

From the Desk of Father Paul



Greetings everyone! Now that we have all the Christmas decorations down and put away, and school and normal life (well as normal as we can expect in the midst of COVID) has resumed, the worship life of the Church has returned to "normal" as well. We once again, until Lent, return to ORDINARY TIME. That is a funny name for this time because it is really anything but ordinary, given what the scriptures for the Liturgy of the Word invite us to during these weeks, and what the Eucharistic celebration calls forth from us as well. For us here at St. Katharine Drexel it is in Ordinary time that we always celebrate our anniversary as a faith community. The Fourth Sunday of Ordinary Time each year recalls the very first Mass we celebrated together at the PACT Charter School back in January of 2005. This year it is

the weekend of January 29-30 that we will celebrate this milestone as a parish. An anniversary is the time to look back and give thanks for what has been, and to look forward with a resounding YES to what is yet to be. We have been through a lot as a community of faith, and we have much for which to be grateful. The anniversary weekend will afford us the opportunity to thank God for all of the ways He has blest us and an opportunity to petition God for blessings going forward. I hope you will join in the celebration (limited as it will be because of COVID), by coming to help with our parish wide packing of food at Feed My Starving Children in Coon Rapids, 9 am to 11 am, January 29 (you must register in advance); and also, most importantly, joining together for Mass either Saturday evening or Sunday morning. Come one, Come All, Let's Rejoice! I also offer for your reflection the article below about Ordinary Time. ~ Blessings! **Father Paul**

Ordinary Time ~ *Paul Turner*

Ordinary Time, the longest season of the church year, fills the weeks "which do not celebrate a specific aspect of the mystery of Christ." It's the no-particular-reason season. Christmas Time honors the birth of Christ. Easter Time rejoices in the resurrection. Ordinary Time is devoted to the mystery of Christ in all its aspects.

The number of the weeks of Ordinary Time replaces the old counting of weeks "after Epiphany" and "after Pentecost." The old calendar suggested that Pentecost ran for six months. The new calendar gives Pentecost a day. Then we return to Ordinary Time.

At first glance the principles of Ordinary Time seem basic enough. Start counting the weeks after Christmas Time. Break for Lent and Easter. Resume after Pentecost and keep counting till Advent. Basically, that's how it works. But we have a few quirks.

For example, there is no "First Sunday in Ordinary Time"; however, there is a first week. Usually Christmas Time ends on a Sunday with the Baptism of the Lord. The lectionary also calls it the First Sunday in Ordinary Time, but it is part of Christmas Time. (Some years the Baptism of the Lord falls on a Monday, but that's another story.) Ordinary Time gets underway on a weekday. When the next Sunday rolls around we start week two.

On the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday, we see the last of Ordinary Time until after Pentecost. Even then, it emerges only on weekdays. Trinity Sunday always follows Pentecost Sunday, and the solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of the Lord comes the next Sunday in the United States. (In countries where this solemnity is a holy day, it falls on a Thursday.) So when the numbered Sundays in Ordinary Time return in summer, we start out a little higher than where we left off.

Sometimes we skip one or two entire weeks of Ordinary Time during the Easter break. We want to close the Sundays of the year with Christ the King, one week before Advent. Christ the King always falls on the 34th Sunday in Ordinary Time. So, we determine the week number after Pentecost not based on where we left off before Lent but counting backwards from Christ the King. One or two weeks may disappear, but Ordinary Time still serves the complete mystery of Christ. Copyright © 2012 Resource Publications, Inc., 160 E. A Time of Giving

We often look at Christmas as a time of giving. That certainly was the case for all of Advent and December thanks to the generosity of the people of St Katharine Drexel. You responded to the tags on our Advent Giving Tree and provided dozens of cookies and other items needed by Anoka County Family Promise for homeless families. You provided needed clothing for the elderly on our appeal for Granny's Closet.

\$3,500 in Scrip Gift Cards were donated to assist 12 local families make Christmas a brighter time for them. You provided \$2,400 in Wal-Mart Scrip cards for our sister parish, St. Mary's Mission in Red Lake. The KC's donated two cases of winter jackets to the children of Red Lake that were delivered by John and Linda Smetana. Our monthly tithe of 2% of our Sunday offering also went to St Mary's Mission in December. That amounted to \$1,124.89. Our monthly food drive for the Franciscan Brothers of Peace generated \$1,080 in monetary donations. There was also 6 turkeys and 15 bags of groceries donated for their food shelf.

You were also very generous in your December donations to the parish. Contributions and memorials for December were \$58,979.52. There was \$1,015 donated for Christmas flowers. Your total donations in December for our Building for Eternity-NOW capital campaign were \$184,566.03.

December truly was a time of giving for the wonderful people of St Katharine Drexel. Thank you for your generosity and continued support.
