


This Week More Than Any Other - "Stay Awake"

With Today's Feast of Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion, we begin Holy Week. This truly is and should be the most important week of the year for Christians as we recall these days that truly 'saved'. We would not have been saved from our sins and the gates of heaven opened for us, if it were not for the events of this week. I think about this throughout the year and am thankful. That is why every Sunday of the year we rejoice and give thanks because of the events of this week and how they led up to resurrection.

No other Sunday in the liturgical year reflects such dramatic contrast as today. What begins with songs of triumph and the parade of palm branches quickly shifts into remembrance of the Lord's passion. His royal entrance into the holy city of Jerusalem was also an entrance into the mystery of his suffering, death and Resurrection. As we enter this holiest of weeks with Christ, may our participation in each solemn liturgy draw us into deeper union with him and with one another. But for this to happen, we need to stay awake and make the effort and give the time and attention that He and these days deserve.

It is hard to stay awake to the sin and suffering in this world. Even Jesus' disciples failed to keep watch with him in his deep sorrow. But the Gospel urges us to keep trying. It asks us to go with Christ to the heart of sorrow and to stand awake and in solidarity with the poor and the suffering, the unemployed and the homebound, who have more time than they would like to spend in worry or in prayer. Our culture offers us many escapes, many ways to "sleep", to avoid the challenge of prayer and retreat in prayer and with the Church during these sacred days, but I implore you and offer to you some practical suggestions to participate.



Because of Covid restrictions and the cautions we take to keep everyone safe, many of the liturgies of this Holy Week will be simplified and certain rituals deleted. Holy Thursday, as we celebrate the Mass of the Lord's Supper, there will be no celebration of the mandatum or the washing of the feet, but what you might do at home is take some time to read Luke 4: 16-21 about the act of service which is the mandatum. You could celebrate this act of service with all those for whom you live; wash each other's feet in response to "do as Jesus commanded".

Good Friday is good for us because it is the day Jesus died so that we might live with Him in eternity. This day is a day of fasting and abstaining from eating meat. It should be a day for you to fast from work and play: we are walking the stations of the cross with him. While some might say they can't attend the liturgies at noon and 3:00 pm because they have to work, others might realize the importance of spending those hours with the universal church in prayer. At noon, the hour when Jesus was nailed to the cross, we will pray the Stations of the Cross in Church or you could do so at home before your crucifix, and at 3:00, the Universal Church prays the passion Gospel from John and venerates the cross on which hung the Savior of the world. Abstain from all electronic devices this day and communicate with the One who saved you.

Holy Saturday is a day to be mourning -- to be with Jesus in the tomb. But that turns to rejoicing as we see Him rise from the dead. Holy Saturday night, we celebrate the great Easter Vigil with the new fire outside of Church and the readings concerning salvation history from Genesis to the account of the resurrection. This joy leads us to celebrate the Sacraments of Initiation with those who will join us as Catholics. This leads the rest of the world to Easter joy!

So stay awake this week! Remember that only one man could turn a week of betrayal, intrigue and murder into the holiest week of the year!

Reflect today on those times when you have betrayed Jesus by turning away from his call to love and forgive others. Ask for his help in being faithful disciples.

Wednesday

"For the Lord hears the poor, and his own who are in bonds he spurns not." Ps 69:34

Lend your ear to someone who is poor in spirit today. Show your care and concern by listening with love and attentiveness.

Thursday

"Then he poured water into a basin and began to wash the disciples' feet and dry them with the towel around his waist." Jn 13:5

Perform an act of service today for someone in your home or neighborhood. Do so with a generous and loving heart.

Friday

"And bowing his head, he handed over the spirit." Jn 19:30

Place a crucifix or cross in the place where your family gathers for prayer. Take turns holding it and offering a prayer for all of those who are suffering today.



The Triduum commemorates the, "culmination of the entire liturgical year," the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Because Jesus was willing to die for our sins and was resurrected, death no longer is the end of life for us. It is the beginning of new life. The word "Triduum" comes from the Latin word triduum, which comes from tris ("three") + dies ("day"). The three days are counted as the Hebrews counted their days, from dusk to dusk. Therefore, the three days of the Easter Triduum are from dusk on Holy Thursday to dusk on Good Friday (day one), dusk on Good Friday to dusk on Holy Saturday (day two), and dusk on Holy Saturday to dusk on Easter Sunday (day three). The Sacred Triduum is one great festival recounting the last three days of Jesus' life on earth, the events of his Passion and Resurrection, when the Lamb of God laid down his life in atonement for our sins.


The Triduum is the Church's gift to us each year. It's a three day retreat. A three day invitation to prayer. Three days to unlock and unpack the paschal mystery, a story that we've heard a thousand times but we have barely begun to appreciate or understand - the suffering, death and resurrection of Jesus. Three days that changed the course of history, the destiny of man, and the true meaning of life more than the million years that came before or the million years that will follow.

Each of those days "tells" a different part of the story of Jesus' saving action. On Holy Thursday we remember the Last Supper. Jesus gives us the Eucharist and tells us to "Do this in memory of me." The Eucharist shows that God is not only more powerful than we can comprehend, but also more humble than we can comprehend. Who among us would be willing to reduce themselves to almost nothing for the sake of their loved one, especially if the loved one had been so unfaithful? And yet, God does it over and over and over again. Ending this liturgy, he pleads, "Stay here and keep watch with me". This is his personal invitation to be a part of this magical mystery.



We remember that God is love — not a God who loves, but a God whose very nature is love. God goes to the end of unreasonableness, the end of the absurd, the end of the unbelievable, not just to save us, but simply to be with us.

On Good Friday we remember the passion and death of Jesus, the humiliation that Jesus undertook for the entire humanity.




Jesus' forgiveness of others was radical and to a degree never seen before. While hanging on the Cross and enduring the cruelty of others, Jesus spoke words of forgiveness. He forgave them in the midst of His persecution.

What's more is that He even acknowledged that those crucifying Him were not fully responsible. They clearly did not know what they were doing. This humble acknowledgment of Jesus shows the depth of His tender mercy. It reveals He died not in anger or resentment, but in willing sacrifice. Through the suffering of Christ, God brings reconciliation for all. This gives many the strength to endure suffering, even today, and to look for a world where every tear will be dried and all the pain will have disappeared.

On Holy Saturday, the Paschal candle, the symbol of Jesus Christ in glory, is lit from the new fire. Jesus Christ, the light of humanity, dispels the darkness of heart and mind and illuminates every human being who comes into the World. This rich symbolism is highlighted as we welcome new members into our Catholic community and celebrate Christ's resurrection.

The Triduum, the culmination of our faith, brings us to the Last Supper, makes us pray with Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane, allows us to walk the steps of the Stations of the Cross, and brings us to the tomb on Easter Sunday morning. These events and experiences are what save us. As we rejoice at the celebration of the Triduum, we remember the great saving action of Jesus Christ and we also hope to become faithful witnesses who bring the victory of life over death and light into the world through our good works of love, justice and peace to others.



Easter Registration



The Divine Mercy Novena: Good Friday-Divine Mercy Sunday

Jesus revealed to Saint Faustina, a Polish nun, a nine day novena that He desired be prayed in preparation for Divine Mercy Sunday. The novena was to begin on Good Friday and be prayed each day of the Triduum and of Easter Week in preparation for the glorious Feast of Mercy which was to take place on the Eighth Day of Easter (The Sunday after Easter Day). The novena includes praying the Chaplet of the Divine Mercy and a prayer for each of the nine days dedicated to different groups of people. Information on the history behind the Divine Mercy Chaplet and Novena and instructions for praying it can be found at thedivinemercy.org.



Opening Prayer: *You expired, Jesus, but the source of life gushed forth for souls, and the ocean of mercy opened up for the whole world. O Fount of Life, unfathomable Divine Mercy, envelop the whole world and empty Yourself out upon us.*

(Repeat 3 times) *O Blood and Water, which gushed forth from the Heart of Jesus as a fountain of Mercy for us, I trust in You!*

Our Father, Hail Mary and the Apostle's Creed

For each of the five decades (On each "Our Father" bead of the rosary, pray)

Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your Dearly Beloved Son, Our Lord, Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.

(On each of the 10 "Hail Mary" beads, pray)

For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

Concluding prayer: (Repeat 3 times)

Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

Optional Closing Prayer: *Eternal God, in whom mercy is endless and the treasury of compassion inexhaustible, look kindly upon us and increase Your mercy in us, that in difficult moments we might not despair nor become despondent, but with great confidence submit ourselves to Your holy will, which is Love and Mercy itself.*

Placing of Palm Branches in the Home

The branches that are blessed and brought home on Passion (Palm) Sunday are placed near the crucifix or the family Bible. They remind us that Lent is the slow coming of spring to earth, the renewal of life. They are like the great "Hosanna" with which we hail the crucified and risen Lord. After dinner or at another time on Palm Sunday, the household gathers where the palms have been placed. All make the sign of the cross.



The leader begins: *Hosanna in the highest! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.*
Response: Hosanna in the highest!

The leader may use these or similar words to introduce the prayer: We have come to the last days of Lent. Today we heard the reading of the Passion. That story will remain with us as we leave Lent behind on Holy Thursday and enter into the Three Days when we celebrate the mystery of Christ's passing through suffering and death to life at God's right hand.

Listen to the words of the second Letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians: (4:10-11) [We are] always carrying about in the body the dying of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be manifested in our body. For we who live are constantly being given up to death for the sake of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may be manifested in our mortal flesh. The Word of the Lord.

Response: Thanks be to God.

After a time of silence, members of the household join in prayers of intercession. The intercessions are followed by the Lord's Prayer. The Leader continues:

Let us pray.

Blessed are you, God of Israel,
so rich in love and mercy.

Let these branches ever remind us of Christ's triumph.
May we who bear them rejoice in his Cross
and sing your praise forever and ever.

Response: Amen.

Together all take the palms to the place where they will be kept through the coming year. When all have returned to the starting point, the leader concludes:

Let us bless the Lord.

All respond, making the sign of the cross:

Thanks be to God.


