FIRST RECONCILIATION, FIRST COMMUNION & CONFIRMATION
The Religious Education program prepares learners for First Reconciliation, First Communion, and Confirmation with cooperation from parents and catechists. To participate, please register with the Religious Education office by mid-August. Preparation and celebration of First Reconciliation and First Communion ordinarily takes place in second grade. At St. Mary's, Confirmation is a two-year process involving students in grades 7 and 8. The Religious Education program and Parish School celebrate reception of each of these sacraments jointly. Because sacraments are celebrated as a parish, all participants in Sacramental Preparation must be registered members of the parish.

MARRIAGE

According to Archdiocese regulations, a date for a wedding must be arranged **at least** six months prior to the wedding. Call the church **FIRST**, before you schedule a reception venue! Contact the rectory with any questions.

CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD

Available at the Sunday 10:00 a.m. Mass for all children 4 years old through 4th grade. After the Opening Prayers, a Catechist leads the children down to our parish center where a special homily centered around the Gospel reading is presented. Joe McQuade, son of Ed & Margaret McQuade, while visiting his parents recently responded to my bulletin quest for info on the Sisters' dogs. Being a student in the early 70's he remembered Sr. Claire Marie and Sr. Regina Marie's dog, Boo. "Sometimes, when we finished lunch early, they would let a couple of students go to the convent and exercise the dog. A tennis ball thrown up and down the hallway by the sleeping quarters made a good exercise path. The dog would occasionally visit the classroom which all of us enjoyed." Thanks for the memories, Joe!

Tidbits of history:

- A June 6, 1961 newspaper article mentioned how the Columban Fathers were building a new chapel which would hold 100 people as well as an expansion to its facilities that would accommodate 50 for their weekend lay retreats as well as additional office space.
- In a June 8, 1961 paper it reported: the Guild would be conducting its annual membership drive during June. "The Guild, the heart of the various Church organizations, is kept busy with many activities throughout the year. The ladies prepare the festival dinner, sponsor the mother-daughter breakfast, handle wedding receptions, and conduct bake sales. The Guild is responsible for purchasing kitchen supplies and for seeing that our altar flowers are provided as well as bringing in food or preparing meals for the needy."
- A June 8, 1967 article said: "Bus service for Bellevue, Offutt, Wherry and Capehart will commence June 12th. The area has been without service since the Gray Line Bus Company ceased service several months ago."
- June 9, 1961 newspaper reported that for the first time the Columban Festival would be a two-day affair [Sat. July 29 & Sun. July 30] in order to handle the increasing attendance. "The men of St. Mary's Parish, Bellevue, will line up the amusements and the food arrangements will be the job of Frank Kava and Ed Shonquist."
