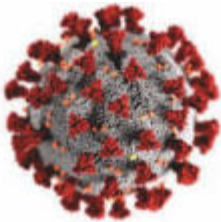

IMPORTANT UPDATE

Coronavirus update—October 18, 2020

Since May, we have taken great precautions to limit the spread of COVID-19, while allowing us to celebrate Mass publicly again. I hope these keep all of us safe and make each of you comfortable coming to the church to pray, especially for Sunday Mass. Below are some of the measures we are taking here at OLG:

- Each person should wear a mask as they enter the church and any time that we cannot maintain 6 feet of distance between other families. There are disposable masks at the main entrance, if needed.
- As long as we maintain proper distance, by not using the center kneeler of the pews, you are able to remove your mask in your seats.
- Some optional actions within the Mass are not used (i.e. holy water fonts in the entrances, Sign of Peace, distribution of the Precious Blood to the congregation).
- Only 150 people are allowed in the building for any particular Mass. Some of those might have to be seated in the Parish Hall, viewing a videostream of the Mass, if the church and foyer are at capacity.
- As long as Sunday Mass is not required (we are dispensed from the Sunday obligation), 9:00am Mass on Sundays will be livestreamed on Facebook and YouTube for those at home.
- Eucharistic Adoration is still available from 9:00pm on Sundays through 12:00pm on Thursdays. Or you can come to pray in the church from 8:00am – 8:00pm each day. You are still dispensed from the Sunday obligation, so there is no requirement to attend Sunday Mass. Bishop Kemme has encouraged all to remove any obstacle to attending Mass, especially if you are comfortable and able to leave home for other activities. If you are still not able to attend Mass and would like to receive the Eucharist, please call Fr. Jorge at 316-283-3499 to review some options.

Letter From Fr. Jorge

Dear Parish Family of Our Lady of Guadalupe,
I am Fr. Jorge Lopez; I was born in a small town in Jalisco, Mexico. I grew up in the countryside in a small town called Villa de Ornelas together with my parents and six other siblings. When I first came to this country, I came here to work with family and pursue the "American Dream." Soon after I arrived in Wichita, I heard God's call in my life to the priesthood.



I was ordained a priest for the Diocese of Wichita on May 27, 2017. I served first as a parochial vicar at Our Lady of Perpetual Help parish in Wichita. Then, for the last two and a half years I served as a parochial vicar at our Lady of Lourdes parish in Pittsburg. As you can see, my priesthood has been very protected by our Blessed Mother and so it will continue to be, here at Our Lady of Guadalupe.

Throughout my life God has been gifting me with many graces. My vocation is one of the greatest gifts I have received. I now understand that as a priest what matters are not my gifts and abilities, but rather my willingness to allow God to work in and through me and my gifts. This is what the priesthood is about. Without God's grace I cannot do anything.

The day of my Priesthood Ordination during the laying on of hands by our bishop, God bestowed upon me the graces I need to act in the Person of Christ. It is through the graces received during my ordination that I will be able to minister to each and every one of you here at Our Lady of Guadalupe. Be patient with me as I learn how to be your Pastor.

Gospel Meditation: 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

God gives us the gift of His very self and asks us to invest it. Investing God's greatest gift of Himself wisely, allows God's kingdom to grow and flourish. God trusts us with this pearl of great price in hopes that it will produce abundant fruit. While God's gift of self is realized in the gifts of faith, hope, and love, they are not meant to be solely for personal benefit. They are intended to be shared and are at the heart of Jesus' blueprint for happiness, the Beatitudes.

When we properly invest God's greatest gift, His most treasured possession, we invest in the wellbeing of all of our brothers and sisters and the world in which we live. We take up most seriously our call to be stewards and properly manage, not only our own affairs, but the affairs of those around and before us. God has put tremendous confidence in us. Do we have that same confidence in God?

We often go the extra mile and put in the additional effort when it comes to those concerns closest to us: our families, friends, careers, home and securities. But when it comes to things that are not as close to us, we can become lax and less conscientious. Tending to God's treasure requires a great deal of focus and persistent hard work. It demands that I see the bigger picture, God's picture, in which self-sacrifice is a given as we labor for the establishment of God's kingdom, God's vision. Fear and a lack of trust can loom large, however. We are afraid of letting go of what is "mine" and apprehensive of jeopardizing what we have in order to venture into something bigger and more promising.
