.
