

# Fr. Jerry's FORUM



## What Are You Looking For?"

After the lights and carols of Christmas, Ordinary Time can seem so, well. Ordinary. But it is in the ordinary days of our ordinary lives that God still asks us to build His kingdom. The readings leading up to Lent, which is a mere 4 weeks away, take us through the life of Christ and encourages us to live lives as He did by transforming ordinary moments into extraordinary moments of charity.

The Gospel of John today gives us John the Baptist calling our attention to the true nature of Jesus in the world by referring to Jesus as the Passover "Lamb" whose blood saved the Israelites from death. It is up to those listening to see that nature for themselves. Jesus encourages their personal search, as he does each one of us, by asking: "What are you looking for?" They respond with a desire to follow Him and to see where he is staying. Seeing the place where he stays means more than we think. When they see where Jesus stays, it becomes their place as well, and they leave John for the new teacher.

Through the Archbishop's Call to Share, we have the opportunity to see where Jesus stays outside of our Lawrence community in the many places in Northeast Kansas funded through this annual appeal. By giving a gift to ACTS, we are funding the many offices of our Archdiocese who support all 21 counties and over 200,000 Catholics. More than 40 charities and outreach ministries funded by the ACTS help provide many places where Jesus resides outside of our view, but part of our family of faith.

By our participation in the ACTS, we express our unity with the Archdiocese who has given us so much support. In my 6 years of seminary studies and my 28 years of priesthood, I have seen over and over again the great things our Archdiocese has done and personally, I rely on their help and support every week.

Even our parish benefits as we receive support and assistance from the Catholic Schools Office, the youth office and the Office of Evangelization. Our Lawrence Catholic Charities office receives funding for them to continue their great ministry, and all of our seminarians are educated and formed. The Archdiocese funds my continuing education, annual retreats and workshops that help in my personal and spiritual growth.

I would challenge all of us to remember that we need to go beyond what we know or are familiar with and learn to listen and look. We need to listen to the voice of the Lord calling us to see Him in the greater Church and to see where He stays in other places and faces. The invitation to come and see applies to our lives as well. Where might you see Jesus staying today? What does following Him as a disciples mean for us?

## ARCHBISHOP NAUMANN'S ANNUAL 2021 CALL TO SHARE APPEAL HOMILY

Each year in early January, we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. In the preface for Mass this weekend we pray: "For in the waters of the Jordan you revealed with signs and wonders a new Baptism, so that through the voice that came down from heaven we might come to believe in your Word dwelling among us, and by the Spirit's descending in the likeness of a dove we might know that Christ your Servant has been anointed with the oil of gladness and sent to bring the good news to the poor."

What was revealed in the Jordan River is good news. Jesus plunges into the waters of the Jordan, immersing Himself completely in our human condition, in order to lead us through the waters of our Baptism to freedom from the slavery of sin to share in His abundant and eternal life.

With all that we have experienced this past year because of the Covid pandemic, the Good News of understanding our identity as beloved daughters and sons of God has never been more important! The most important day of our lives was the day of our Baptism, because on that day we became beloved daughters and sons of our Heavenly Father and we were given an eternal destiny to live with God and His saints forever in Heaven.

Our Lord never promised His disciples that following Him would be easy. In fact, He reminds us that to follow Him will mean embracing the cross. In fact, it is our reaction to adversity that has the ability to make our witness of the Joy of the Gospel even more powerful and compelling. It is the ability of the disciples of Jesus to be witnesses of hope in the midst of the struggles of this world that makes the Gospel attractive to others.

While we wish Covid 19 never happened and we could have avoided the difficulties of the past year, for the Christian it has been an opportunity to witness to the difference that friendship with Jesus makes in our lives. It is our ability not to become self-absorbed and discouraged with present trials but instead focused on the opportunities to bring to others the mercy and love of God that becomes the very means to draw others to desire Jesus.

I have been so edified by how Catholics throughout the Archdiocese have been messengers of hope and joy to the entire community. Catholic Charities, despite increased needs and fewer available volunteers, brought the compassionate love of Jesus to more individuals and families. In addition to those who have contracted the virus, there have been many financial victims resulting from the shutdown of much of our economy. Catholic Charities has been there to help all those in need.

Our Catholic School teachers have embraced the challenge of conducting in-person classes, while observing all the protocols to keep students and their families as safe as possible. In many cases, they have also provided distant learning opportunities to accommodate the needs and preferences of some school families.

Our Priests and parish staffs have been creative in ministering to parishioners even in the midst of government mandated shelter in place orders. They have found safe ways to make the sacraments available to parishioners and have used technology to keep parishes active and vibrant. They have shown special care for the elderly and those most vulnerable to the effects of the Covid virus.

Though they are the least vulnerable to the physical effects of Covid, our young people have been powerfully impacted by the social isolation required because of health department protocols. Our Youth ministry found a way to modify our usual programs to keep camp open for youth this summer. Our Youth Office created beautiful and powerful opportunities for our young people to gather and pray virtually.

Many Catholic doctors, nurses and other medical personnel were on the front lines ministering to those who contracted the virus. These heroic men and women made the healing love of Jesus real to their patients and their families.

In the midst of the pandemic, our Pro-Life ministry launched the ***Walking with Moms in Need*** initiative expanding support and the available resources for those experiencing financial as well as other difficulties during a pregnancy. At the same time thanks to the work of a special Foster Care Task Force, we are mobilizing the Catholic community to surround with love children whose families are going through a difficult time.

Once again I have been amazed by the generosity of the people of the Archdiocese in their support of our parishes, schools and ministries. Despite all of the economic hardships that many of our parishioners experienced, the donations to *Call to Share* matched the generosity of previous years.

I come to you again this year humbly asking your for generous support for the 2021 ***Archbishop's Call to Share*** appeal. Many may not be able to give this year because of economic hardship. We still need your prayers. For those of us who have continued to be blest during these difficult times, I ask you to invite the Holy Spirit to guide your discernment of making a sacrificial gift to ***Call to Share 2021***.

Thank you for helping our Church during the unforeseen challenges of 2020 being witnesses of the hope and love of the Son of God who was baptized in the Jordan. None of us know what challenges 2021 will bring. Yet, we do know that Jesus will be with us. We do know that through Him we have become beloved daughters and sons of God. We do know that Our Lord is inviting us to pool our prayers and financial resources to equip the Church to continue to proclaim the truth of God's amazing love revealed in the river Jordan 2,000 years ago, We are our Heavenly Father's beloved sons and daughters who have a mission to bring the love of the one baptized in the Jordan to the world today.



## CORPUS CHRISTI COMMUNITY



Each year after we ring in the New Year, Archbishop Naumann begins his Annual Appeal: A Call to Share (ACTS). The planning for this annual appeal is a year-long process of people coming together and looking at the needs of the people that we are called to serve as the Church of Northeast Kansas. The year-long planning process is not about how to increase the amount of dollars secured by the appeal, but rather a constant look at the needs that are present among the people that are served by our parishes and by the offices of the Archdiocese that work tirelessly in ministry with children and the elderly; with people of color and those with disabilities; with young couples preparing for a life together and all those who find themselves marginalized in our society. This was Christ's call to all disciples.

Our call to Stewardship each year in the parish's annual drive is a reminder to all of us that we are responsible for the gifts that God has bestowed on each of us — and as stewards of God's gifts we are called to return a portion of them. Our annual Stewardship drive asks all parishioners to work toward a five percent return of your financial gifts to the parish itself, to offer another one percent toward the annual appeal by the Archbishop through ACTS, and to use the remaining four percent toward the charities that are also close to your heart. We also ask for your time and talents to make all of our various parish ministries possible (and post COVID-19 we will be looking to add ministries). This is what Stewardship as a disciple of Jesus calls us to: a life of trust and relationship with the God who has bestowed gifts upon us. It is not a simple request, but one that demands a look inside of ourselves to find the trust and the faith to respond when we are called upon.

### Financial Stewardship Goal: 10% of our gifts returned to God

- 5% to your parish
- 1% to the Archbishop's Annual Appeal (ACTS)
- 4% that can be used for parish capital needs or other charities (i.e. United Way, St. Jude's, American Cancer Society, Corpus League of Angels, Parish Education Endowment, William's Fund)

It is easy, and often a favorite pastime, to look at anything that comes with the Archdiocesan name tacked onto it as something outside of who we are. An "us" versus "them" mentality sometimes guides our thoughts when we are asked for dollars or time and talent at the Archdiocesan level. We think, *I would rather keep my dollars here, or, I don't know what they do with that money.* In reality, as a Catholic parish, "We are "them!" There is no Corpus Christi Catholic Community without the Archdiocese of Kansas City in Kansas. And the dollars that we offer to this annual appeal benefit all of us in two ways. First, Msgr. Krische and I are priests of the Archdiocese and were educated in part by the funds that come from this annual appeal. Right now we are educating seminarians that will in the future serve this parish, or other parishes that you may find yourself part of in this Archdiocese. Second, many of the programs and ministries funded by this annual appeal directly affect hundreds of our families. The School Office sets the curriculum and supports our parish school, the Office of Evangelization does the same for our Children's Religious Education program. Marriage and Family Life helps in setting our young couples on the path of marriage, the Youth Office oversees the work done at Prairie Star Ranch, our youth camp. In the same light, all those other offices and ministries do the work that we are all called to do, and they do it in our name.

Monsignor and I are asking that you prayerfully consider a gift to this annual appeal. It is an important part of our ministry and our call to follow Christ. As you read Archbishop Naumann's message on Call to Share on page 2, know that we will all receive a letter asking for financial support for his annual appeal. Please respond quickly by mailing your gift or bringing it directly to church and placing in the collection basket. All gifts are greatly appreciated, and everyone can offer something. 



## Pastoral Council Members Needed

The Pastoral Council shall serve as a consultative group to the pastor, to assist him in fostering pastoral activities and in providing for the continued growth of parish life. The areas of focus include:

- The spiritual formation and growth of the people of the parish;
- The education of adults and youth in the faith;
- The fostering and nurturing of “community” in the parish;
- The evangelization of the non-participative Catholics in the parish and the unchurched;
- Witnessing to the Gospel of social justice in one’s community through service.

The members of the Pastoral Council will provide information and make recommendations, which reflect the spirit of the parish, in order to advise the pastor concerning decisions affecting the life of the parish community;

- Be responsible with the pastor for the pastoral planning of the parish, including ecumenical activities;
- Review, evaluate, and make recommendation to the pastor and the Parish Finance Council concerning the funding of parish programs;
- Provide the communications, coordination, and cooperation among the parish members, its organizations, and committees.
- Participate in and cooperate with regional and diocesan decisions pertaining to parish life.

The Council ideally will be composed of 9 members representing a wide variety of parish membership including young adults and seniors, newly married or single, parents of children in private and public schools, etc. Variety is a blessing because it is what makes up every parish and the universal Church.
