**FIRST RECONCILIATION, FIRST COMMUNION & CONFIRMATION**  
The Religious Education program prepares learners for First Reconciliation, First Communion, and Confirmation with cooperation from parents and catechists. To participate, please register with the Religious Education office by mid-August. Preparation and celebration of First Reconciliation and First Communion ordinarily takes place in second grade. At St. Mary's, Confirmation is a two-year process involving students in grades 7 and 8. The Religious Education program and Parish School celebrate reception of each of these sacraments jointly. Because sacraments are celebrated as a parish, all participants in Sacramental Preparation must be registered members of the parish.

## MARRIAGE

According to Archdiocese regulations, a date for a wedding must be arranged **at least** six months prior to the wedding. Call the church **FIRST**, before you schedule a reception venue! Contact the rectory with any questions.

## CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD

### LIFTING THE DISPENSATION FROM SUNDAY MASS OBLIGATION ARCHDIOCESE OF OMAHA - APRIL 2021

Dear Friends in Christ,

After consulting the Archdiocesan Priests Council, and after conferring with Bishops Conley and Hanefeldt, I am ending the general dispensation from the obligation to participate in Sunday Mass, **effective the weekend of Pentecost, May 22-23, 2021**, in the Archdiocese of Omaha.

Happily, many parishes have been experiencing an increase in weekend Mass attendance recently. I think we can anticipate this trend to continue in the coming weeks, as vaccines are more widely available, and as other activities in the community resume.

Each pastor, in consultation with parish leaders, will continue to determine how to implement the guidance from the DHHS and local health departments. It will be important for pastors and parish staffs to communicate any local precautions or occupancy restrictions to their parishioners. Decisions about livestreaming of the liturgy will be made locally.

While the responsibility to participate in Sunday Mass rests with each of us, there are persons who may consider themselves excused under certain circumstances. Those who are prevented from attending due to advanced age, sickness, disability or some other serious reason are excused. **For the foreseeable future, those who feel they are at heightened risk of contracting or communicating COVID-19 are excused.**

The coming weeks provide an opportunity for us to respond again to the invitation of Jesus to come to Him. This is also an opportunity for each of us to share the invitation of Jesus with family members and neighbors. Look for more communication from your parish and from the Archdiocese as we move to the feast of Pentecost with hope.

You are in my prayers for joy and peace in the risen Lord.

### SACRAMENTS AND DATES

#### **First Reconciliation for RE**

The First Reconciliation Communal Rite was held **April 17<sup>th</sup> at 10:30 a.m.** in the Church. If your child missed the First Reconciliation, please contact the RE office.

#### **First Communion**

First Communion are scheduled any Sunday during the month of May or June 6<sup>th</sup> at the 10:00 a.m. Mass. Due to limited space, there will be a limit of 6 First Communion families per Mass and families may only invite up to 6 guests. You must RSVP to: [eto-maso@stmarysbellevue.com](mailto:eto-maso@stmarysbellevue.com) for your Mass selection. Closed Sundays for First Communion Masses are: May 2, 9 and 16.

Open Masses for scheduling your child’s First Communion are: May 23 & 30 and June 6.

First Communion practice will be held at 9:15 a.m. in the church the Saturday before your child’s scheduled First Communion. This practice is required for those who will receive Communion for the first time.

#### **Confirmation**

The 7<sup>th</sup> grade retreat will be postponed until the Fall of 2021. The date will be announced.

**8<sup>th</sup> grade** – The Rite of Enrollment is for all 8<sup>th</sup> grade students preparing for Confirmation in 2021. This will be held on April 17<sup>th</sup> at the 5:00 p.m. Mass or April 18<sup>th</sup> at the 10:00 a.m. Mass. Students and their parents or sponsor must check in at the south entrance of the church.

Confirmation Reflection and Rehearsal will be on April 30<sup>th</sup>. The Reflection will start at 5:30 p.m. in the parish center. This is required for all who will be Confirmed in 2021. It is required that the parent or sponsor attend the Rehearsal at 7:00 p.m. the same night in the parish center. This will also cover the 8<sup>th</sup> grade retreat.

Confirmation will be on May 1<sup>st</sup> at 7:00 p.m. Archbishop Lucas will be the presider. **All Confirmation paperwork for 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grades was due on April 15<sup>th</sup>. Turn it in now if you have not done so already.**
