Celebrating a Season of Creation

Do you know about the Season of Creation: Sept. 1 to Oct. 4?

As September begins, our thoughts naturally turn to the autumn season. We look forward to the beauty of fall foliage and golden colors throughout our landscapes or gardens. They remind us that it is time to give thanks for nature's bounty and for God's creation.

In times past, the Church observed certain days to thank God for the fruits of the earth. However, the broader practice of asking God's favor on all living things has been in existence since ancient times. In recent decades our bishops and three popes have been teaching in various documents and statements about our need to care for the earth.

Some time ago Orthodox Christians began observing a Day of Prayer for Creation on Sept. 1. We Catholic Christians joined them recently, by a joint statement of Pope Francis and Orthodox Patriarch Bartholomew.

Praying and caring for Creation has expanded to a global Catholic and ecumenical celebration with the Season of Creation: Sept. 1 to Oct. 4. Plan to set aside time this year to celebrate and to act with care for all God's creation.

Dear Faithful of Sacred Heart,

I have been greatly encouraging visits to the Blessed Sacrament and spending quality time in Eucharistic Adoration. To further encourage you in this practice, I post this helpful list below with things you can do when you enter into the presence of the Lord. He is always with us. He is always waiting for us. He always loves us:

ADORATION: Twenty-Five Things to “Do”

1. Slowly repeat “Jesus, I trust in you,” or “Jesus, I love you,” or “Jesus, forgive me.”
2. Look at Jesus with love; let Him look at you with love. [intimacy: “into-me-see”]
3. For a time, don’t “do” anything, but simply be still and know that He is God.
4. Consider that the Sacred Body of Jesus came from Holy Mary. Thank her.
5. Ask Him: Lord, what do you want me to do? How you want me to do it?
6. Slowly read Sacred Scripture until something hits you, then ponder it.
7. Slowly repeat “Holy Mary,” like a little child saying “momma.”
8. Pray one Hail Mary/Our Father/Apostles’ Creed very slowly.
9. Tell Jesus something that made you happy. Then listen.
10. Tell Him something that you fear or dread. Then listen.
11. Meditate on the Beatitudes (Matthew 5) or the Psalms.
12. Enjoy simply being in His Presence.
13. Pray all or part of the Holy Rosary.
14. Sing a song to Him in your heart.
15. Tell Him what angers you. Then listen.
16. Tell Him your failures. Ask for help. Then listen.
17. Thank Him for His Real Presence in the Eucharist.
18. Speak with Him about loved ones. Pray for an enemy.
19. See Our Lord in His Passion... stand there, with Him, as Our Lady does.
20. Be aware that He is sending out graces to the world right now, through you.
21. Pray to St. Joseph for the grace of final perseverance, especially at life’s end.
22. Pray for the Holy Souls in Purgatory, especially any relatives who may need prayer.
23. See the Blessed Virgin kneeling next to you, adoring her Son, and praying with you.
24. Pray the Jesus Prayer: “Lord Jesus Christ, son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner.”
25. Pray for the pope, bishops, priests, consecrated religious, and for strong Catholic marriages.

Be assured of my prayers for you and your families everyday.

Question:

We live in a country that upholds the separation of Church and state. What is the role of Catholics in society?

Answer:

The role of the Church in the world has taken different forms over time, but the theme is the same. Be disciples in it! As the lay faithful — that is, not vowed priest or religious — we are called to live and love in the circumstances of our daily lives. St. John Paul II wrote a document about the laity. In it he wrote, “In their situation in the world God manifests His plan and communicates to them their particular vocation of seeking the Kingdom of God by engaging in temporal affairs and by ordering them according to the plan of God” (On the Lay Members of Christ’s Faithful, 15).

God wants us in the hospitals, the board rooms, the law offices, the food pantries, and the little league games! We are to engage in the affairs of the world. But when we’re there, we should live the plan of God. We need to respect those around us, engage in just business and legal practices, and love our children. We should care for the earth, use our money wisely, and get to know our neighbors. We must advocate for social policies that respect human dignity and human freedom. No matter our state in life, we are invited to build the kingdom of God!
