LENTEN REFLECTION

Question:

Why do Catholics eat fish on Friday?



Answer:

For centuries, meatless Fridays were the norm for Catholics throughout the world. Friday was chosen because that was the day on which Jesus died, and Christians wanted to find a way to honor that day with special prayers and acts of penance and self-denial. The practice of abstaining from meat on Fridays — under pain of sin — grew out of that desire, and it became an official part of Church teaching until the time of the Second Vatican Council.

In the 1960s, there was a shift in the Church's thinking, in large part because there was a recognition that differences in cultures and economic realities meant that eating or not eating meat had different meanings for different peoples. For example, in cultures that were largely dependent on seafood or a vegetarian diet, abstaining from meat was no sacrifice at all. While in other places, eating fish and other kinds of seafood was actually something rare and special and not a sacrifice. This was all part of a basic reflection on "why we do what we do" among the Church's pastors.

All are welcome to join us as we pray for all consecrated religious and Today, Catholics throughout the world are still instructed to abstain from meat on the Fridays of Lent. The bishops of some countries, such as in England and Wales, ask Catholics to abstain from meat every Friday, continuing the older tradition. The Bishops of the United States have taken a slightly

different approach, encouraging Catholics to honor Friday as a special day by abstaining from meat every Friday or by taking on some other work of penance or charity for the sake of others.

Regardless of what we choose to do, the real value in all of this is to see a reflection of Good Friday in each Friday, to remember the self-giving love of Jesus, and to honor that love through some sort of sacrifice or act of mercy.



From the Desk of Fr. McNea

I hope that these days of Lent have been blessed ones for you. If you have struggled to get into a Lenten discipline, there is still time. Don't give up hope! The Lord has many graces to share with you.

I thank those who participated in the Monthly Holy Hour last Saturday. Each month this Holy Hour will be offered for Americans, Our Country, and Our Church. Typically this Holy Hour will be prayed on the first Saturday of the month. April will be an exception this year, since the First Saturday is also Holy Saturday. This Holy Hour will be prayed on April 10 instead. I am particularly grateful to Kathy Foerster for coordinating this holy hour and for putting together the prayer packets that are used.

It is wonderful to have more and more people coming to our parish Masses. As a friendly reminder, please remember our protocol of signing up for the Mass you will be attending. You can do this online or by calling the parish office. If you are attending Mass at St. Casimir, that signup is also now online or through the parish office. However, you need to do so by 12 Noon of the day before the Mass. For the Sunday and Monday Masses, you need to do so by 12 Noon of the Friday before those Masses. Calling or going online, after these deadlines, does not put you on the list. Thank you for your attentiveness and cooperation.

This year, we will be able to gather in person for the Triduum and Easter Sunday. The schedule for these liturgies will be the same as in the past. The Mass of the Lord's Supper, on Holy Thursday, will be celebrated at the Cathedral at 7:00pm. The Celebration of the Lord's Passion, on Good Friday, will be at 12 Noon at the Cathedral and 5:15pm at St. Casimir. The Easter Vigil will be at 8:00pm at the Cathedral. Easter Sunday will have Masses at 7:00am (Cathedral), 9:00am (St. Casimir), and 10:30am (Cathedral). The Cathedral liturgies will be live-streamed.



WEEKLY REFLECTION

Today's Psalm 137, is a psalm of lament. In a profound way it expresses the heartfelt despair of the Jewish people whose beloved city and temple in Jerusalem were completely destroyed by the Babylonians and the inhabitants that survived were marched off to Babylon as prisoners. In laying our hearts next to theirs we can feel their deep pain and sorrow and recognize their repentance for this happened by their own doing. They were to blame because of their short sightedness and rejection of God. Their pain is so intense that they cannot even make merry by singing so they, as the psalmist writes, hang their harps on the aspens along the streams of Babylon. In the first reading we hear that at this low point, at a time of complete darkness, a light shines in upon their despair in a most unlikely way through the decree of the Persian King Cyrus which allows them to return to Jerusalem to rebuild the city and temple after being in captivity in Babylon for 70 years. God saves them in his mercy. In the second reading Paul reminds us that our God is "rich in mercy" and chooses to save because of God's love for us even when our lives do not reflect that love. God chooses to save us by his grace, a free gift. Today's Gospel picks up on this theme of God's mercy. For God sent, not a worldly king like Cyrus, but his only son to bring about the redemption of the whole world. "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life." Even into this darkness God sent a light in the person of Jesus the Christ. We have to decide if we prefer the darkness or the light, for in the light truth reigns over evil. It is in living in the truth that light comes to its fullest brightness. In your darkest moment what light did God allow to shine in to bring you hope? This free gift of faith is like a computer program that comes with a Username: God's Mercy and Grace and Password: Jesus Christ. If we download this "program" into our way of life the result will be that God's infinite mercy and love will be opened to us to use as the mainframe for our life. A life lived in the light of Christ which no malware can block or corrupt.


