

### The Epiphany of the Lord

### IRA Charitable Distribution

There is a special tax benefit available to owners of a Traditional IRA who are 70 ½ or older. You may instruct your IRA Plan Administrator to distribute directly to a public charity, such as St. Katharine Drexel, up to and including \$100,000 without the distribution being included in taxable income. The distribution does count toward the IRA owner’s Required Minimum Distribution. The donor does not receive a charitable deduction, but the transfer is not treated as an income distribution to the donor. The donor enjoys the equivalent of a charitable deduction by avoiding the tax that ordinarily would have been due on an IRA income distribution. This is a benefit if you itemize or not. If you have any questions on this, talk to your accountant or tax advisor

**Stock Donations** If you are making a stock donation, the date of the donation is the date you turn the stock over to our broker regardless of when we receive the check for it. With the recent surge in the Stock Market, you can avoid a large tax hit by donating your stock shares to SKD. Talk to your tax advisor or broker to discuss the advantages to donating stock. Contact Deacon Randy to get the information on our broker for making a stock donation.

### EVENTS AND MINISTRY UPDATES

Given the latest message from Governor Walz on Wednesday, November 18th there could be some confusion or mixed messaging that just needs a little clarification. While he is asking that everyone execute a four- week pause on “social gatherings” he did also say that Church services could continue as they have been. Meaning at 50% of the capacity of the worship space and with all the other COVID-19 pandemic protocols in place. This means that we will be able to continue our Mass schedule as usual – we would kindly ask, however, that if you wish to attend any scheduled Mass that you:

- Sign-up on the web page,
- be sure to wear your mask,
- follow the seating instructions as they are given so the social distancing requirements can be fulfilled.

**For Religious Formation**—We will continue with in-person classes.

**First Reconciliation/First Communion**—With the mask and social distancing requirements.

**Confirmation**—will remain as is, the option for in-person (masks and social distancing as instructed by the catechists) or remote by way of ZOOM.

All other parish meetings will remain as is – meaning the option of either in-person or Zoom

### RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

Wise Men See God in the Simple Things

If you're on social media, you have probably seen a meme going around that features this quote: "God has a plan for your life. The enemy has a plan for your life. Be ready for both. Just be wise enough to know which one to battle and which one to embrace."

There were certainly two competing plans for the Magi: God's and Herod's. And, wise as they supposedly were, it wasn't entirely easy for the Magi to discern which was which.

After all, Herod posed as a friend. He offered the Magi hospitality and kindness. Though the Gospel doesn't say so, he probably flattered them and appealed to every moral weakness he could observe in them. In his palace, they must have felt great physical comfort — rest and tables of plenty on what was an otherwise long and treacherous journey.

But if the Magi were honest with themselves, I'll bet they would have admitted that, regardless of Herod's charm, they felt a gnawing sense of doubt while in his presence. When they looked upon the Christ Child, born in a stable without any of the comforts of the world or protections of wealth, they probably felt the opposite. They probably felt safe.

The Magi were lucky enough to have the right plan spelled out for them in a dream, but for the rest of us, it's enough to remember this: God's plan is often the one that leads us to places of great simplicity, great humility and great love. Let's have the wisdom to view power with suspicion, and innocence with admiration.

In an effort to provide greater visibility into the state of our Community's Finances, the SKD Finance Council would like to share with you some interesting facts.

**Through our first 5 months (Nov. 30, 2020) SKD's Envelope Revenue is now \$16,538.51 below our Budget and \$7,559.29 below last year through November 2019.**

**Excerpt from Full of Fair Hope. A History of St. Mary's Mission Red Lake by Owen Lindblad, OSB**

Brother Doug addressed the question in a paper destined for consideration by both Benedictine communities, St. John's and St. Benedict's.
