

Sharing God's Gifts

Jesus Christ is born! Not into a great city of Jerusalem, but into a small village about five miles south. Not into a noble family, but to an outcast couple keeping the newborn in a manger. Not announced by royal edicts, but by common shepherds. As Christian stewards we simply allow Christ to live in us no matter what our circumstances happen to be. We allow Christ to share his love with us and reflect that love out to others. We now are the heralds of Christ's birth. What an unimaginable gift from a generous Lord. Good stewards rejoice in this gift and give glory to God. On the Feast of the Holy Family, December 26, the ultimate aim of Saint Paul's Letter to the Colossians is to teach the community how to deepen its relationship with Christ Jesus. His list of virtues summarizes the ideals of communal stewardship: compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience. Practicing these virtues opens our hearts to Christ as individuals and as a worshiping community. This is how the Christian community ought to live. This is how its members should behave in their dealings with others. As we approach a new year, how might we embrace one of these virtues more fully in order to deepen our relationship with Jesus? Merry Christmas to each of you!

SHARING THE GOSPEL The Nativity of the Lord

"He so loved us that for our sake He was made man in time, through Whom all times were made; was in the world less in years than His servants, though older than the world itself in His eternity; was made man, Who made man; was created of a mother, whom He created; was carried by hands which He formed; nursed at the breasts which He had filled; cried in the manger in wordless infancy, He the Word without Whom all human eloquence is mute (St. Augustine, Sermon 188)." The miracle of what happens at Christmas is truly an awesome mystery. Revealed in the silent ordinariness of life is God's intimate love for humanity and all that he made. The

Word, existing for all time, comes and dwells among us. God kisses us. We can seek and soar with playful delight as a joy never known before fills our heart.

Joy is best expressed through dance. There is just something truly wonderful about the self-abandon a beautiful melodic dance reveals. Accepting the truth of God's birth in time we also accept an invitation to dance with God. We can let go of what tethers us to anxious concerns and superficial securities. Throw caution to the wind and go with God. We have been blessed with talents, gifts, and life eternal. Follow the rhythm of the dance with joy and listen to what the Word who became flesh tells us about what the next steps can be. Today, heaven remains the same, but earth has been profoundly changed.

Things sleep deprived mothers ponder at 3 a.m. - Were baby Jesus's toes as delicious as my baby's toes? Did Joseph and Mary pretend to eat His toes just to hear his belly laugh? Did Joseph whisper to Jesus all the things he loves

Pope Francis declared 2021 the Year of St. Joseph. So as we celebrate the birth of our Savior, I would like to share this devotion from Max Lucado (Christmas Stories: Heartwarming Classics of Angels, A Manger, and the Birth of Hope):

"The quiet father of Jesus. Rather than make a name for himself, he made a home for Christ. And because he did, a areat reward came his way. "He called his name Jesus" (Matthew 1:25).

Queue up the millions who have spoken the name of Jesus, and look at the person selected to stand at the front of the line: Joseph. Of all the saints, sinners, prodigals, and preachers who have spoken the name, Joseph—a blue -collar, small-town construction worker—said it first. He cradled the wrinkle-faced prince of heaven, and with an audience of angels and pigs, whispered, "Jesus...you'll be called Jesus."

Seems right, don't you think? Joseph gave up his name, so Jesus let Joseph say his. God hunts for Josephs through whom he can deliver Christ into the world."


