This surely is the true life, brothers and sisters, a life in which Paul feels no shame because of Stephen's death, and Stephen delights in Paul's companionship, for love fills them both with joy. It was Stephen's love that prevailed over the cruelty of the mob. and it was Paul's love that covered the multitude of his sins: it was love that won for both of them the kingdom of heaven."


