

Home Sweet Home

We often describe certain holidays as home-based or shul-based. Pesach, for example, is very much a home-based holiday. The elaborate rituals of the seder happen at home. By contrast, the High Holy Days are shul-based. Yes, we have meals at home with family and friends. But the High Holy Days center around the pageantry and poetry of synagogue rituals like blowing the shofar, bowing to the ground in the Aleinu Hagadol, and the stirring chanting of Kol Nidrei. Our machzor reinforces this vision. Among the hundreds of pages of synagogue prayers, a mere 10 pages are devoted to "Rosh Hashana at Home" and "Erev Yom Kippur at Home."

This year we are thinking differently about this simple division of home vs. shul. True, there are customs and traditions unique to each, but we want to suggest that in some ways our homes are our shuls, and our shuls are our homes.

That is the underlying message of a famous passage in the Talmud. We read in the Book of Psalms, "Adonai, You have been our refuge ("ma'on") in each generation" (90:1). The rabbis debate that word refuge. Rabbi Yitzchak says it refers to our synagogues whereas Rabbi Elazar says it refers to our houses (Megillah 29a).

Why did Rabbi Yitzchak find synagogues to be a refuge? Perhaps because there, he felt the comfort community, he was lifted by music, inspired by learning. And why did Rabbi Elazar suggest that our homes are our refuge? Perhaps because he felt most welcome, in control, at peace (shalom bayit).

In good Jewish fashion, we say to Rabbi Yitzchak and to Rabbi Elazar, "You're right and you're right." Not shuls or homes, but both shuls *and* homes serve as refuge. Because in addition to music and peace, we find in them places where God dwells.

In the ninetieth Psalm, Moses prays for God to be a refuge "b'dor vador—in each and every generation." In this generation, we have indeed needed such a refuge. At times this past year it felt as if life was spinning out of control. In a world beset by rapid changes and enormous challenges, we have needed our homes and our shuls more than ever. We have needed family and community, time to be alone as well as opportunities to gather, moments of quiet reflection and of joyous celebration. We have needed a refuge.

But don't misunderstand us. The Torah commands us to respond to the brokenness of the world—to repair it, not to hide from it. By inhabiting a refuge where we feel safe and whole, where we can be who we are, we experience renewal that energizes us and centers us. That is our hope these High Holy Days, in our houses and in our synagogues. In making time and creating space where God dwells, may we know sweetness of the places we call home.

Home Wasn't Built in a Day

וְגַשׁוּ לֻי מִקְדֻשׁ וְשָׁכַנְחָי בְּתוֹכֶם

v'asu li mikdash v'shakhanti b'tokham
They shall build for me a sanctuary, and I will dwell among them.

Exodus 25:8



Over the last few weeks, I have been busy working not only at Beth EI but working to set up my new home in St Louis Park. I have spent time and energy purchasing and building furniture, then arranging it and rearranging it...and rearranging it some more.

As I was moving the same bookshelf into its seventh potential location in the living room, one of my favorite verses from *Sefer Shemot* (the Book of Exodus) came to mind. In the verse above, God tells the People of Israel to build a holy physical space (the *Mishkan*), but at the same time promises to come down from the heavens and live among the people.

This verse is one of *those* moments. Grand, exciting; a real showstopper.

The chapter begins with God speaking to Moshe, saying "tell the Israelites to bring me gifts" with which they'll build the *Mishkan*. The list goes on and on, and includes everything from gold and silver, to ram skins and acacia wood.

God pauses in the middle of this seemingly never-ending list to say "they shall build for me a sanctuary, and I will dwell among them." And then immediately back to the seemingly never-ending list of tools and measurements for the *Mishkan*.

This chapter of the Torah is the quintessential definition of building a home.

The vast majority of the work that goes into building a home is not those big, earth-moving, revelatory moments; in fact, building a home is mostly mundane. It's cooking dinner, watching a movie together, and forgetting which light switches are for which lights. And as a result of the time we spend together and the effort we put into these everyday tasks, we may eventually merit to experience something amazing, and deeply moving.

I am thrilled to be part of the Beth EI team. I've felt very welcomed by everyone I've met and spoken with, and I am so impressed with what this community has built and what it has to offer.

Building this kind of spiritual home is mostly not big, earth-moving, revelatory moments. It's coming to minyan, setting up chairs for events, telling our friends about youth group programs. It's sending emails asking for RSVPs.

Without the mundane, there is no holy. We put in the time and effort every day so that eventually we will merit to experience something amazing together.

In her book The *Art of Gathering*, Priya Parker writes that sometimes we don't even know why we are getting together. She explains that we should keep asking ourselves why we gather, and if we keep drilling deeper and asking why, we will hit a shared core belief or value.

This is what "home" means to me.

Home means each of us putting in the time and effort every day – reading chapters and chapters of specific, repetitive instructions and measurements for the *Mishkan* – so that we can identify our shared values, and ultimately merit to feel God's presence dwelling among us.

I look forward to continuing to figure out which light switches turn on which lights, and schmoozing at kiddush, and setting up chairs: participating in the day-to-day of the synagogue.

At the same time, I also look forward to learning what makes this community tick. What are *those* moments that drive us, that get us to show up for each other? What are our spiritual goals, and how much can we accomplish together?

Home at Beth El might look different to each of us, but it's the culmination of all the individual thoughts, ideas, and programs that makes this house of worship a home.

I look forward to praying, eating, and learning, and to continuing to build this home together. Shanah Tovah.

Our physical "home" had changed, but the engagement and learning continued in our new educational "home".

Today, over two and a half years later, we reflect on where we were, where we went and where we are now. Aleph Preschool has thrived throughout the pandemic. Our doors have remained open since September of 2020, welcoming children into our beloved preschool, we all refer to as our "home away from home." Our dedicated teachers have opened up a world of wonder and learning for our students and created a warm, nurturing and engaging environment for our children.
