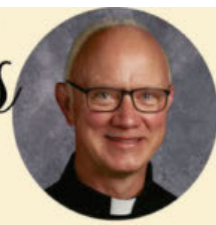

## Fr. Jerry's FORUM



### **What Are You Prophesying About in Your Life?**

As we approach the celebration of the Incarnation, our Scriptures once again speak in the voice of a prophet, who speaks God's word. Are you aware that you are a prophet? A person who is an inspired teacher or proclaimer of the will of God is a prophet, so are you that person? Once baptized, we are God's children and called to live in the life of Christ as servants of God and one another. So what inspires you to be that prophet? If your answer is nothing inspires you to a life of faith, then who is responsible to help allow that to happen? Only you — it depends on your choices and beliefs about leadership and authority in your life.

We are now focusing on the Gospel of Luke in this new liturgical year, and Luke is writing for a Gentile, non-Jewish community, from the nations, a group the Old Testament commonly assumed to lie outside the realm of God's saving activity. This Gentile evangelist therefore presents Christ as Savior for all people, especially those normally viewed and treated as marginalized or outcast, including the poor and the sick, women, sinners and Gentiles.

It is appropriate that the first reading is from the prophet Micah, one of the minor prophets. Micah looks forward to a future king who will be true to the Israelite ideal of leadership; one who rules like God, in the power of God. Further, Micah envisions this true shepherd's work as bringing peace to all, reaching "to the end of the earth" (5:3). Interestingly though, this great ruler's origin will lie in a tiny town and insignificant clan. Micah offers a theme that is common in the Old Testament: God can, and often does, use the smallest, even the most despised, to fulfill the divine plan for salvation.

Luke presents a similar understanding: his two major figures are women, who enjoyed little power or status in the culture of the first century. Even more unlikely, a young woman pregnant by far-from-normal means meets an old woman pregnant in similarly "impossible" fashion. Yet both of these women rejoice in God's Spirit at work in them for the salvation of all.

So should it surprise us that today our Catholic Church continues to proclaim and prophesy that all life is precious? Pope Francis and our Bishops continue to remind us that we should prioritize protecting the most vulnerable in our world today: the unborn, the refugee and immigrant, the poor and mentally ill, etc.

It is obvious in the Scriptures that God uses unlikely sources to carry out the divine plan. These are crazy times of the year for all of us, especially if we take to heart our call to be prophets of the ways of God. Let us not be bogged down by the way of our secular materialistic woke world, but feel the joy of Christ within us. Be open to wonder!

**Gospel Meditation**

St. Augustine tells us that a “Christian is a mind through which Christ thinks, a heart through which Christ loves, a voice through which Christ speaks and a hand through which Christ helps.” As we look around and out at the world, we do not have to search too far before we come face to face with inequity and injustice. There is so much unfairness, prejudice, anger, hatred, violence, and want. The stories of human heartache, people being hurt, deprived of life’s necessities, loneliness, and sickness are far too commonplace. For many of the world’s ills, the vices of greed, lust, pride, gluttony, and jealousy are clearly among the more significant root causes.

Why doesn’t God just step in and fix this mess? After all, God created this world, and one would hope that he would step up and take some measure of responsibility for it! Once we sit with this thinking for a while, we can begin to realize just how flawed it really is. God did take responsibility and God did fix the problem! God sent us Jesus Christ as the divine solution to the world’s ills. It is not God who has shirked responsibility, we have. We are the ones who continually fail to set our own personal needs, wants, and securities aside so that One more powerful than us can use us.

Mary had to set her needs aside in order for the Son of God to come into the world. Put simply, Mary listened and believed. Having opened herself to being an instrument of the Divine, God could use her as his mind, heart, voice, and hand. She became God’s vessel so that God’s greatness could reach the ends of the earth and peace could come upon the world. God’s fix for the world’s difficulties is you and me. We are the ones who confess that Jesus Christ came into the world as the Son of God, the Prince of Peace, and herald of justice. All we have to do is believe, as did Mary, that what has been spoken to us by the Lord will be fulfilled. Then, we can step aside and be the Christians we claim to be. What a difference it would make if every person who professed to be Christian truly understood that their one and only vocation is to be God’s instrument. What a beautiful, equitable, and just world it would be.

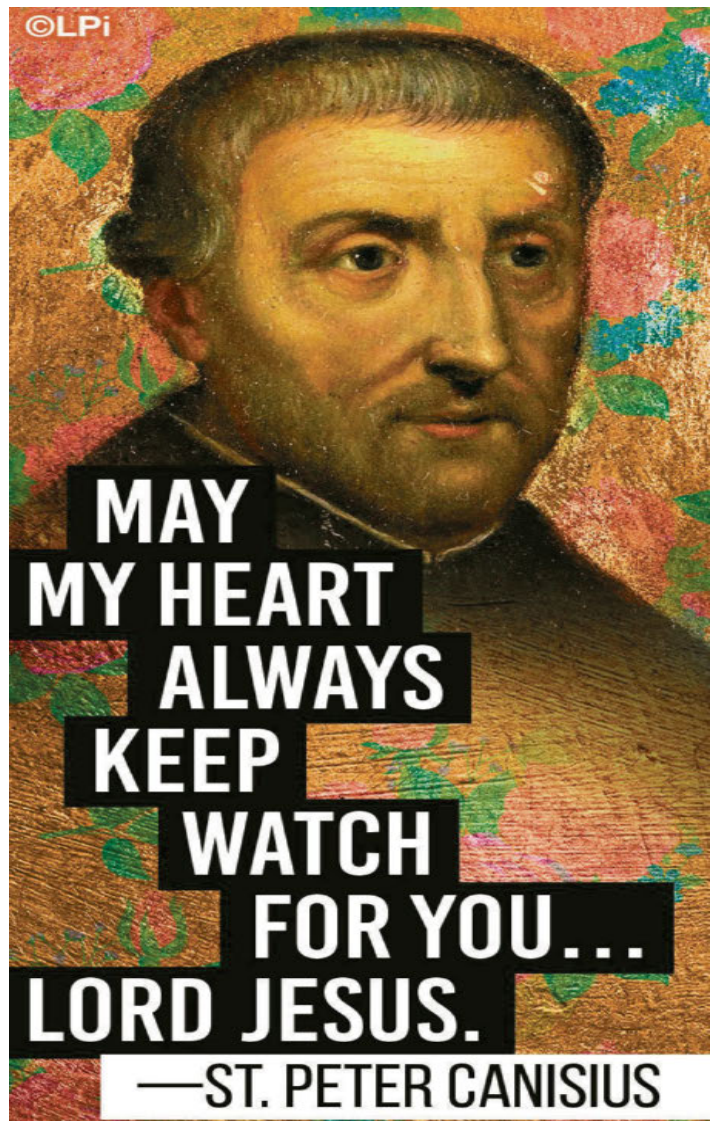
**Year End Charitable Giving Statements**

## Year-End Gifts and Charitable Giving in 2021

On December 27, 2020, another stimulus package was signed into law to help combat the far-reaching impacts of COVID-19. In many ways, this bill extends the charitable tax incentives enacted by the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act back in March 2020, but it also provides some additional provisions.

### Are you itemizing deductions?

The adjusted gross income (AGI) limit for cash contributions to qualifying public charities remains increased for individual donors. For cash contributions made in 2021, you can elect to deduct up to 100 percent of your AGI (formerly 60 percent prior to the CARES Act).

### Not itemizing?

The CARES Act allowed for an additional, “above-the-line” deduction for charitable gifts made in cash of up to \$300. This provision is extended into 2021 for taxpayers filing single/separately.

New in 2021 is an additional “above-the-line” deduction for those married filing jointly. Joint filers (who aren’t itemizing) will be allowed to take an above-the-line deduction of up to \$600 in cash contributions to charity this year.

What about IRA Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCD)?

The CARES Act did not change the rules around the QCD, which allows individuals over 70½ years old to donate up to \$100,000 in IRA assets directly to charity<sup>1</sup> annually, without taking the distribution into taxable income.

However, remember that under the CARES Act an individual can elect to deduct 100 percent of their AGI for cash charitable contributions. This effectively affords individuals over 59½ years old the benefits similar to a QCD; they can take a cash distribution from their IRA, contribute the cash to charity, and may completely offset tax attributable to the distribution by taking a charitable deduction in an amount up to 100 percent of their AGI for the tax year.

If you’re planning a large donation in 2021, this may be a smart strategy as long as you are between the ages of 59½ and 70½ and are not dependent on existing retirement funds.

Gospel Reflection 12/19/2021

## After Our Mother’s Own Heart

Our Blessed Mother takes center stage on this fourth Sunday of Advent, and fittingly so as we draw near to the celebration of her Son’s birth. After our Lord Himself, Mary is our model and guide to a stewardship way of life. We see her steward’s response in every passage of Scripture that relates to her, from her “yes” at the Annunciation, to her faithfulness at the foot of the Cross.

Mary’s response to the angel Gabriel in our “Alleluia” today captures her stewardship spirit: “Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word (Lk 1:38).” At the moment of the Annunciation, Mary recognized God’s gift to her and made a generous and trusting return to Him, offering her very self to God as His servant. This reply to such an overwhelming request — made by an angel, no less — shows us how extraordinary our Blessed Mother is. She is indeed “full of grace.”

But her response also displays the depth with which she possessed two of the pillars of stewardship: Formation and Prayer. Because of her formation (in her own Jewish faith) she knew that a Messiah had long been prophesied and promised to her people. Because of her intimacy with God in prayer, she was ready to offer her “yes” to Him when asked to be mother of this Messiah.

Today’s Gospel passage, also from Luke, goes on to describe Mary’s actions immediately after her “yes” to the angel Gabriel’s message. We read that “Mary set out and traveled to the hill country in haste to a town of Judah... and greeted Elizabeth.” Mary immediately begins to think of others before herself, setting out quickly to be with her cousin, modeling two other of the pillars of stewardship: Hospitality and Service. What warmth and humility the Mother of our Savior shows, traveling to Elizabeth to spend time with her, rejoicing with Elizabeth over her own incredible pregnancy, and assisting her in a time of need. And what joy this hospitality and service bring to Elizabeth who exclaims, “how does this happen to me, that the mother of my Lord should come to me? For at the moment the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the infant in my womb leaped for joy.”

How beautifully our Blessed Mother models the mind and heart of a steward. It is an example that we, her children and the Body of Christ here in Lawrence, can follow in our own lives 2,000 years later. With all the gifts God gives us — our time, our talents, our material possessions — we, too, can offer ourselves to God by using all these gifts to serve and glorify Him. In so doing, we will effectively spread the Good News of the Gospel to the world around us today. We will be stewards after our Mother’s own heart.

## 2022-2023 Enrollment Information

Corpus Christi Catholic School 2022-2023 preschool through 8<sup>th</sup> grade enrollment will open to current school families, the parish and the community on Monday, February 7<sup>th</sup>, 2022. Current school families will receive priority placement on positions until February 14<sup>th</sup>. After this date, parish and community preschool-8<sup>th</sup> grade registrations will be placed according to when the registration was received. Preschool registration requires a \$200.00 non-refundable deposit plus the first month's tuition.
