Saying a Great "Amen!" to God and Our Mothers

As we celebrate Mothers day this weekend, it is good for us to reflect on who our God hopes that we become and how that is reflecting in the communion Rite of the Mass --- I think it also reflects on what mothers might desire for their children too.

At the conclusion of the Eucharistic prayer at Mass, we sing the Great Amen, and move toward communion. We begin the Communion Rite as we stand and pray the Lord's Prayer, the prayer all Christians share, the prayer that marks all kinds of moments and memories. Most of us will learn this prayer from our mothers when we are children, who teach us how to be in community yet also to take some responsibility of our own. From this point of the Mass onward, it is especially clear that what we are doing is our doing, and not simply the priest's. The words of the Lord's prayer belong to all of us. They sum up the basics of our life: praising God's holiness, praying for the reign of God, asking for our daily bread.

From the Lord's prayer we move closer to communion. Normally we would exchange a sign of peace which is meant to be a lot more than a 'warm fuzzy'. By offering this to everyone and anyone who is around us - no matter who they are or what they look like; friend or even enemy -- we say by this action that there are no walls, that the reign of God is among us now. Sometimes a mother might force her child to 'play nice' knowing that sometimes that 'playing' might just open up reconciliation or healing or the knowledge of unity and communion.

Our focus now in the Mass returns to the table. The body of Christ is broken for all and the blood of Christ poured out for all. We sing the Lamb of God litany, praising God over and over again for taking away our sins, begging again and again for mercy and for peace.

We then move to the table, our communion procession. When the minister says "The Body of Christ" we say "Amen." That Amen means "Yes, I believe." St. Augustine told his congregation something else about the Amen: "It is your own mystery you receive. Say Amen to what you are!" What you are -- the body and blood of Christ. Our Amen sends us forth to live as Christ's body and blood in our homes, our schools, our workplaces, our neighborhoods, our world.


If this Amen at Mass is our agreeing to who we are as the Body of Christ; a community united together, each with a unique role, just like all of the members of a family, it is also saying yes to the same desire for all of her children -- to be united together and all play a vital part in the family growing together in faith and love.

Our God and our mothers might desire to hear these words from all of us and these might just be words we should say to both as we honor them:

1. Thank you -- these words can never be said enough
2. I'm happy - with who I am and my life as it is
3. I know you love me --- sometimes they just need to know that we know
4. I need you
5. I admire you

Covid Restrictions Loosened

As things open up in our community, we have implemented some changes in our procedures at Corpus Christi. Our main goal is to keep every one of our parishioners safe, so we will still continue to wear masks and keep every other pew vacant. Fr. Jerry stated at last weekend liturgies, parishioners will now be able to seat themselves. Please be mindful that you will still need to social distance yourselves and ask that you listen to the ushers if they ask you to move to the center of pews so that others can be seated. Our changes are listed in the timeline below.

May 1/2

- Parishioners will be able to seat themselves.
 - Please be mindful that you must continue to social distance yourself from those in your pew.
 - You must be aware that you may need to move to the center of the pews so that others can be seated.
- The special needs entrance will be unlocked and parishioners will be able to enter and exit through that door.
- Parishioners will no longer have to wait to be dismissed from the conclusion of the liturgy, but you still need to social distance yourselves from other people leaving.
- You still need to remain in the church until after the liturgy has concluded (no leaving after communion).

May 29/30


- Last weekend for Outside Communion
- Last listen in the lot.

June 5/6

- Archbishop Naumann has chosen the Solemnity of The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, the weekend of June 5-6, 2021, as the occasion on which the dispensation from the obligation by the faithful to attend Mass shall be lifted. Beginning with Masses for that weekend, all the Catholic faithful residing within the Archdiocese of Kansas City in Kansas must return to observing the precept of the Church to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation.
- Of course, those who suffer from underlying health concerns or compromised immunity, or who have genuinely serious concerns about the risk of contracting the coronavirus are not bound by the obligation to attend Mass.
- Additionally, and as has always been the case, whether one is obligated to attend Mass or not, we are nonetheless obliged to observe the Third Commandment of our Lord to keep holy the Sabbath. The faithful who are unable to attend Mass should celebrate a liturgy of the Word in their home, using the Sunday readings; like all the faithful, they should refrain from unnecessary work and avoid unnecessary shopping, and should spend time in leisure, rest, and prayer with their families and loved ones.
- If you are sick, you are not to come to church and are not bound by the obligation to attend Mass.
- Daily masses starting June 7th will no longer be live-streamed.

June 12/13

- The only liturgy being live-streamed will be the 8:30 am liturgy from this date on.



Ways to Celebrate the Month of Mary

◆ Pray a Novena to Our Lady - Sometime during the month of May, pray a novena to the Blessed Mother for a particular intention that you want to entrust to her Immaculate Heart, for yourself or for someone else.

O Most Blessed Mother, heart of love, heart of mercy, ever listening, caring, consoling, hear our prayer. As your children, we implore your intercession with Jesus your Son. Receive with understanding and compassion the petitions we place before you today, especially ... (mention your special intention).

We are comforted in knowing your heart is ever open to those who ask for your prayer. We trust to your gentle care and intercession, those whom we love and who are sick or lonely or hurting. Help all of us, Holy Mother, to bear our burdens in this life until we may share eternal life and peace with God forever. Amen.

◆ Pray the Rosary - One way Catholic families observe this Marian month is by praying the Rosary. Popes over the years have told us how important this biblically inspired prayer is to our life long faith walk. If you have not experienced the spiritual graces of praying the Rosary regularly, try it this week. You may find it leads to spiritual change in your life!

The Holy Rosary meditates on the mysteries of joy, of sorrow and the glory of Jesus and Mary. The word rosary means "Crown of Roses". Every time we say a Hail Mary we are giving her a beautiful rose and with the completion of a Rosary makes her a crown of roses.

- Make the Sign of the Cross.
- Holding the Crucifix, say the Apostles' Creed.
- On the first bead, say an Our Father.
- Say one Hail Mary on each of the next three beads.
- Say the Glory Be
- For each of the five decades, announce the Mystery then say the Our Father.
- While fingering each of the ten beads of the decade, next say ten Hail Mary's while meditating on the Mystery. Then say a Glory Be. After finishing each decade, say: *O my Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of hell; lead all souls to Heaven, especially those who have most need of your mercy.*
- After saying the five decades, say the Hail, Holy Queen, followed by this dialogue and prayer:

V. Pray for us, O holy Mother of God. R. That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ. Let us pray: O God, whose Only Begotten Son, by his life, Death, and Resurrection, has purchased for us the rewards of eternal life, grant, we beseech thee, that while meditating on these mysteries of the most holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we may imitate what they contain and obtain what they promise, through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.

Mental Health Awareness Month

Since 1949, Mental Health America and our affiliates across the country have observed May is Mental Health Month by reaching out to millions of people through the media, local events, and screenings. During May, the National Alliance on Mental Illness joins the national movement to raise awareness about mental health. Each year we fight stigma, provide support, educate the public and advocate for policies that support people with mental illness and their families.

The COVID-19 pandemic has had a profound impact on the mental health of people of all ages. Now, more than ever, it is critical to reduce the stigma around mental health struggles, because that stigma often prevents individuals from seeking help.

Key Findings

- **Youth mental health is worsening.** 9.7% of youth in the U.S. have severe major depression, compared to 9.2% in last year's dataset. This rate was highest among youth who identify as more than one race, at 12.4%.
- **Even before COVID-19, the prevalence of mental illness among adults was increasing.** In 2017-2018, 19% of adults experienced a mental illness, an increase of 1.5 million people over last year's dataset.
- **Suicidal ideation among adults is increasing.** The percentage of adults in the U.S. who are experiencing serious thoughts of suicide increased 0.15% from 2016-2017 to 2017-2018 – an additional 460,000 people from last year's dataset.
- **There is still unmet need for mental health treatment among youth and adults.** 60% of youth with major depression did not receive any mental health treatment in 2017-2018. Even in states with the greatest access, over 38% are not receiving the mental health services they need. Among youth with severe depression, only 27.3% received consistent treatment. 23.6% of adults with a mental illness reported an unmet need for treatment in 2017-2018. This number has not declined since 2011.
- **The percentage of adults with a mental illness who are uninsured increased for the first time since the passage of the Affordable Care Act (ACA).** Nationally, 10.8% are uninsured, totaling 5.1 million adults. This figure differs dramatically across states – in New Jersey (ranked #1) 2.5% of adults with AMI are uninsured, compared to 23% in Wyoming (ranked #51).

You Are Not Alone

Together, we can realize our shared vision of a nation where anyone affected by mental illness can get the appropriate support and quality of care to live healthy, fulfilling lives — a nation where no one feels alone in their struggle. Gospel Meditation

“Remain in my love,” and, “I call you friends,” are powerful words that are found in John’s Gospel. Most of us probably have them committed to memory or have at least heard them proclaimed dozens of times. They are words that can easily become trite and quickly glossed over without fully pondering and digesting their profound beauty. When we take the time to immerse ourselves in them, they can radically change our lives and our relationships. They can open up new doors of adventure and hold countless possibilities for meaning. The essence of love and friendship are things that can easily be taken for granted. They have always been there and are a significant part of our lives. Many would say that they could not live without love and friendship, and they put a great deal of care into preserving, deepening and sustaining them. Love and friendship share a mutual relationship with each other that deserves more reflection.

Where does love come from? We can consider relationships that have not succeeded and conclude that they were somehow due to our “failures in love.” In doing so, we assume that human beings are the ones responsible for love, its success and also its failure. While our weakness, emotional composition and sinfulness can easily impact our ability to love, its origin is not human. God is love. God is love’s author and origin. When we love, it is God who loves in and through us. It is because of this divine closeness

that Jesus is able to call us friends! It is not because of anything we have done but simply because of who we are. Realizing and contemplating this awesome reality becomes a game changer across the board. It gives us reason to clear the table of anything that can adversely affect the way we love so that we can open the door for its author to shine forth.

Coming upon this truth is what leads folks like St. Francis of Assisi to leave that which is comfortable and worldly and live a radical life. They relate with the love of God that radiates in and through all living things and appreciate their sacredness. It was having an intimate experience of God’s love and friendship that propelled St. Francis and others to embrace simplicity, act nonviolently, pursue humility, love enemies, care for the earth and open up avenues for true justice. Understanding this profound truth will also help us find peaceful solutions to world’s problems, restore relationships with our sisters and brothers, bring the grace of loving stewardship to creation and heal many wounds. Once we begin to see how wonderfully holy all of life really is, we discover joy. We lose our need for fear, develop a fierce fortitude, act prudently and seek justice. There is great power in love because it comes from God. It will never fail. It also enjoys the company of two other friends who are eager to become our friends as well: faith and hope. These are just as important to have and to share.
