

Roses for Our Lady

Gaudete! Rejoice! It is the third Sunday of Advent -- a day to rejoice for the greater joy we have gained during these weeks of Advent. We light the rose colored candles of our Advent wreaths and are blessed that this Sunday also falls on December 12 this year: The Feast of our Lady of Guadalupe. Even though the Sunday of Advent takes precedence over celebration of Our Lady, this feast is a great example of the joy that should come to us.

Our Lady of Guadalupe is the patroness of the Americas and of the unborn, giving us great hope to overcome the culture of death that has overtaken our society. While many people know the story of Our Lady of Guadalupe's appearance in Mexico to Juan Diego on December 12, 1531, not everyone knows the significance that roses played in the miraculous event.

There is so much to love about the story that makes it so relevant to our Advent: Our Lady was pregnant when she appeared to Juan Diego and she came to unite the different cultures and break down divisions. The story begins almost twelve years after Hernan Cortes landed with Spanish soldiers and nearly ten years after their battles were over, which put an end to the practice of human sacrifice and gave Spain control. But conversions to the Catholic faith through Franciscan missionaries occurred very slowly. It even seemed that the natives were ready to revolt against the Spanish government, whose brutality undermined the Church's efforts to evangelize.

In 1529, the first Bishop of Mexico, the Franciscan Fray Juan de Zumarraga, wrote to the King of Spain: "If God does not act to remedy the situation as soon as possible, this land will be lost forever." The Bishop also prayed to Our Blessed Mother to intervene. He wrote in his journal that he had asked for a sign that his prayer would be answered: he asked for roses from his homeland of Castille, Spain.

On December 9, 1531, as the peasant Juan Diego made his way to Mass in the morning, the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to him on Tepeyec Hill. She instructed him to see the bishop and ask for a temple to be built on the site of her appearance. Naturally, the Bishop was skeptical. But Juan Diego visited him again the very next day and reported the second appearance of the Blessed Mother. It was at this second meeting that the bishop asked for a sign.

Juan Diego missed the third meeting with the Blessed Mother while caring for his sick uncle, but when he finally passed by the hill on the way to Mass, she still appeared and let him know that his uncle would be healed. It was then that Juan Diego asked for a sign to bring back to the bishop. The Blessed Mother instructed him to climb to the top of the Hill where he would find flowers to pick and place in his tilma. He was to keep them hidden until he saw the bishop. He then gathered the dark pink roses with her help.

Juan Diego was again ushered in to see the bishop with a sign that the apparitions were real -- Castilian roses! That was the miraculous sign since they did not grow in Mexico, let alone in the middle of December. Juan did not realize -- until after he had opened his cloak and the roses came tumbling out - that an image of Our Blessed Mother was emblazoned on his tilma -- the image that we know and love today.



The bishop and others fell to their knees when they saw the image in astonishment -- not because of the roses but because of the beautiful image. It was the exact image of Our Lady that Juan Diego saw on the hill. The roses served not just to hide the image, but served as a personal sign to the bishop in answer to his prayer.

Because of the specific symbols on the image of the Blessed Mother, the Mexican people immediately knew it to be Mary. The image and God working through it, transformed the country. Within nine years of her appearance, nine million Mexicans were baptized into the Catholic Church. She brought joy, peace, unity and faith to the country as she can do for us today. Her constant message over the ages is the message we need today: "Go to my Son". This is the only path to joy.

The Roman Church has been singing the "O" Antiphons since at least the eighth century. They are the antiphons that accompany the Magnificat canticle of Evening Prayer from December 17-23. The predominant theme is messianic, stressing the hope of the Savior's coming.

One of our opening songs during Advent, Come, Lord Jesus, Come and the hymn O Come, O come Emmanuel are songs that are based on the "O" Antiphons. Each verse of the hymn parallels with one of the antiphons and they add a mood of eager expectation to the liturgy that builds throughout these seven days and climaxes at Christmas.


The antiphons are, in fact, a collage of Old Testament types of Christ. Jesus is invoked by various titles, mainly taken from the prophet Isaiah. The sequence progresses historically, from the beginning, before creation, to the very gates of Bethlehem. Each O Antiphon begins with an invocation of the expected Messiah, followed by praise of him under one of his particular titles. Each ends with a petition for God's people, relevant to the title by which he is addressed, and the cry for him to "Come" which embodies the longing of all for the Divine Messiah. The 'O' Antiphons illustrate the fullness of time. All the antiphons reflect this eternity encompassing the past, present and future, the key moments of Salvation History. These beautiful antiphons are like a drum roll growing to a crescendo as the seven days bring us closer to the Christmas miracle of God made flesh, born as a babe and, with few exceptions, mostly unnoticed by mankind.

The seven titles attributed to Jesus in the antiphons are Wisdom (Sapientia in Latin), Ruler of the House of Israel (Adonai), Root of Jesse (Radix), Key of David (Clavis), Rising Dawn (Oriens), King of the Gentiles (Rex). and Emmanuel. In Latin the initials of the titles make an acrostic which, when read backwards, means: "Tomorrow I will be there" ("Ero cras"). Therefore, the Lord Jesus, whose coming we have prepared for in Advent and whom we have addressed in these seven Messianic titles, now speaks to us, and brings intensity to our Advent preparation, but bring it to a joyful conclusion. Please pick up a Praying the O'Antiphone card from the usher's after the liturgies this weekend.

3rd Sunday of Advent


In the same sentence where he reminds his listeners that he has cured the blind, the lame, the deaf, the sick, and even raised the dead, Jesus concludes by adding, "The poor have the good news proclaimed to them." How did that make the list of supernatural cures? What's so miraculous about good news? The poor are not just those in physical poverty, but those whose sins have impoverished their souls. This of course applies to us. The poverty of our own sinfulness can be overcome by the forgiveness offered to us in Christ. Because of this, we have cause to rejoice!

On this Third Sunday of Advent, Gaudete Sunday, we are encouraged to rejoice. Gaudete Sunday derives its name from the opening prayer of the Mass for this day, where we pray, "Gaudete in Domino semper" ("Rejoice in the Lord always"). So in the midst of Advent fasting and devotions, we rejoice because the time we have been preparing for is almost at hand. We pause in this season of anticipation to remember that, in truth, our hopes have already been fulfilled. He is among us, saving us even now!

For all of the weeks between now and the New Year, Corpus will be collecting food for the those in need. Our blue Just Food bags will be available during these weeks in the narthex of the church. Everyone is encouraged to pick one up and take it home with them. Then whenever you are making one of your normal or holiday stops at one of our local grocers, please pick up a few extra non-perishables and bring it to church with you on any weekend, or anytime during the week. Our friends at Just Food will be making periodic stops during these next weeks to pick up any food that we have. While traditionally there is plenty of food to go around during the days surrounding the holidays, the other days during this time can be difficult for our local pantries. Both LINK and Just Food see a rise in the numbers of people that they are helping. Our faith community has always been a strong supporter of feeding our neighbors in need. Thanks to all who have and will continue to support this great corporal work of mercy.

If you are so inclined, please consider a gift to your parish.

Corpus Christi Catholic School 2022-2023 preschool through 8th grade enrollment will open to current school families, the parish and the community on Monday, February 7th, 2022. Current school families will receive priority placement on positions until February 14th. After this date, parish and community preschool-8th grade registrations will be placed according to when the registration was received. Preschool registration requires a \$200.00 non-refundable deposit plus the first month's tuition. K-8th grade registration requires a \$200 per family, non-refundable fee at the time of registration. 1st RECONCILIATION & 1st EUCHARIST: Preparation is a 2 year program that begins with 1st Graders who are enrolled in Religious Education or Catholic School. During the 2nd year of preparation, the 2nd grade students will complete First Reconciliation and First Eucharist. Any questions can be addressed to lhulcher@cccparish.org.

CONFIRMATION: Preparation is a 2 year process that begins for 7th Graders who have been enrolled in the RE or Catholic School. The Sacrament of Confirmation will be celebrated in the Fall of their 9th Grade Year. Contact lhucher@cccparish.org.
