Participating in the Entire Feast and Appreciating the Silence

We begin ordinary time this weekend with the first miracle of Jesus – the wedding feast of Cana. It is meaningful in many ways, but has significance for the celebration of the Eucharist.

Every Sunday, we are invited and gather to celebrate the feast God has prepared for us, and it connects us with the wedding feast, the last supper, and the heavenly banquet. God invites us to participate in the entire banquet. There are no words that can adequately express the mystery of God, and everything we might try to put into words will fall short. So there needs to be time for quiet and silence so that we may sense God's presence even more deeply than in sound.

At designated times of the Mass, we fall silent to offer prayers, to reflect on the Scripture, or to thank God for the Eucharist. But "even before the celebration itself, it is commendable that silence be observed in the church, in the sacristy, in the vesting room, and in adjacent areas, so that all may dispose themselves to carry out the sacred action in a devout and fitting manner" (General Instruction of the Roman Missal 45).

Many sounds precede Mass. At home and in the car, you may have the tv or radio on, or you may be conversing with family or texting about many things. Some of these may interrupt your preparation or cause you to be delayed to arrive at church on time. It is virtuous to make stronger attempts to arrive not only on time before Mass begins, but to arrive early. At times, there might be a communal praying of the rosary, or the musicians might play a prelude or rehearse with the community. All of these can assist us to be prepared for the Eucharist.

But some time of silence beforehand helps everyone enter the Mass devoutly. In silent prayer, we think about the role we are to play, the songs we will sing, the prayers we will offer, the Scriptures we will hear, the sacrifice we will make, the service we give to our neighbor, and the presence of Jesus Christ, who comes to us in sacrament to nourish us at this Mass and throughout the week. His holiness should render us speechless.

Finally, as so many find it difficult to be silent and would rather spew negative and critical words consider this:

"A judicious silence is always better than truth spoken without charity." – St. Francis de Sales



RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS - It Takes All Kinds

"If every flower wanted to be a rose," wrote St. Therese of Lisieux, "spring would lose its loveliness."

Who is God asking you to be today? There is an obvious answer that springs to mind right out of the gate. God wants me to be a good person (a good father, a good husband) today; today, God wants me to be a saint.

But this answer fails to get to the heart of the question. We are all striving today to serve the same Spirit, but we are given different gifts to do so. The one who has the gift of knowledge may fail if today he decides he wants to be a healer. The one who has the gift of "varieties of tongues" might falter in the expression of wisdom.

Think about the wedding at Cana and the players in the scene: the servers, the guests, the bride and groom. They all have a unique role to play, and though it is to the servers that Mary gives the instruction, "Do whatever he tells you," her words apply to all.

Today, are we called to be the servers — do we wait on God's instruction and carry it out, no matter how foolish or impossible it may seem to our human ears? Are we asked to be the disciples, to bear witness to a miracle and to give our testimony? Are we called to imitate the Blessed Mother herself and give encouragement to follow God's word?

Let us examine our gifts and listen in the silence of our hearts to the direction of the Spirit. Then and only then, let us do whatever He tells us.

ARCHBISHOP NAUMANN'S ANNUAL APPEAL HOMILY

I. NOT WORTHY TO LOOSEN THE THONGS OF HIS SANDALS

In the preface for today's Mass, the celebrant prays: "For in the waters of the Jordan you revealed with signs and wonders a new Baptism, so that through the voice that came down from heaven we might come to believe in your Word dwelling among us, and by the Spirit descending like a dove we might know Christ your Servant has been anointed with the oil of gladness and sent to bring good news to the poor."

John the Baptist, a great prophet and preacher, is drawing tremendous crowds to repent from their sins and to be baptized in the muddy waters of the Jordan. The people are excited by the possibility that John might be the long awaited Messiah. John immediately squelches the rumors that suggest he is the fulfillment of Jewish Messianic dreams.

Instead, John prophesies that the actual Messiah is so much more impressive and powerful, and that the Baptist is not even worthy to do the task of a slave, loosening the sandal thongs of the Christ's dusty feet. Luke's Gospel describes Our Lord in prayer after being baptized by John, when the Holy Spirit descends upon Him, and the voice of the Father declares Jesus to be His Beloved Son.

II . RECIPIENTS OF FIRE AND THE HOLY SPIRIT

You and I have been blest beyond what our minds could imagine to be recipients of this New Baptism about which John had prophesied – a Baptism not only capable of cleansing and liberating us from the mud and grime of this sin fractured world but actually imparting to us the very life of God and making us temples of the Holy Spirit. Through the waters of Baptism, Jesus gave us His life and made us beloved adopted daughters and sons of our Heavenly Father. We have been baptized with Fire and the Holy Spirit, empowering us to continue the mission of Jesus to bring good news to the poor.

Through Jesus the Christ, the Anointed One, we have been anointed with the Oil of Gladness to proclaim the Joy of His Gospel to a sin saddened and despairing world.

III. HERALDS OF THE GOOD NEWS

It is our privilege as well as our responsibility to proclaim the Joy of the Gospel of Jesus. As Christians, we believe in a God who loves us despite our sin and disloyalty. We believe in a God who pursues us and loves us even in our weakness and unworthiness. We believe in a God who desires to cleanse us from the filth and muck of sin and to place rings on our fingers and clothe us with the cloak of gladness, the protective shield of His love. As beloved daughters and sons of the King, we are on a mission to infect the world with the Joy of God's love.

The world offers us many pleasures but is incapable of providing us with authentic Joy. Pleasures addict and enslave us. They leave us empty and unsatisfied, always craving more.

Jesus instead gives us the Joy of experiencing God's love for us. This Joy is not dependent on material things and the external circumstances of our lives. The source of the Joy of Jesus is the truth of our identity as princesses and princes of the King of Heaven.

IV .THE EXAMPLE OF FATHER EMIL KAPAUN

Recently, the mortal remains of Father Emil Kapaun were discovered and brought home to Kansas. He grew up in Pilsen, Kansas and was a priest of the Diocese of Wichita. Chaplain Kapaun died in the 1950's in a prisoner of war camp in Korea. Father Kapaun posthumously received from our nation the Medal of Honor, and his cause for canonization is underway.

When the Korean War ended, the liberating forces noticed that there was something different about the survivors of the prisoner of war camp where Father Kapaun died. They had a hope about them and a spirit of camaraderie unlike what they had witnessed in the survivors of other camps.

When questioned about the source of this spirit of hope and concern for one another, the survivors attributed their unusual esprit de corps to their Chaplain, Father Kapaun. By his example, Father Kapaun taught his fellow prisoners that they were still free. Even in the harsh circumstances of the camp, they were still free to love and praise God. They were still free to care for and support each other. They were still free to love even their enemies, the guards who treated them at times with merciless cruelty.

V. THE JOY THAT OVERCOMES AND ENDURES

This is the Joy that our Catholic Faith offers us. A joy that the world cannot give nor can it steal from us. A joy that is not dependent on the external circumstances of our lives but is the fruit of our identity as beloved sons and daughters of the Heavenly King. It is a Joy that we can still experience in a prisoner of war camp or in the midst of life's normal adversities or even during the perils of a pandemic.

VI. Call to Share - Shouting our Joy

Each year at this time, I invite you to participate in the annual *Call to Share* campaign that funds so many of our pastoral, educational and charitable ministries. This is truly a Catholic moment when we pool our resources, from Marysville to Atchison from Wamego to Topeka from Lawrence to Kansas City from Overland Park to Emporia, in order to do something truly beautiful together that none of us individually or no single parish can do on its own.

Your gift to *Call to Share* helps fund the formation of our heroic Catholic School teachers, the youth camps at Prairies Star Ranch, the Catholic Education Fund's efforts to provide scholarships to students, Catholic Charities resettlement of refugees from Afghanistan, the provision of food, energy and housing for those adversely affected by the pandemic, marriage prep for engaged couples, enrichment experiences for those already married, financial, medical and emotional support for those with a difficult pregnancy, exceptional care for the elderly at Villa St. Francis and so much more.

Your sacrificial gift to *Call to Share* is one of the ways that we make tangible the love of Jesus and proclaim the Joy of His Gospel. Each year, this is a moment when the goodness of our Catholic Community shines brightly, bringing hope and help to thousands. I ask you to pray over this invitation to support generously *Call to Share* and give what the Holy Spirit inspires you to give.

VII. SET THE WORLD ON FIRE

St. Catherine of Siena said: "Be who God meant you to be and you will set the world on fire." God desires each of us to be His Beloved Sons and Daughters. If we live our identity as Princesses and Princes of the Heavenly King, we will again this year set the world on fire with God's love and shout out boldly the Joy of His Gospel.

Jesus never sinned. So why did he get baptized?

To be close to us. Instead of the waters cleansing Jesus from original sin, we can think of Jesus's submersion into the river Jordan as *Him* baptizing the water. By taking part in this ritual, Jesus elevates it. He raises it to the level of a sacrament, a moment when we know that He will be present, through which we can encounter Him. That's what happened when each of us were baptized. We became Christ's brothers and sisters.

And if we're joined to Jesus in baptism, then what he hears after coming ashore also applies to us: "You are my beloved son; with you I am well pleased." Through baptism, we become sons and daughters of God. This is our true identity!

Reminding ourselves of this identity—for instance, when we make the sign of the cross with Holy Water—transforms the way we live. If God is Our Father, it means our life is a gift. And it means He's inviting us into his work of generosity and love. How does this change the way we think about helping our parish community? About volunteering our time and talents? About supporting the Archbishop's Call to Share appeal? Pray about it and see!


