FIRST RECONCILIATION, FIRST COMMUNION & CONFIRMATION

The Religious Education program prepares learners for First Reconciliation, First Communion, and Confirmation with cooperation from parents and catechists. To participate, please register with the Religious Education office by mid-August. Preparation and celebration of First Reconciliation and First Communion ordinarily takes place in second grade. At St. Mary's, Confirmation is a two-year process involving students in grades 7 and 8. The Religious Education program and Parish School celebrate reception of each of these sacraments jointly. Because sacraments are celebrated as a parish, all participants in Sacramental Preparation must be registered members of the parish.

MARRIAGE

According to Archdiocese regulations, a date for a wedding must be arranged **at least** six months prior to the wedding. Call the church **FIRST**, before you schedule a reception venue! Contact the rectory with any questions.

CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD

CENTENNIAL CORNER

Sixty-seven years ago on August 5, 1954 the Sarpy County Gazette newspaper reported: "St. Mary's Church will hold their annual lawn social at the Mission Grounds Sunday, August 8. Proceeds from the affair will go to the School Extension Fund to help pay for additions to the school. Chicken in the basket dinners will be served from 2:00 to 7:00 pm. A country store as well as games and rides for the children will be on the amusement schedule." We assume that their proceeds were used towards the four classrooms called the Marian Addition that was dedicated in 1954. Historical tidbit: George Rushart donated \$1,000 towards the Marian Addition and shoveled the first spade of dirt as construction began. This annual lawn social brings to mind that our annual parish picnic will be a month from this coming Thursday on September 12th!

Next Sunday, August 15th, a re-enactment of a "once a month" hot lunch of sloppy joes/hot dogs, chips, milk and cupcakes will be held in the parish center from 11:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. School tours will be available from 11:00 a.m.-1:30 p.m. The class of 2022 will serve ice cream - a long time back to school tradition. The Noon Mass is designated as an alumni Mass, though everyone is invited to attend that Mass and the luncheon. A free will offering is appreciated. - Fifty years ago this Wednesday August 11, 1971: "A first official monthly meeting of the newly formed Court of the Catholic Daughters of America, Our Lady of Perpetual Adoration Court 2036 was held August 5 at St. Mary's Church in Bellevue at 8 pm." Officers of the new court installed: Mrs. William J. Fast, regent; Mrs. Allen Ellerbroek, 1st vice-regent; Mrs. William J. Nagl, 2nd vice regent...."

Dear St. Mary's Parishioners,

After 3 years of formation for the priesthood I have discerned that God is calling me out of seminary formation. I am writing this first to thank you for all that you as a parish have done for me, and secondly to let you know how I came to this decision. I want to say thank you for having given me the opportunity to discern a vocation to the priesthood for the Archdiocese of Omaha. If it were not for your generosity and many others in the diocese it would not be possible for men like myself to take the time to discern the call to the priesthood. It has been a great gift and has been a time filled with growth. I am gratified by how supportive the St. Mary's community has been both in praying for me and financially. Please know that the time and money is not wasted. The formation of our priests is so important and part of that is being able to discern in an environment that is free of financial worry. I realize what a great gift the formation I have received is and I encourage you to continue to support those men who are discerning the call. Your generosity inspires me to be generous with the gifts I have been given. As for my personal discernment it has become clear to me that my desire for priesthood does not match my year in seminary. Only 3 years away from ordination have I found myself with a decreased desire for priesthood and with less clarity in the call. Upon much reflection, it seems that I have looked at the priesthood as a duty or obligation rather than a gift given by God. I realize that I am not freely choosing the priesthood. If it is God's will for me to be a priest, I believe it is first necessary to leave so I can more freely choose it. A grace I have received is the realization that if God desires for me to be a priest, he will put that desire on my heart; I do not have to force it. Moving forward I have many desires for what the future could look like. I trust that the Lord will lead me in this next step. I have learned that the good desires in our hearts are a gift from God the Father and trusting in Him means trusting in the desires he places on our hearts.

CONSTRUCTION UPDATES

Narthex updates as of Wednesday August 4th: The dry-wall continues to be hung in the lower level. The exterior stain issues have been resolved and exterior staining should be completed by the end of this week. Once the exterior stain is completed, the trim will be installed. We hope that will be done by the end of next week. We are still working on the interior stain issues. The irrigation system work has been completed, except for drip lines that will be installed after the planting. We praise God that, after over seven months of production delays, our beautiful new wood doors have been delivered to our contractor. They will be installed after the interior of the Narthex is painted.

School bathroom renovations: As mentioned last week, we are renovating all 15 School and Dominican Center bathrooms. This is a major undertaking since the project needs to be completed (or near completion) by the start of school on August 16th. Some of them are the original bathrooms from the 1950's, and two are being made ADA compatible. The one item we need extra prayers for are the bathroom partitions. Their delivery dates continue to change. We will share pictures with you after the floors are finished, walls are painted and fixtures installed.
