

FROM THE DESK OF TODD FLOWERDAY



A friend on social media alerted me to a short video with the caption, “When Jesus left the 99 to find the one. And the one was me.” The scene: a roadside ditch with pipeline at the side ready for placement and burial. A man is pulling on the leg of an animal jammed into that narrow trench. When I showed it to my wife, she winced—the animal must be in pain getting dragged out by its leg. Upon release the wooly sheep shakes off some of the dirt, bounds away and leaps, seemingly in freedom. Only to dive feet first into the ditch. Stuck again!

I don’t know about you, but I don’t particularly like being classified as a sheep, even as a spiritual image. I’ve seen the pejorative “sheeple” used in church circles. And I don’t like that either. However, isn’t there something inevitable about the trials of our lives so much like that sheep.

When I shared that video on facebook, many people laughed (or used the laugh emoji). Upon reflection, it seemed to me I was smirking at myself when that poor animal bounded right back into trouble mere seconds after release. Haven’t I been there before?

So, this weekend is Good Shepherd Sunday. Likely as not, Jesus pulls us out of our ditches. Again and again. Sometimes we struggle. And he must strain, grasping for a hand or leg or tattered soul, anything we can offer in our plea for help. And afterward, there we go again: bounding right back into the mud. How do we break that cycle? Can we ever hope to be permanently rescued in this life? In eternal glory, will all the ditches be filled in, all the thorny places pruned back, all the rough places made smooth?

As I write this, it feels like the whole world is waiting on the Chauvin verdict. It feels like we are caught in a ditch—no, a complex landscape of craters and crevasses and choking thorns. People of color are afraid and angry. Officers of peace are armed to the teeth and defensive. Another citizen is killed in what should be a routine procedure. Or a handful of innocents are victims of one armed and troubled man. I imagine the Earth as a wide blue ball, precious and valued. And it too bounces into that deep and muddy ditch. Again. Will God’s mercy pull us out? How much can we contribute to breaking that cycle and cooperate with Jesus, the Good shepherd? I have no solid answers for that last question. But if I truly resist being labelled as a sheep, maybe I’d do well to cultivate eyes of faith in my surroundings and take better stock of my life. I might tumble into that trench again, but maybe I can accept help in time of need. Or dissuade others from following me. And break some small cycle of trouble.

Jesus, Good Shepherd, rescue us, guide us, and have mercy on us.

Benedictine personnel and the people of ST. Mary's felt "committed" to a certain faithfulness after ninety-seven years of working and praying together. But given the condition of unemployment and other difficulties that existed on the reservation, along with a growing demand for human and financial resources in the ministry, staff and administration faced a constant reality check: "Can we provide the resources necessary? Should the school be closed?"

Vacation Bible School will take place the week of July 12th-16th 9:30am-Noon. The cost is only \$25 per child, with a maximum total of \$100 per family or household. This year's theme will be Rocky Railway! Plenty of fun train and railway themed decorations, experiences, and activities to come!

As families are comfortable, I would encourage you to register your kids for VBS. We will take any and all safety precautions to follow any Covid-19 protocols and orders set forth by the State, CDC, MDH, Governor Walz, and the Archdiocese. If you have medical concerns, there will also be an At-Home version available where parents can receive a pack with instructions and all of the crafts and activities laid out for them.

Registration for VBS is now open! You can register online via the parish website by clicking on the scrolling image on the front page of the website, or by visiting the Vacation Bible School Page found under Formation or Youth Ministry. You can either pay online following the instructions on the registration page, or you can pay with cash or check at the parish office or send them in the mail. VBS at St. Katharine Drexel is open to ALL! Any family, friends, and denominations are invited to participate.

This year we will kick off the Ignite Experience for grades 6-12. There will be a retreat experience for them July 9th-11th at St. John's University. Lodging, activities, meals (vegetarian, gluten-free, and other dietary restrictions accommodated) beach access, etc. will all be provided. The main purpose of the retreat will be to gain leadership skills and preparedness for how Vacation Bible School will work, as well as developing friendships and fostering community with one another.
