



From the Desk of Deacon Randy



What Ever Happened to “Extreme Unction”?

Catholics have seven Sacraments. The Sacraments of Initiation – Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. The Sacraments of Healing- Anointing of the Sick and Reconciliation. Sacraments of Vocation- Marriage and Holy Orders. The Church has rituals for the celebration of each of those Sacraments. The rituals or rites consist of actions and words that are rich in symbolism of what each Sacrament means. Those rites or rituals have been changed numerous times. We recently saw a change in the Rite of Baptism and a few years ago the Rite of Marriage was updated.

The original order for the Sacraments of Initiation was Baptism, followed by Confirmation with initiation completed with the reception of First Eucharist. In the early days of the Church, those Sacraments were all celebrated in one service, even for infants. Most of the Eastern Rites of the Church still celebrate them together. As those Sacraments were separated, Eucharist was reserved for adults. Later teenagers were allowed to receive Eucharist. In 1910, Pope Pius X moved the age for Eucharist to the “age of reason.” He did not specify what that age was, but it has commonly been set at around the age of seven. This moved Eucharist before Confirmation. One of the changes we are seeing in some dioceses is the order of the Sacraments of Initiation. Children are now confirmed first and then complete their initiation into the Church with First Eucharist – the original order of those Sacraments.

The Sacrament of Holy Orders was changed after the Second Vatican Council with the restoration of the Permanent Diaconate. The Diaconate was part of ordained ministry for several centuries in the early years of the Church. In fact, in the early Middle Ages (432-684), only three of the 37 men elected Pope had been ordained as priests prior to their election as Pope. Most of the other 29 had been ordained as Deacons, with most having served as the Pope’s “Archdeacon” (principal assistant). Gradually the Order of Deacons moved from the Permanent Diaconate to Transitional Deacons, a step in Ordination prior to being ordained a Priest.

The most dramatic changes in the Sacraments has been in the Sacraments of Healing. Many remember the Sacrament of Reconciliation being celebrated as you went in to what seemed like a small dark closet. You would kneel and wait for the priest to slide open a small window with a dark screen so you could not see each other. You listed your sins, made an Act of Contrition and received your penance which usually consisted of a certain number of Our Fathers, Hail Mary’s and Glory Be’s. Penance is now celebrated as one of a conversation. We are encouraged to sit and face the priest as we talk about our sinfulness. The priest may read some scripture passage(s) that helps us see how our sins are hurtful to God, others and ourselves, but also include passages that help us overcome the temptations that lead us into those sins. He may also join us in a conversation to talk about what we can do to avoid repeating those same sins. Our penance is frequently taking some action that is related to making amends for our sins.

The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick has undergone a dramatic change in how it is celebrated. It had been called “Last Rites”, “Extreme Unction” or other names. It was celebrated as someone was very near death. It frequently was said that as you saw the priest come through the door to celebrate that Sacrament with someone, the Angel of Death was coming through the door right behind him. It is now celebrated as a true Sacrament of Healing. It is not a miracle Sacrament. It does not mean you will be cured of whatever illness you are experiencing. It is celebrated to help you endure your suffering, your pain or whatever you might be experiencing. It is recommended to be celebrated whenever someone experiences a new illness, faces surgery, feels mental or emotional anxiety or any other reason a person feels they could benefit from that Sacrament. We sometimes even offer communal Anointing when anyone desiring the reception of the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is invited forward for the laying on of hands and the anointing with the Oil of the Sick.

The Sacrament of the dying is not the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, the Sacrament of the dying is Eucharist, “*Viaticum*”, which means “food for the journey.” We are strengthened by the reception of the Body and Blood of Christ as we prepare to meet Christ face to face as we leave our earthly life and enter our eternal life.

As a young and wealthy woman, Drexel made her social debut in 1878. However, watching her stepmother's three-year struggle with terminal cancer taught her the Drexel money could not buy safety from pain or death. Her life took a profound turn. She had

always been interested in the plight of Native Americans, having been appalled by what she read in Helen Hunt Jackson's *A Century of Dishonor*. When her family traveled to the Western states in 1884, Katharine Drexel saw the plight and poverty of the Native Americans. She wanted to do something specific to help. Thus began her lifelong personal and financial support of numerous missions and missionaries in the United States. After her father died in February 1885, Katharine and her sisters contributed money to help the St. Francis Mission on South Dakota's Rosebud Reservation.
