

Weekly Meditation

He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit. (Luke 3:16)

Now that's a promise worth remembering: Jesus wants to baptize us with his own Holy Spirit! But what does this mean?

Let's look first at Jesus' experience of the Spirit. Luke tells us that Jesus' baptism, "the Holy Spirit descended upon" him (3:22). On that day, Jesus received the Spirit in a new way—a gift from God that would empower him and set him on the path of ministry, service, and ultimately death and resurrection. Though Jesus was already fully God, the Spirit of God still came upon him.

Luke includes a small but important detail in his account. As the Spirit descended on him, the Father called out, "*You* are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased" (Luke 3:22, emphasis added). He spoke directly to Jesus. He told him how delighted he was in his Son's obedience, humility, and trust in him. Baptized, or immersed, in water, Jesus was also immersed in the Holy Spirit that day.

When you were baptized, the Holy Spirit came upon you, and God claimed you his beloved child as well. He entered into a new, unbreakable relation with you, and you became a new creation in Christ *(see Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1279).*

But God doesn't want to fill you with his Spirit only at your baptism. He wants to baptize you—immerse you—in his Spirit again and again so that you can be filled with his love and equipped for the work God has for you. Again and again, he wants to tell you, "*You* are my beloved child. I love you. I am pleased to have you in my family."

Even if it has been decades since you were baptized, God still wants to fill you with his Spirit. So don't be afraid to ask for more: more of his love, and more of his power in your life.

"Jesus, fill me with your Spirit. Let me know your love in a new way today!"

Mass Intentions

The Mass Intention Calendar is kept by the Parish Secretary and arrangements for a particular day can be made through her (274-8828 ext. 21, Tues., Wed., Thurs.). Usually, designated masses are assigned on a first come first serve basis. Special dates (the anniversary of death, parish remembrances, etc.) will always be given precedence over randomly assigned intentions. Masses are not assigned for major holidays (Easter/Christmas). The parish reserves the right to change a date if necessary, the person making the original request will be notified of the change. The Archdiocesan prescribed donation for a Mass Offering is \$7.00. The purpose of assigning a mass intention is to join the specific intention to the intentions of the whole worshiping community. It is not meant to imply that the Mass is offered for the intention of the priest and donor alone. The obligation that the priest undertakes by Canon Law is to celebrate the Mass with the donor's intention in mind.

As per Church Law, one of the Masses each weekend is designated as Pro populi (for the whole community) and therefore cannot be designated for a particular intention.
