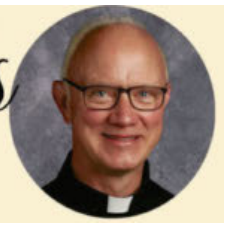

Why Baptism?

We conclude our Christmas season today with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. And many will ask, “Why was Jesus baptized?” After all, if he is sinless, and according to scripture (Mark 1:4), John administered baptism for “repentance for the forgiveness of sins.”

Christian baptism is greater than John’s baptism, as Jesus himself is greater than John. Our baptism not only forgives sins, but infuses the life of God into the soul, making us God’s children. The origin of our baptism is the baptism of Jesus. Jesus sanctified the waters by His descent into them.

Pope Benedict XVI wrote a whole chapter on this in *Jesus of Nazareth*. He reminds us that in antiquity, water conjured up two distinct images: life and death. On the one hand, immersion into the waters is a symbol of death, which recalls the destructive powers of the great flood, but the flowing waters of the river are a symbol of life.

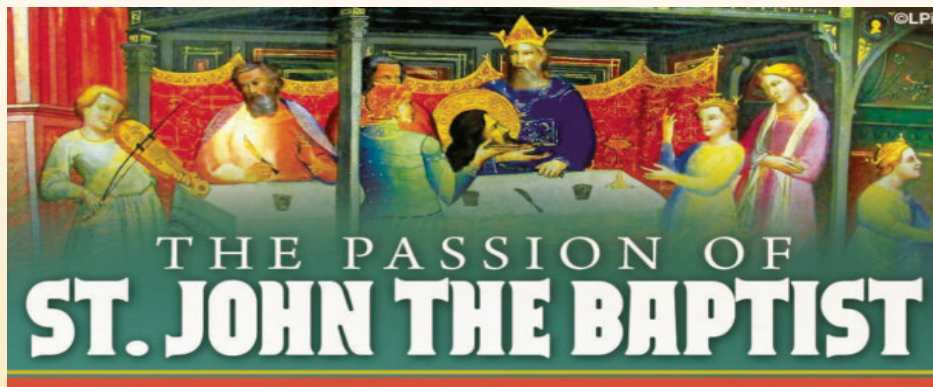
Even the physical act of baptism, especially if done by immersion, represents death and new life: the descent into the waters is a form of death and burial; the rising to a new life is an image of resurrection.

The placement of our font at Corpus Christi is symbolic of our entry into the Church. The dome above our font symbolizes the womb as a sign of our being born in Christ in baptism and becoming children of God. The font and the dome above are both eight-sided, symbolizing the 8th day when God’s entire work of creation was completed. The 8th day is when Christ rose from the dead completing the work of redemption. We are on the 8th day once baptized.

Are you aware of the eight panels that make up the base of our font? You might spend some time examining them and trying to guess the stories from scripture that each represents as they are key symbols of baptism and redemption. The image of hands, consistent with those in our Stations of the Cross, depict the actual work it takes to be redeemed. Some of the images on these panels represent: Noah and the flood; Moses striking the rock for water; Jesus’ baptism; the raising of Lazarus; and the woman at the well. Take a look at the beauty of our font.

Baptism begins our formation into the Christian life, and it calls us into action. After each baptism, the new Christian is sealed with the oil of Chrism and the minister of the Sacrament says “He now anoints you with the Chrism of salvation, so that you may remain members of Christ, Priest, Prophet and King.” So each of the baptized is called to put the grace received into action by living a Stewardship way of life. Let us all renew our baptismal promises this day by committing ourselves again to Christ.

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN OUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

I Hope I Am Like Him

“Who is this Christ? Is he like you?”

Perhaps you’ve heard this story, often attributed to the life of St. Teresa of Calcutta. A sick man asked her this question, as he marveled at her tireless service to himself and others in the name of someone named Jesus Christ.

“He is nothing like me,” the saint is said to have answered. “But I hope I am like him.”

Though the authenticity of this exchange cannot be verified, its message rings perfectly true: all the value of our stewardship lies in its relativity to the one in whose name we perform it.

Consider the figure of John the Baptist — a magnificent, towering character even purely from a literary or historical perspective. A martyr who fed on wild locusts and boldly spoke truth to power — a man so great some mistook him for the Messiah.

But why is he great? Because he prepared the way. All his accomplishments and escapades mean nothing if they are taken out of the context of salvation history. He only makes sense relative to Christ — and this is exactly as he wanted it. “One worthier than I is coming,” he insists. And because of that humility and that total embrace of God’s will, he is given one of the greatest honors in the New Testament — he baptizes the Son of God.

Let’s examine our lives in the light of their relativity to Christ. How do we prepare the way? When Christ comes to us, what do we do? How do we leave ourselves open to be actors in God’s plan?

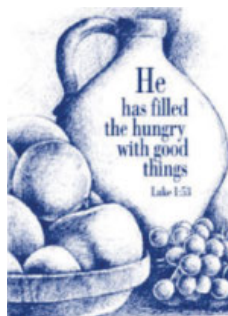
GriefShare

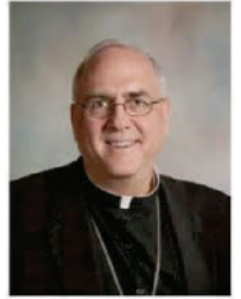

ARCHBISHOP NAUMANN'S ANNUAL APPEAL HOMILY

I. NOT WORTHY TO LOOSEN THE THONGS OF HIS SANDALS

In the preface for today's Mass, the celebrant prays: **"For in the waters of the Jordan you revealed with signs and wonders a new Baptism, so that through the voice that came down from heaven we might come to believe in your Word dwelling among us, and by the Spirit descending like a dove we might know Christ your Servant has been anointed with the oil of gladness and sent to bring good news to the poor."**



John the Baptist, a great prophet and preacher, is drawing tremendous crowds to repent from their sins and to be baptized in the muddy waters of the Jordan. The people are excited by the possibility that John might be the long awaited Messiah. John immediately squelches the rumors that suggest he is the fulfillment of Jewish Messianic dreams.

Instead, John prophesies that the actual Messiah is so much more impressive and powerful, and that the Baptist is not even worthy to do the task of a slave, loosening the sandal thongs of the Christ's dusty feet. Luke's Gospel describes Our Lord in prayer after being baptized by John, when the Holy Spirit descends upon Him, and the voice of the Father declares Jesus to be His Beloved Son.

II. RECIPIENTS OF FIRE AND THE HOLY SPIRIT

You and I have been blest beyond what our minds could imagine to be recipients of this New Baptism about which John had prophesied – a Baptism not only capable of cleansing and liberating us from the mud and grime of this sin fractured world but actually imparting to us the very life of God and making us temples of the Holy Spirit. Through the waters of Baptism, Jesus gave us His life and made us beloved adopted daughters and sons of our Heavenly Father. We have been baptized with Fire and the Holy Spirit, empowering us to continue the mission of Jesus to bring good news to the poor.

Through Jesus the Christ, the Anointed One, we have been anointed with the Oil of Gladness to proclaim the Joy of His Gospel to a sin saddened and despairing world.

III. HERALDS OF THE GOOD NEWS

It is our privilege as well as our responsibility to proclaim the Joy of the Gospel of Jesus. As Christians, we believe in a God who loves us despite our sin and disloyalty. We believe in a God who pursues us and loves us even in our weakness and unworthiness. We believe in a God who desires to cleanse us from the filth and muck of sin and to place rings on our fingers and clothe us with the cloak of gladness, the protective shield of His love. As beloved daughters and sons of the King, we are on a mission to infect the world with the Joy of God's love.

The world offers us many pleasures but is incapable of providing us with authentic Joy. Pleasures addict and enslave us. They leave us empty and unsatisfied, always craving more.

Jesus instead gives us the Joy of experiencing God's love for us. This Joy is not dependent on material things and the external circumstances of our lives. The source of the Joy of Jesus is the truth of our identity as princesses and princes of the King of Heaven.

IV. THE EXAMPLE OF FATHER EMIL KAPAUN

Recently, the mortal remains of Father Emil Kapaun were discovered and brought home to Kansas. He grew up in Pilsen, Kansas and was a priest of the Diocese of Wichita. Chaplain Kapaun died in the 1950's in a prisoner of war camp in Korea. Father Kapaun posthumously received from our nation the Medal of Honor, and his cause for canonization is underway.

When the Korean War ended, the liberating forces noticed that there was something different about the survivors of the prisoner of war camp where Father Kapaun died. They had a hope about them and a spirit of camaraderie unlike what they had witnessed in the survivors of other camps.

When questioned about the source of this spirit of hope and concern for one another, the survivors attributed their unusual *esprit de corps* to their Chaplain, Father Kapaun. By his example, Father Kapaun taught his fellow prisoners that they were still free. Even in the harsh circumstances of the camp, they were still free to love and praise God. They were still free to care for and support each other. They were still free to love even their enemies, the guards who treated them at times with merciless cruelty.

V. THE JOY THAT OVERCOMES AND ENDURES

Jesus never sinned. So why did he get baptized?

To be close to us. Instead of the waters cleansing Jesus from original sin, we can think of Jesus's submersion into the river Jordan as *Him* baptizing *the water*. By taking part in this ritual, Jesus elevates it. He raises it to the level of a sacrament, a moment when we know that He will be present, through which we can encounter Him. That's what happened when each of us were baptized. We became Christ's brothers and sisters.

And if we're joined to Jesus in baptism, then what he hears after coming ashore also applies to us: "You are my beloved son; with you I am well pleased." Through baptism, we become sons and daughters of God. This is our true identity!

Reminding ourselves of this identity—for instance, when we make the sign of the cross with Holy Water—transforms the way we live. If God is Our Father, it means our life is a gift. And it means He's inviting us into his work of generosity and love. How does this change the way we think about helping our parish community? About volunteering our time and talents? About supporting the *Archbishop's Call to Share* appeal? Pray about it and see!

Corpus Christi Catholic School 2022-2023 preschool through 8th grade enrollment will open to current school families, the parish and the community on Monday, February 7th, 2022. After this date, parish and community preschool-8th grade registrations will be placed according to when the registration was received.
