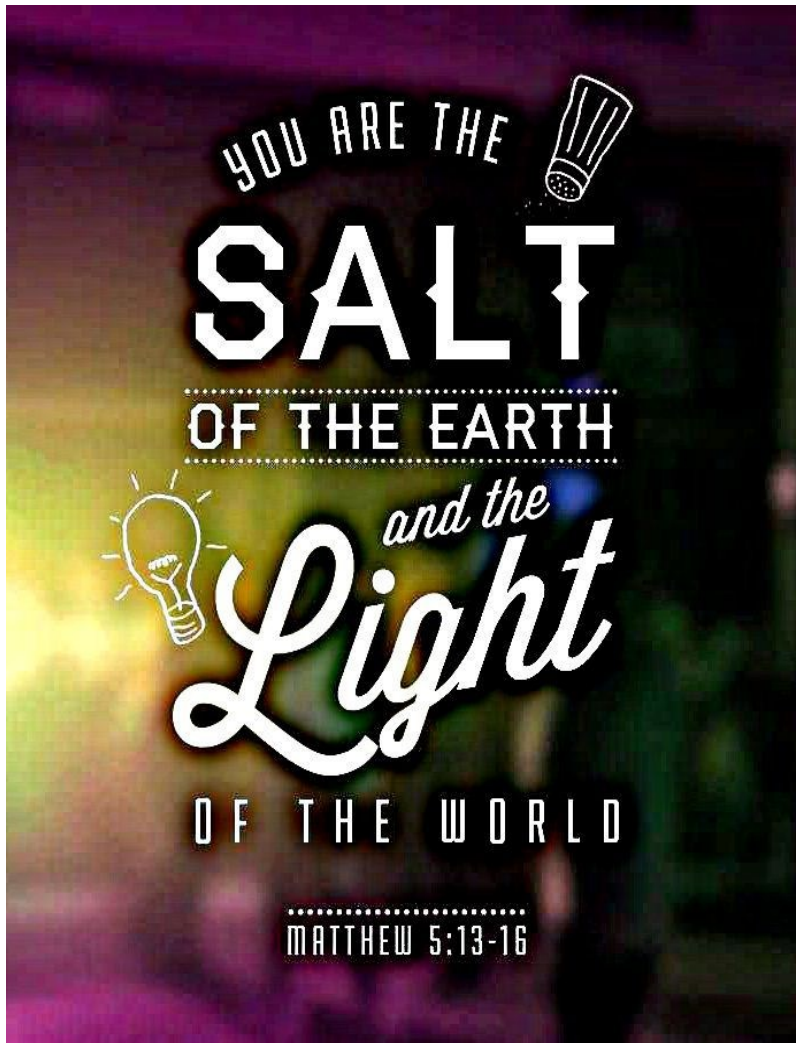

Registering is also beneficial to the church as a whole, in that it helps ensure that we get the most accurate count possible of all those we serve so we can budget and plan efficiently, as well as helps the Archdiocese determine how many priests are assigned to our parish when that time comes.

SCOUT SUNDAY

National Scout Sunday is being observed today across the United States. From its beginning, the scouting movement has encouraged its members to be faithful in the practice of their religion. The Scout Oath calls its members to pledge themselves to do their "duty to God" while the 12th point of Scout Law is "A scout is reverent." St. Mary's Church has been the chartered partner for St. Mary's scouting program for many years. St. Mary's Boy Scout Troop officially began 73 years ago in 1953, while Cub Scout Pack 305 began 53 years ago in 1973. Scouting began when Lord Baden Powell took a group of boys to the first Boy Scout camp on Brownsea Island off the coast of England in 1907. In 1910, Boy Scouts was incorporated in America. Many changes have occurred since then, including a new name: Scouting America. Today, Scouting America celebrates its 116th year.

Pack 305's Cubmaster, Blake James, reports that the pack has grown tremendously in the last few years, as it now boasts 28 youth members and 8 registered adult leaders. The Cubs enjoy yearly activities such as celebrating the birth of Scouting at the Blue & Gold Banquet, at which time 5th grade "Arrow of Light/Webelos" bridge over to the troop. Other activities include Pinewood Derby races, summer camps, their annual "Lock-In", and participating in the Arrows to Aerospace Parade just to name a few. This weekend, we congratulate 10 Cubs who earned their Scout religious medals.

Troop 305 welcomed its new Scoutmaster, Brandon James, in August when Mike Mansidor retired. Both Brandon and his brother, Blake, are Eagle Scouts, with Brandon earning his Eagle years ago through St. Mary's Venture Crew 305. Eli Berkey became the troop's newest Eagle Scout in mid-August. The troop continues to increase its membership, with four new Webelos Cub Scouts bridging over this weekend. The troop camps almost every month, even in the winter, utilizing new four-season tents. Summer camp is always on their yearly plans, as well as Council Camporees, the Arrows to Aerospace Parade, and, of course, fundraising by selling popcorn and camp cards.

As always, our scouts and leaders thank you for the many years of support and prayers; without which our scouts could not follow the trail that takes them exploring and learning while keeping the values of faith and scouting close to their hearts and daily actions. We will continue to "do our best, to do our duty to God and country, to help other people at all times." God bless St. Mary's Parish and its scouts!

WON'T YOU SPEND ONE HOUR WITH OUR LORD?

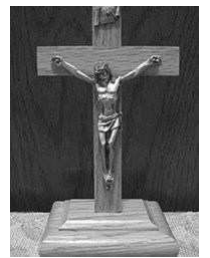

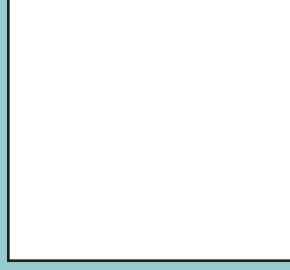
