

January 30, 2022 Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Synod on Synodality taking place across the globe from 2021 to 2023.

Pope Francis has called for a Synod of the world's bishops to discuss the idea of synodality. This synod is to take place in 2023. Prior to that gathering, Pope Francis has asked that diocesan churches (2021-2022) and national bishops conferences (2022-2023) gather to discuss synodality and ways of more deeply embracing the Church's mission of evangelization.

What is synodality?

The idea of synodality is an ancient one, dating back to the early Church. According to the International Theological Commission synodality is:

"the specific modus vivendi et operandi [way of living and operating] of the Church, the People of God, which reveals and gives substance to her being as communion when all her members journey together, gather in assembly and take an active part in her evangelizing mission."

Simply, this means that all the baptized comprise the Church and are responsible for her mission. This synod is being called to look into how this is being lived out fruitfully and how the Holy Spirit might be calling us to be even more fruitful.

What are we doing to participate as a diocese?

We will be responding to the Pope's call by gathering information at our parish clusters in January and February of 2022 and opening up a portal for direct participation on our website.

In March, representatives from all the clusters will meet with Bishop Powers and other diocesan leaders to collect feedback from the parishes and prepare our diocesan report which will be submitted to the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops.

What are we doing to participate as a cluster?

In the near future I will explain how our cluster will gather this information. In the meantime please go the Diocese of Superior Synod website (<u>https://www.catholicdos.org/synod</u>) and watch Bishop Powers' video as well as the Scripture Reflection video with Chris Hurtubise. After watching the videos, here are the guestions we are asked to respond to:

- 1. How would you describe Jesus' presence in your life?
- 2. Where do you see Jesus at work in your local community?
- 3. Where do you see a need for the healing power of Jesus in your life or in your community?
- 4. What or who helps you to know God more fully?
- 5. What steps do you hear the Holy Spirit asking us to take to deepen our commitment to the Church's mission of spreading the Gospel and making disciples?
- 6. What could the Church do (if anything) to help you, and to be a more meaningful part of your life?

You may respond on-line, but please write down your answers and save them. I am working on the best way to gather the responses for the diocesan gathering in March.

The Brick Ministries

When area residents call one of our cluster parishes for assistance, we often refer them to The Brick. The BRICK's mission is to help people in need, providing compassionate, respectful help to families and individuals facing emergencies and crisis. We provide an assortment of food items, both non-perishable and fresh, to families in need. They may visit The BRICK's Food Shelf once each month, receiving three to five days' worth of groceries. This is emergency, supplemental food, which The BRICK obtains from the Federal Emergency Food Assistance Program, Second Harvest Food Bank, Wal-Mart's Feed America Program, and donations from area churches, community organizations, and individuals. The BRICK has four Food Shelf locations: Ashland, Cable, Cornucopia, and Mellen.

The Brick's Benevolence Manager works one on one with area residents who need short term aid. Together, they determine a plan, establish a workable budget, and set goals that will assist the family to move forward and avoid financial shortfalls in the future. When needed, the Benevolence office provides services that are not available elsewhere. With donations and matching funds from Northern State Bank's Make a Difference Foundation, the Salvation Army, area churches, and private individuals, The BRICK provides emergency shelter, fuel and utility assistance, rental assistance, and other emergency aid. The Benevolence office is located at The BRICK's Ashland location at 420 Ellis Avenue. Due to high demand, we recommend making an appointment.
