



Fr. Jerry's FORUM



The Apocalypse, Death and Resurrection of the Body

As we near the end of our liturgical year we hear these apocalyptic readings from scripture. This literature arose in periods of strife and persecution. They are presented as God's revelations to the faithful who live in fear, and they urge people to remain true to God, who will not desert them. Apocalyptic literature uses symbols easily recognizable to the audience at that time, but might not be as obvious in our time. Many of the images of heaven come from scenes at the end of the Book of Daniel and Revelation.


The reading from Daniel shows a shift in Jewish thinking about life after death. The early scriptures do not believe in an afterlife, but those now, once persecuted, our beliefs have changed. This change continues to the New Testament and the Gospel from Mark reminds us as does all of the teachings of Jesus that there is life after death, and even a resurrection of our bodies.

At the moment of death, the soul leaves its body. While the body begins its slow process of decay, the soul immediately experiences the first judgment, usually referred to as our "Particular judgment" (CCC 1022). Here we discover the consequences of the choices we made for or against Christ in our lifetime. There are no do-overs.

In John 5:29 Jesus speaks of a time when "all the dead will rise", and that "the hour is coming when all who are in the tombs will hear his voice and come forth, those who have done good, to the resurrection of life, and those who have done evil, to the resurrection of judgment" (CCC 998). This is the Final Judgment when everything you and I have ever done -- good and bad -- will be made known before all of humanity. Then, after all the judgments have been rendered, the blessed and the damned alike will receive back their bodies. For the damned, their bodies will increase their sorrow, and for the blessed, their bodies will increase their joy, enabling them to more fully enter into the glory of heaven.

So what kind of body will it be? This speaks also of the importance of caring for the human body in life and in death. This is why it is also so important to bury the body or the remains after death — not only does it help with the grieving, but also recognizes that the body is for God and its eternal destiny. I will write more next week on the body glorified and care for the body after death.

Communal Anointing of the Sick

THE CHURCH BELIEVES AND CONFESSES THAT AMONG THE SEVEN SACRAMENTS THERE IS ONE ESPECIALLY INTENDED TO STRENGTHEN THOSE WHO ARE BEING TRIED BY ILLNESS, THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK.

- Catechism of the Catholic Church

Who can receive this Sacrament? Any person who is seriously ill, in danger of death, weakened by old age (even if no serious illness is present), or preparing for serious surgery due to illness may receive the sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. One should not necessarily wait until they are on their deathbed to receive this sacrament.

We will celebrate a communal anointing of the sick at the conclusion of the 8:30 Mass on Sunday December 5.

Parish Mission Coming Nov. 14-16: "60 Minutes for Jesus" with Fr. Jim Sichko


Fr. Jim Sichko is a full-time preacher, evangelist, and motivational speaker. In February 2016, Fr. Jim was commissioned as one of the Papal Missionaries of Mercy, of which there are only 100 in the United States. Since becoming a priest, Fr. Jim has made headlines for random acts of generosity and kindness, giving away thousands of dollars to people at the grocery stores, on the streets, and especially to those most in need. He has also had the opportunity to meet and work with many celebrities and was honored by the U.S. Congress for his ministry.

Fr. Jim uses real, every day life experiences — and ties those experiences into the Gospel message of Jesus Christ. Each of his talks is geared for all ages and members of a family; or for those single and religious as well.

The Mission will run November 14, 15, 16 from 6:30 to 7:30 pm in the Church, followed each evening by a short social reception in Fr. Jim Shaughnessy Hall. The south section of the church will remain masked, but for those individuals whose health is compromised we will live-stream the mission.
