



A God for All Peoples

Through the centuries, a variety of interesting legends have grown around this feast of the Epiphany. Although the magi from the east are not named, described or numbered in the scriptures, most legends agree that there were three of them. One particular legend, told to world explorer Marco Polo on a trip to Persia (Iran), seems to describe Balthazar as the youngest of the magi, Caspar in the middle, and Melchior as the oldest (*The Description of the World, 1298*). In this legend, when the three travelers arrive in Bethlehem, each goes separately into the cave to visit the one they seek, and encounters no one there but a man his own age. Later, the magi take their gifts and go back to the cave together. When they enter, they find inside only a 13-day-old infant.

The Persian legend does not go into detail about their conversations, but we can imagine what the three travelers might have talked about with that man in the cave. Perhaps when young Balthazar entered, he met a young prophet with whom he shared his thoughts on reform and promise. Caspar met a middle-aged teacher with whom he talked passionately about leadership and responsibility. When Melchior entered, he saw an old man like himself, with whom he was quite at ease, and they shared memories of days gone by.

Jesus understands and speaks to every human being at every stage of life. Those with the maturity of old age hear the call to integrity and wisdom. The middle-aged hear the call to responsibility and service. The young hear the call to find their way toward intimacy with God and to find the unique identity that will shape and direct their lives.

And you? Who do you meet as you come bearing the gift of yourself to offer to God? In a few weeks, we will be asking everyone in our parish to pray about all of their God-given gifts; their gift of time, their talents and life itself in order to ask you to share what you have been given by God. To know who God is to you at this stage of your life, is also to know what God is calling you to give. No matter what we believe God to be or how we relate to God, the consistent invitation that God has always given is that we should give back; give some of what we have to help others and help the Church to grow.

To what is God calling you? How will you use the gift of the new year that lies ahead? Like the magi of old, we too are on a journey, searching at every juncture along the way for some manifestation of God and of grace.

The Epiphany of the Lord

In his Apostolic Exhortation, The Joy of the Gospel, Pope Francis references a thought from Pope Benedict XVI: "Being a Christian is not the result of an ethical choice or a lofty idea, but the encounter with an event, a person, which gives life a new horizon and a decisive direction." Today we celebrate an encounter with the Person of Jesus Christ! This simple but holy event in time dramatically changes human life, pointing it toward a new horizon and giving it a decisive direction. This is a message and truth that is not meant to be shared with only a select few who qualify but with the entire world. Pope Francis continues saying, "Thanks solely to this encounter or renewed encounter with God's love, which blossoms into an enriching friendship, we are liberated from our narrowness and self-absorption. We become fully human when we become more than human, when we let God bring us beyond ourselves in order to attain the fullest truth of our being."

Look around at people. Where is life heading for them? What gives them direction? Even we who are people of faith can get distracted and lose our focus. God, in all of His fullness, is revealed in Jesus Christ and we can encounter Him! God is tangible, real, vulnerable, poor, and full of wonders, surprises, and opportunities. For those who are struggling and lost, today is a day of great joy. All they have to do is reach out and touch the truth of Christ. This presence is revealed in the poor, exploited, and vulnerable ones who cry out for compassion and love. But it is also found in the faithful ones who see in the Epiphany of God a liberation from structures and systems that hurt us, a narrowness of mind and heart that constricts us, and an absorption in our self-agenda that prevents us from seeing anything other than ourselves as important.

We have been given the charge of preaching this Good News. If only we could find a way to be more effective, it might stand a chance of doing what God intended it to do. There is always tomorrow and our memory of that bright new light that shone so brilliantly that Bethlehem night pointing us to truth and reminding us that we are loved. ©LPi

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton

The patron saint of Catholic schools, St. Elizabeth Ann Seton (August 28, 1774 – January 4, 1821) was born in New York City to a prominent family of the Episcopal faith. When she turned 19, she married a wealthy businessman with whom she had five children. He later died of tuberculosis in 1803, leaving her a young widow. After discovering the Catholic faith in Italy, where her husband had died, she returned to New York and converted to Catholicism in 1805.

After several years struggling as a single mother, Elizabeth moved in 1809 to Emmitsburg, Maryland, where she founded the Sisters of Charity of St. Joseph, the first community for religious women established in the United States. She also began St. Joseph's Academy and Free School, which started a chain reaction of Catholic-based education in the United States that continues today. St. Elizabeth Ann Seton was canonized September 14, 1975 in St. Peter's Square by Pope Paul VI and was the first citizen born in the United States to be given the title of "saint." ©LPi




Welcome Weekend



CALL TO SHARE

Archbishop's Annual Call to Share is Coming Soon

The Archbishop's Call to Share (ACTS) in the Archdiocese of Kansas City in Kansas was initiated by Archbishop Strecker as a response to Vatican II: to engage more fully the Catholic faithful in the evangelical mission of the Church. The ACTS has grown to become a lifeline for more than 40 specific ministries, services and agencies provided by the Archdiocese.

The ministries supported by the ACTS fall into the Archbdiocesan's five pastoral priorities: Conversion, Evangelization, Education, Outreach, and

Stewardship. For a large number of these ministries, the *Archbishop's Call to Share* is their sole source of funding. Some of these ministries attend to needs beyond the scope of individual parishes, and some exist for the sole purpose of assisting parishes in their mission to teach, evangelize and provide good liturgical experiences.

The ACTS annual campaign returns under the leadership of Archbishop Joseph F. Naumann. The Archbishop's Call to Share is the annual coming together as one united community of the Catholic Church of Northeast Kansas. The theme for ACTS 2022 is "Shout for Joy."

Archbishop Naumann asks that every parish make a good faith effort. Next weekend, we will be playing audio from Archbishop Naumann, in which he himself invites us all to participate in the work of the Archdiocese.

The Epiphany & Our Stewardship

Today we celebrate the Epiphany of the Lord. Epiphany comes from a Greek verb meaning "to reveal," and all of the various events celebrated by the Feast of the Epiphany are revelations of Christ to all humankind. Epiphany is traditionally and actually on January 6, but a number of years ago the Bishops in the United States moved it to the Sunday that falls between January 2 and 8.

Of course, our readings on this solemnity all refer to the Epiphany as we know it — the time that the divinity of Jesus was revealed, made manifest, to the entire world, not just Israel and the Jewish people. The world is represented by the three magi — the "wise men" as most of us know them. They came from the east and were, like most of us, Gentiles.

In the First Reading from Isaiah the prophet speaks of what will happen centuries later after the birth of Christ. There are two strong references to the story of the Magi with which we are so familiar. Isaiah declares, "Your light has come, the glory of the Lord shines upon you." We often speak of the Light of Christ, and often He is portrayed in art sort of glowing or with a light on His face. In addition, we have the light of the star which led the Magi to Him so they could worship Him. The images we have of them are influenced by Isaiah, when he says, "Caravans of camels shall fill you, dromedaries from Midian and Ephah; all from Sheba shall come bearing gold and frankincense, and proclaiming the praises of the Lord."

Therefore, today we celebrate receiving God's light. But there is more to it than that. The First Reading opens with "Rise up in splendor...Your light has come." We are to do more than just receive the light. We are to share it and reflect it. In our terms it is as if the Lord said, "Rise and shine; your light has come." That is what we mean when we say we are called. We are called to be disciples and to be the Light of Christ for those around us.

In his letter to the Ephesians, our Second Reading, St. Paul speaks of the revelations which this day represents. Paul points out that it had been revealed to us; a revelation is an epiphany. What is revealed? Exactly what Isaiah speaks of in the fact that Christ and His Divinity are revealed to the whole world. And what is the key to this revelation? The fact that "the Gentiles are coheirs, members of the same body, and copartners in the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel."

Paul also says in relation to the divinity of the Lord, "the mystery was made known to me by revelation." We need to appreciate that what we translate as "mystery" is from the Greek word, mysterion, used by Paul. For us a mystery may represent something dark or obscure or incomprehensible. However, that is not the meaning of mysterion. It is more accurately translated as a now-open secret, something originally hidden, but now revealed by God.

There are certain passages in Holy Scripture almost universally known, and certainly well known to even a lukewarm Christian. The story of the Magi, the wise men or the three kings, falls into that category. As Matthew shares it in today's Gospel, they were "magi from the east." At no time does Matthew tell us there were three of them nor does he indicate that they are kings. Most likely, according to scholars, they were astronomers or astrologers, thus their knowledge of and fascination with the star which led them. Who they were and how many of them there were is not important. What is important is that they represent all of us, and their actions suggest to us how we need to respond to Jesus Christ and what He is and represents.

Holy Scripture is filled with subtleties we sometimes miss. Matthew tells us that "on entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother." Joseph is evidently not present, and there is a reason for that. He was not, as we know, the true father to Jesus. They presented gifts to Jesus, not to His mother or His parents. When we give to Jesus today, we do not do it directly, but to the Lord's people through the parish and other charities.

Finally, these visitors worshiped the Lord ("They prostrated themselves and did him homage"). We, too, need to worship the Lord; we, too, need to acknowledge His holiness and His kingship. Worshiping is more important than the gifts, but we are reminded in this Gospel that both are significant.


