Dear Faithful of Sacred Heart,

First, I must say a quick word of thanks to all who organized, cooked and came to the welcoming reception between Masses last Sunday. It was very encouraging to be with all of you and enjoy some fellowship, not to mention the food was excellent! I look forward to coming together for many more events in the future!

I would specifically like to ask you to mark your calendars for our upcoming parish picnic on Saturday August 7th at 6pm (After the 5pm Mass) in the parking lot. This will also mark the end of Vacation Bible School, it will be a great time for all of us to gather together and enjoy some delicious food and fun. I look forward to seeing all of you there!

Secondly, a note on increased Confession times. On Saturdays, the Sacrament of Confession will be offered from 4-4:45 before the 5pm Mass. On Sundays, Confession will be offered from 7:15-7:45 before the 8am Mass and from 9:45-10:15 before the 10:30 am Mass.

Let's take a moment and examine the amazing things that take place in the Sacrament of Confession (the soul's bath). The penitent confesses their sins to the priest who acts in persona Christi (in the person of Christ) to completely absolve them. The sinner who comes with a contrite heart and a firm purpose of amendment gets to hear some of the most beautiful words in all the earth from the mouth of the priest: "God the Father of mercies through the death and resurrection of His Son has reconciled the world to Himself and sent the Holy Spirit among us for the forgiveness of sins, through the ministry of the Church may God give you pardon and peace and I absolve you from your sins in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." These are life changing words, literally.

Our Lord Himself once reaffirmed to St. Faustina Kowalska the amazing power of this sacrament when He stated: "Tell souls where they are to look for solace, that is, in the Tribunal of Mercy (the Sacrament of Confession). There the greatest miracles take place and are incessantly repeated. To avail oneself of this miracle, it is not necessary to go on a great pilgrimage, or to carry out some external ceremony; it suffices to come with faith to the feet of My representative and to reveal to Him one's misery, and the miracle of Divine Mercy will be fully demonstrated. Were souls like a decaying corpse so that from a human standpoint there would be no hope of restoration and everything would already be lost, it is not so with God. The miracle of Divine Mercy restores that soul in full" (Diary of Divine Mercy, 1448).

One of the greatest things a human being can experience in this life is to be forgiven of their sins, this is at the very core of our Faith. The forgiveness of sins brings freedom to us in the deepest fiber of our being and then, with hearts set free and full of gratitude, we go out into the world as stars shining in the midst of a dark world, we emanate the glow that comes from being in God's grace and manifest ourselves as His sons and daughters so that all around us may experience the same healing and freedom that God has granted to us. This all starts first by making a good examination of conscience and letting the Blood and Water of Jesus wash out the dark stains of sin and a guilty conscience.
