

FROM THE DESK OF DEACON RANDY



Spring

This weekend we officially begin the season of spring. We look back at the winter that is coming to an end. We remember the snowstorms, the extreme cold, the cloudy days, the icy roads and all those other things that are part of winter. But we also had sunny days, warm days and other things that help make winter more bearable.

Now we look ahead to spring. There might still be a snowstorm, but we know it will soon melt. There might be a few cold days, but a warm day will soon follow. We begin to plan our gardening, our flower planting, our spring cleaning and getting out to enjoy the beauty of nature coming alive again.

It is very similar to what we are experiencing in the Church. We are coming to an end of our Lenten Season. Those days when we are called on to reflect on our life and how we have sometimes failed to follow what Christ calls us to. We made promises to enter into the spirit of Lent by participating in the call to prayer, fasting and almsgiving. But in a week, we begin Holy Week – the high point of the Church Year. Next Sunday we celebrate Palm Sunday/Passion Sunday. The two names for that day recall the triumphant entry of Jesus into Jerusalem as he is hailed by the crowds, but also focuses on the Passion and Death of Jesus as the crowds call for his crucifixion.

We then move into the Sacred Triduum, the days of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday and Easter. The days that remind us of the gifts Jesus gave us. The gift of the Eucharist, the gift of his dying for our sins and the gift of his Resurrection and the promise to us of eternal life.

Just as we see in our movement from winter to spring, we see our movement from Lent to Easter, the movement from passion and death to resurrection and eternal glory. Make the most of these last few days of Lent and truly prepare yourself for a joyous celebration of Easter and the glory that lies ahead.

Rice Bowls

Our Holy Thursday collection is when we ask people to return their Rice Bowls. Our special Lenten offerings will go to Catholic Relief Services for their work across the world as well as here in our Archdiocese. A special collection container will be near our other collection baskets on Holy Thursday and remain there until a week after Easter. If you will not be attending Holy Thursday, you can return your Rice Bowls at any of our liturgies through the Second Sunday of Easter. You can also drop them off during regular parish office hours.

Join us for Stations of the Cross

We will be praying the Stations of the Cross every Friday night during Lent. Stations are at 7:00 pm. We will be using a different mediation on the Stations each week. Our usual COVID safety precautions will be followed, masks will be required. Participants can remain in their chairs or walk the Stations with social distancing between each household.

Heavenly Father, Who gave St. Joseph to Jesus and Mary As protector and guide, Grant that our Archdiocesan Synod, Under his protection and guidance, May help us discern your direction for our Church.

May we listen as he listened, Trust as he trusted, Obey as he obeyed, Receive as he received, Love as he loved, And share in his life of devotion to Jesus and Mary.
Amen.

Other changes and transitions occurred on the reservation. On May 1, 1989, following a community

leaders' forum retreat for Tribal Council representatives, members shared their dreams for the future of their community. These included, through a grant request, a bank, more small businesses, expanded gambling operations on ceded lands (a reality in 1991 with the Lake of the Woods" Casino at Warroad and "River Road" at Thief River Falls), a shopping mall, farming to raise trout and other fish, a tribal economic development corporation (a reality in 1991), and even a tribal college.



What is Scrip?

You hear an announcement most Sundays that Scrip is available for purchase at the front desk. Unfortunately, most people are not taking advantage of that simple fund-raising opportunity for our parish. Using scrip gift cards is an easy way of doing much of your shopping. The scrip cards are like any gift cards you might purchase at various retailers. When you purchase a scrip card from SKD, you simply pay the face value of the card and use it to pay for your purchases. The advantage to our parish is that we purchase the cards at a discounted rate, from 1.5% to 20%. So we make a little on each card sold. There are hundreds of merchants on the scrip program. We stock cards from several of those merchants.

We can order cards if we do not have the cards you need in inventory. A list of the cards we stock is on the parish website on the "Scrip" page found on the "About" tab. You can also sign up for our eCard program. It is an app you can put on your phone to download eCards while you are shopping. You can open the app, pick the merchant you are shopping at and purchase an instant eCard in the amount you need to pay for your purchases. The app also includes the option to reload a plastic card you purchased earlier. Our Scrip provider now also offers the option to purchase plastic cards and have them shipped directly to you or as gifts to be shipped to someone else. Stop by the front desk and learn more about our scrip program and how you can benefit the parish by utilizing scrip to do your shopping.



Do You Shop Amazon?

Online shopping has grown tremendously during this Pandemic. Amazon is one of the online sources many people have been utilizing.
