

From the Desk of Fr. McNea

In our Catholic spiritual tradition, every month of the calendar year is dedicated to a particular aspect of Jesus, the Blessed Virgin Mary, or the saints. This month of January is dedicated to the Holy Name of Jesus. In fact, there is a memorial

celebration of the Holy Name of Jesus on January 3. Pope St. John Paul II, in 2002, reinstituted this memorial to be celebrated throughout the Universal Church. Reverence for the Name of God goes back to the Ten Commandments, as given to Moses. Exodus 20:7 tells us: "You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain; for the Lord will not hold him guiltless who takes his name in vain" (RSV-Catholic Edition). In the Our Father, as given to us by Jesus, we pray "Hallowed be Thy Name", in particular referring to the Name of our Heavenly Father. St. Paul, in writing to the Philippians, specifically speaks to reverence for the Name of Jesus: "Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name which is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father" (2:9-11, RSV-Catholic Edition). In the Divine Praises we pray "Blessed be the Name of Jesus." The name "Jesus" is from the Aramaic and means "God saves." There are many times in the Gospel that individuals call upon the Name of Jesus for healing. Even the demons in the Gospel know Jesus by name and His power over them. Devotion to the Holy Name of Jesus goes back to the 13th century. St. Bernardine of Siena, a Franciscan, greatly promoted this devotion, as have other saints throughout the centuries. May we hold the Name of Jesus in great reverence. May we call upon the Name of Jesus for healing, for forgiveness, for strength and courage, for guidance in our daily lives. Blessed be the Name of Jesus!

WEEKLY REFLECTION

In today's reading from the Letter to the Corinthians, Paul considers the idea of spiritual gifts. He reminds us that all spiritual gifts are from God, and are given to each one of us for the good of

the community. Paul also speaks to the vast variety of gifts by using the analogy of the human body. Everyone is given spiritual gifts according to the Spirit's choice or direction. For example, some of us are speakers; others of us are listeners. Discovering individual spiritual gifts is accomplished by listening to the Spirit. While you listen and look, make no mistake: Every one of us, every believer, is given at least one spiritual gift; no one is passed over in the distribution.

We belong to one body by virtue of our Baptism; so the contributions that we individually make to the body are equally needed. No one's spiritual gift is for his or her own glory. Rather, gifts are a trust put into each person's hands to help us grow the church. Our individual gifts are not for show, but for service to our brothers and sisters in community. All of us need each of us! Let us live up to our Baptismal call to share our gifts with one another.

From the Desk of Fr. Cronin

Last Monday, January 17, we observed Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr. Day 2022. The Most Reverend Jose H. Gomez, Archbishop of Los Angeles and President of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops shared this Statement for Observance of Rev.

Martin Luther King, Jr. Day 2022. I would like to share it with you:

"We recall once again this year, the witness and legacy of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Let us remember not only the justice that he pursued, but how he pursued it.

Rev. King was driven by the biblical vision of righteousness and truth, a vision that he understood to be reflected in our nation's founding documents. He believed in what he called the "American creed," the belief expressed by our founders that all men and women are created equal and endowed by God with a sacred dignity and undeniable rights to life, liberty, and equality.

More than a half-century after his death, America faces many challenges - this ongoing pandemic, issues of economic inequality and racial discrimination, violence in our communities, the struggle to welcome immigrants and refugees. In recent years, our nation has also become more polarized and our divisions angrier.

As we look to our future, let us continue to draw from Rev. King's wisdom, especially his commitment to the Beatitudes of Jesus, and the principles of nonviolence and love for our enemies.

In his Letter from a Birmingham Jail, Rev. King reminds us that we are brothers and sisters, part of a beautiful web of relationships of mutual care, each of us depending on others as others depend on us. "Injustice anywhere is a threat to justice everywhere," he wrote. "We are ... tied in a single garment of destiny. Whatever affects one directly, affects all indirectly."

Let us go forward in that same spirit of fraternity and solidarity, and let us carry on his work for equality and justice. As we remember Rev. King, let us continue to learn from him and imitate his example and prophetic witness."


