## Coincidences

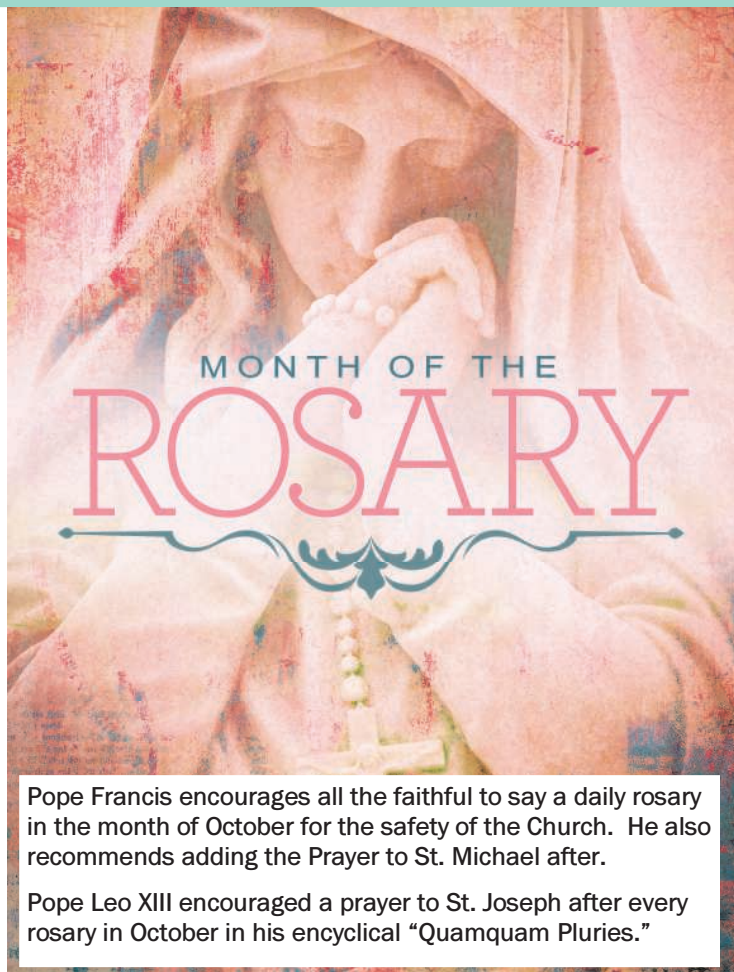
Whenever I turned on the radio last week, I played a little game, counting the seconds it took before hearing commentary on Brett Kavanaugh's nomination or accusations against him. It seemed little else was making news until a reprieve came on Monday with announcement of the reworking of the North America Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) into the United States Mexico Canada Agreement (USMCA).

In the midst of such news, it was refreshing to turn on "This American Life" on MPR Sunday evening and hear a rebroadcast entitled "No Coincidence, No Story!" Some of the coincidences they recounted were pretty amazing. In one, a fellow dating a woman named Esther received a dollar in change at a deli with her name written on it. He had it framed and gave it to her as a present. She was shocked, but it wasn't until after they were married that she told him why. Years before, as a teenager, she had been a cashier in a coffee shop and, not happy with the fellow she was dating, wrote her name on a few dollar bills thinking that some guy who gets one of them would be the fellow she married someday.

I got to thinking about coincidences I have experienced. During my years in Venezuela there was no home mail delivery. In Puerto Ordaz, a city of several hundred thousand residents, everyone picked up their mail at the post office. One day I received a letter from my mom with a note written on it: "Sorry I opened your mail by mistake, but my name is also Dennis Dempsey." Turned out that, of all the P.O. boxes in the city, his was right next to that of our archdiocesan mission. They had put my letter in his by mistake. We exchanged notes and eventually got together. In all my life, other than that instance, I have never met another person with the same name, and for it to happen in Venezuela where we were probably the only two Dempsey's, not only in that city but in the entire country, that was quite a coincidence!

During a visit to Maltrata some years ago, Jeff Pesta and I decided to visit Marco Flores, a fellow who had moved from Northfield back to Mexico several years previous to get married. I couldn't reach him by phone, but I had been at his home and met his family in Rio Blanco, one of several run-together cities along the 15-mile bus route between Maltrata and Orizaba, a few years back. I thought I might recognize the place again. It had a big window in front and was painted pink. How many places like that could there be? So, we boarded the bus, but when we got to the general vicinity, nothing looked right. Seeing a pink house up ahead, I motioned to Jeff and we got off, but as soon as we did I knew it wasn't the right place. Just that moment, someone shouted my name, "Padre Denny!" I turned around. There was Marco's mom whom I had met two years before. She had gone out for a walk and was about a mile from their house when she saw us get off the bus. What a nice coincidence!

I recalled one of my favorite expressions: "Coincidence is God's way of remaining anonymous". You know how tickled you feel when you have given someone a good surprise? I think God gets a real kick out of anonymously surprising us with coincidences. Looking up to heaven, I smiled and whispered, "Good one...thanks!" What coincidences have you experienced in your life? I hope they have all come as anonymous blessings from God for you. —Fr. Denny

### **St. Olaf Women's Household in Convent**

Our convent is back to nearly full capacity with seven young women, mostly from St. Olaf College, forming a Catholic women's household. With the approval of the Parish Pastoral Council I presented the idea to St. Olaf toward the end of the last school year as a benefit both to the students and the parish. The seven women live as a community sharing meals and prayer. In return for housing, they together cover all the utility expenses for the entire building (their residence and the parish offices) and commit themselves to some regular program of service to the parish (school, faith formation, music, etc.).

As most of you know, the convent had only one resident, Sr. Bernelle Taube, for many years. Going from one to seven, the women could use a few items to help make the space a bit more livable and comfortable. If you have any of the following items with which you would be willing to part, please contact the parish office at 507-645-8816. Thanks.

1. Dehumidifier(s) (1 or 2 total)
2. Dry foods storage containers (large glass jars, bins)
3. 1 long boot holder/mat (for wet winter boots/wellies)
4. 10-20 hangers for winter coats
5. Old t-shirts to be used as cleaning rags
6. twin size mattress and box spring

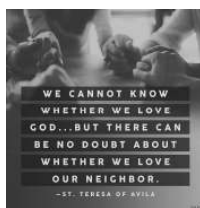
