

From the Pastors

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

January can be an icebox month. Below zero temperatures and bitter windchills. Instead of Christmas greetings in the mail we are getting our credit card bills. There's not even the Vikings to watch after a dismal season. But as Christians we are never without hope!

The Gospel for this Sunday tells of a story to thaw our January hearts and give us hope. We don't know who the couple was at whose wedding Jesus turned water into wine. It's estimated that the new wine added up to 180 gallons; that's a lot of wine. Here is **Pope Francis' take on the wedding at Cana:** "at a certain point, there was no more wine, and the celebration seemed to be ruined. Imagine drinking tea at the end of a celebration! No, it's not good! There is no party without wine! At Mary's suggestion, in that moment Jesus reveals himself for the first time and gives a sign: He transforms water into wine, thus saving the wedding feast. What happened 2000 years ago happens today at every wedding celebration: that which makes your wedding full and profoundly true will be the presence of the Lord who reveals himself and gives his grace. It is his presence that offers the 'good wine'; he is the secret to full joy, that which truly warms the heart."

Jesus is the cause of our joy and our hope. Let us make sure we stay close to him in this new year of grace! As individuals, as families, as a community, as a nation, let us believe in the 'good wine' that Jesus still pours out for us. We follow a Lord who changes things: water into wine, bread into His Body, old ways into new ways, January into hope!

I hope you are making headway in the book Sacred heart gave you for Christmas: <u>LIVING JOY: 9 RULES TO HELP YOU REDISCOVER AND LIVE JOY EVERY DAY</u>. I invite you to check out pages 167-170. If you didn't receive your copy, there are more available at the Church.

Please come on Saturday, January 22nd for a day of prayer for the legal protection of the unborn. We will begin with Mass at 9 a.m. followed by Eucharistic Adoration, the Rosary and ending with the Divine Chaplet by Noon. We believe in respecting all human life from the moment of conception to the moment of natural death.
