The Darkness of a Covid Christmas

“In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came to be through him, and without him nothing came to be. What came to be through him was life, and this life was the light of the human race; the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.” (John 1: 1-5)
Gospel of Christmas morning

For the most part, most celebrations of the feast of Christmas often pass over the darkness and focus rather on the joys of family celebrations, the anticipation of gifts to be opened, the food. Insofar as these ‘traditions’ help us to celebrate the Word’s enfleshment among us (not just in the stable but in the Church herself), they are good things. But, they can become idols, distracting us from the truth that Christmas proclaims: in the small child born in the Bethlehem cave is the light that shines into the darkness.

And this great truth requires that our contemplation of Christ in Christmas acknowledges the darkness. For in every parish there are those that know only darkness especially during this pandemic. The single mother with three children, all at home now for months together may see only darkness. The teen who hates her body so much that she continues to harm it through cutting and vomiting up everything that she eats, may know only darkness. The elderly man, who just lost his wife and seeks to get through the holiday without too much pain, the family of illegal immigrants in the U.S. may know only the darkness of fear, of poverty, of hatred and deep loneliness. The stock broker, who gets up each morning only to increase his own profit and prestige, may at times look at himself and know only darkness.

I think of these people at Christmas. For Christmas is the feast for them in particular. The light shines into the darkness, which of course means that there is darkness for the light to shine into. Christ comes to proclaim the very good news that God dwells among us. And his Advent into the world has not resulted in the erasure of darkness but rather an enlightening of it. For that infant, fresh from the womb, would one day be taken down from the cross and laid in a tomb. He is to be the despised, rejected, the suffering servant of Good Friday.

Christmas is the feast of God’s love among us, His descent into the darkness of the human condition and His bringing light to human history. From the moment that child was born in the stable, darkness met its match because Jesus would transform the darkness through the light of love, through self-gift. Jesus reveals to us that the only way to conquer the darkness is through the light of a descending, self-offering love.

So let us not forget those who dwell in darkness during the feast of Christmas this year. This will be a very different Christmas for all of us -- no large crowds in Church, many zoom family gatherings and many feeling darkness. They need us to share with them that darkness has met, and can meet its match in their lives too, if we receive the gift of His love. This does not mean that we are passive to the darkness. The woman in abuse must seek help. The teen suffering from self-hatred needs to see light. The banker who chooses greed and power needs to recognize the futility of his life. In Christmas, we come to see that these actions are more than our effort alone. Rather they are the in-breaking of the light itself into our human condition.

No matter how dark it gets; no matter how little I value my own life or the lives of others, God seeks to enter into each human life. Hopefully we can see how Christmas may be the best of news to those who “dwell in darkness”. Only our growing capacity to see this light will then “guide our feet into the way of peace”.

May you know the true light of God in your life and share that light with others in darkness. Merry Christmas!



Advent is a time to step away from the world and to prepare our hearts for the coming of Christ. This is the reason that the priest wears purple at Mass as it is a time of preparation, just like Lent.

Hopefully this year, in the midst of trial with the coronavirus, is a time that you can take a moment to step back and really reflect on the coming of Christ. Normally, December is packed full of parties, family get-togethers, and intense shopping. This year, with many of these distractions gone, take a moment to sit, reflect, and spiritually prepare yourself for the coming of Christ. Take in the true beauty and the true joy that exists in the coming of the Christ child, the Incarnation, and the hope and salvation of mankind. Spend some time praying with your Nativity scene this year. Imagine yourself as Mary or Joseph holding the infant Jesus. Reflect upon how the savior of all mankind is so fragile and yet you are holding him in your very arms. Let the joy that is within you spring forward as the Messiah and the Anointed one are present there before you, and you are holding him. Get back to the meaning of what Christmas is truly about.

Christmas is not about the cookies and all the decorations, but rather the Prince of Peace. Let's not only decorate our homes for us, but rather to make them beautiful for the birth of Christ. Normally, we spend much of our time preparing our homes this season. This year let us not only prepare our homes but our hearts as well. Let us prepare in a new and deeper way than we have ever before, so that on Christmas Eve our hearts may be ready and prepared for Him who is the true meaning of Christmas. Let us prepare ourselves to experience the true joy of Christmas Eve, for it will soon be here.

Gospel Meditation

In Blaise Pascal's work, *Pensees*, he says: "What else does this craving, and this helplessness, proclaim but that there was once in man a true happiness, of which all that now remains is the empty print and trace? This he tries in vain to fill with everything around him, seeking in things that are not there the help he cannot find in those that are, though none can help, since this infinite abyss can be filled only with an infinite and immutable object; in other words by God himself."

We have a difficult time accepting that fulfillment and happiness are not achieved by our own merits but through a relationship with God. We are hardwired for this relationship and it is in our DNA. The simple fact is that we come from God and are designed to return to God. If our beginning and our end define who we are, why would we not want to seek the One who can truly satisfy? The world does not realize that it is waiting. It is waiting for the birth of God in time, within one's soul and in eternity. We get so confused by seeking other momentary satisfactions that we misinterpret the hunger within. We crave God.

The union of God and humanity, revealed in Jesus Christ, is precisely what sets us on a straight path, orders our relationships, establishes proper focus and goals and tells us whose kingdom we really are meant to serve. We are so lost. God is with us. The prophet Nathan told this to King David, the angel said this to Mary and the birth of Christ brings this Good News to us. We do not need to be busily looking for more things but must learn to find contentment and blessing in the One Presence. This is the beautiful simple message of Advent!

If you are feeling unsettled, anxious, angry, disgruntled, disconnected, unhappy, worried, fearful, off center, becoming overly self-indulgent, unable to spend time alone and without distraction, then there's a good chance you are lost. Now is the time to allow God to find you! Ponder the holy simplicity of Mary's call to be the Mother of God. "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word." When we are helpless and at home with our emptiness, God will fill us. Our Savior has come.

Our Saints creativity is nurtured in so many ways at Corpus Christi! Throughout the year, Mrs. Seibert, Mrs. Salb, Mrs. Thiessen and Miss Welte find interesting ways to introduce concepts, ideas and artists that broaden our students' scope of learning. Kindergarteners created their coveted Kindergarten Art Books covering many art ideas! First Grade has learned about Wayne Thiebaud and his deliciously beautiful paintings. Second Grade just completed a study of Pablo Picasso's The Three Musicians. Each middle school class has created self-portraits using line and color to produce an artwork equal to a time capsule of our experience of 2020.



In the area of music, students at Corpus Christi were facing a year of not making music in the ways we used to, with our mouths and/or blowing through instruments! Instead of cancelling such an important part of our children's education, Miss. Welte and Mrs. Thiessen adapted their curriculum. How Covid Affects Charitable Giving

The authors of the CARES Act rightly recognized the desire of benefactors to support non-profit organizations in this era of financial hardship. From a tax-benefit standpoint, now is a great time to give, and tax laws are favorable no matter the level at which you are giving:

- There is now no limit to the deductions you can take for charitable contributions if you itemize your contributions. Previously you could only deduct up to a max of 60% of adjusted gross income (AGI). Under new guidelines, 100% of your contribution is tax deductible. And there is a carry-forward, for those who give more than their AGI.
- Anyone who gives up to \$300 can get an easy tax break. Previously, itemization was required for any tax break. Under the CARES Act, taxpayers can take a deduction up to \$300 even if they don't itemize on their 2020 tax form.
- Corporations can receive a higher tax break for their charitable giving.
- Anyone can donate food and get a tax deduction.

Sacramental Guidelines

BAPTISM: Baptism preparation classes for the parent/s are offered the first Saturday of the month at 9:00 am with Fr. Jerry. Parents are encouraged to take the class early in the pregnancy. Register at cccparish.org/baptism.

1st RECONCILIATION & 1st EUCHARIST: Preparation is a 2 year program that begins with 1st Graders who are enrolled in Religious Education or Catholic School. During the 2nd year of preparation, the 2nd grade students will complete First Reconciliation and First Eucharist. Any questions can be addressed to re@cccparish.org.

CONFIRMATION: Preparation is a 2 year process that begins for 7th Graders who have been enrolled in the RE or Catholic School. The Sacrament of Confirmation will be celebrated in the Fall of their 9th Grade Year. Contact re@cccparish.org.

MATRIMONY: The Archdiocese of Kansas City in Kansas requires couples to make arrangements at least six months in advance of the date of marriage. Please call the parish office for an appt. and arrange for marriage prep. classes. Marriages are not celebrated during Lent.
