Dear Faithful of Sacred Heart,

One of the things I would like to continue to elaborate on is our mission as Catholics to be a healing balm in the life of others. The Holy Spirit exhorts us in the writings of St. Paul: “bear one another’s burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ” (Galatians 6:2). As we go throughout our days do we recognize that all those around us are bearing burdens? Wouldn’t it be nice if they met fellow travelers on the way that helped them to carry their Cross, people whom they met who reflected the merciful face of Christ? Furthermore, do we recognize that what we do to our brothers and sisters we do unto Christ? Our Lord made this abundantly clear in Matthew 25 when He tells us about the Last Judgment; He clearly states that what we do to the least of His brothers and sisters

we do to Him.

One of the keys to authentic joy in this life is truly summed up in the abbreviation JOY (Jesus-Others-You). When we start to be sensitive to the needs of the Heart of Christ and the needs of our brothers and sisters a beautiful transition takes place in our lives and we start to taste more and more of authentic happiness. When we are instruments of God’s goodness we are granted a taste in that same goodness we pass on to others. St. Teresa of Calcutta is a prime example of everything I am talking about. In the midst of Calcutta, India, one of the most impoverished, desolate and hottest (St. Teresa said it was hotter than hell!) places in the world, she brought God’s beauty and light.

St. Teresa had a ton of work she could do everyday in caring for the poor but she insisted that every day she and her Missionaries of Charity begin and end in front of the Eucharist, she stated: “To be able to live this life of vows, these four vows, we need our life to be woven with the Eucharist. That’s why we begin our day with Jesus in the Holy Eucharist. With him, we go forward. And when we come back in the evening we have one hour of adoration before Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, and at this you will be surprised that we have not had to cut down our work for the poor.”

Here is how we can use the playbook from St. Teresa’s life to become people of authentic joy and healing for others. First, we become deeply Eucharistic (going to Mass often (even daily), spending time in Eucharistic Adoration, visiting the Lord, cherishing our time of thanksgiving after receiving the Eucharist). Secondly, we take that Eucharistic love into our day by remembering St. Teresa’s favorite passage of the Bible: “You did it to me.” We apply this to every thought, word and action throughout our day, especially in regards to how we treat our neighbor.

My dear friends, becoming deeply Eucharistic and then going out and being an instrument of God’s mercy is a recipe for how to go to Heaven. But it is not only a recipe for that, but a recipe on how to already taste Heaven here on Earth. Heaven is where God is, that is the basic definition. If we live in constant union with God in the Eucharist and in our neighbor we are in constant touch with God, thereby already receiving a foretaste of Heavenly glory. May Our Lord Jesus Christ grant you His grace to become the light you are created to be.

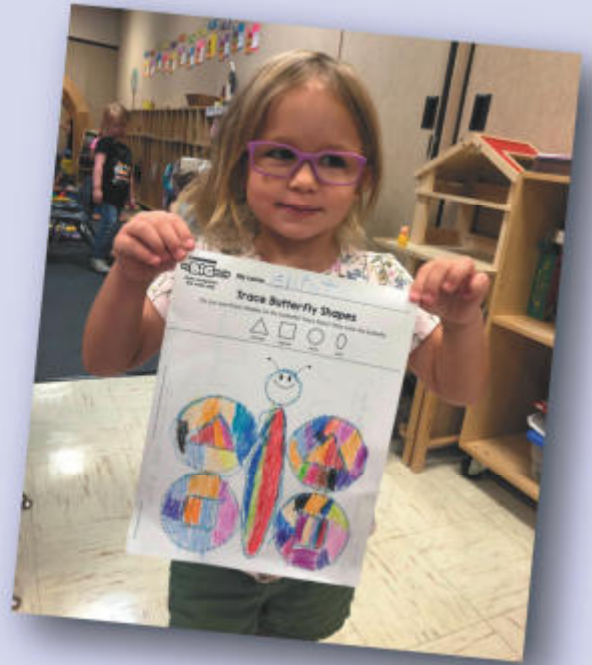

What's happening in PSR?

Preschool- They read the story of Peter in the New Testament and discussed how we can follow Jesus each day. They also talked about the role of Saints and they completed a color sheet about the Gospel reading.

Communion Fasting

Question: Do we need to fast for one hour before Mass, or one hour before communion?

Answer: The practice of fasting before receiving the Eucharist is a centuries-old act of devotion that was once very different than it is today. In the 1917 Code of Canon Law, for example, anyone who wanted to receive the Eucharist had to fast from midnight until the time of communion (even water and medications were forbidden). Over the following decades, the rules for the Eucharistic fast were relaxed, first by Pope Pius XII and, later, by Pope Saint Paul VI.

The current Code of Canon Law (1983) states very clearly: “A person who is to receive the Most Holy Eucharist is to abstain for at least one hour before holy communion from any food and drink, except for only water and medicine” (Canon 919, §1). And, in the case of those who are ill and the elderly, the rules are even more accommodating, “The elderly, the infirm, and those who care for them can receive the Most Holy Eucharist even if they have eaten something within the preceding hour” (Canon 919, §3).

So, if we strictly follow the “letter of the law,” the fast is calculated from the time of Holy Communion and not the start of Mass. However, when we remember why we fast — it is a reminder of the deeper hungers of the spirit that our physical thirst or hunger symbolize — we see that the issue is much bigger than simply fulfilling what is called for by Church Law and tradition. Joining fasting to our prayers and reflection before Mass is an opportunity to really center ourselves and to prepare our minds, hearts, and bodies to welcome the One we receive in the Eucharist.
