Dear Faithful of Sacred Heart,
 Last week we talked about the Church rediscovering the fact that everyone, no matter their state in life, is called to holiness. This is the foundation of our pursuing the spiritual life, the fact that we are called by God. St. John Paul stated that the Holy Spirit is calling the church to rediscover this universal call to holiness. John Paul then went on to state one of the fundamental things that must take place in our lives in order to attain this holiness: journeying into the depths of prayer.

Let me take a second here to give you some of my own personal thoughts on the joy that comes from having a serious and solid prayer life. This has been something that has been deeply impressed on my mind for the last couple of weeks. There are many things in this life that are supposed to offer us rest according to the world's standards; one of these things is vacation. We have probably had some experience with this in the last couple months being summer. I myself took a little vacation recently to visit some old friends.

Dear friends, there has been a profound change in my life due to receiving many graces from God in prayer. Many of the things that this world offers that may have offered entertainment and refreshment at some point, have, quite frankly, become paltry to me. These thoughts have come to me even after journeying to places such as Rome, Spain and the like. As I have taken some time to reflect on why this is, I have come to this conclusion: vacations and entertainment are not as appealing to me as they once were because I spend a ton of time on vacation every day.

Now, at this point you may ask : you're on vacation every day? Let me explain. The vacation I take every day is to be in deep communion with the Lord in prayer. This is what gives me the deepest sense of joy, wonder and satisfaction in this life. I particularly think of the times when I rest in the presence of the tabernacle, in the presence of the Eucharistic Lord, in solitude. My friends, this is true vacation, the place where we find refreshment of soul, lying down in the green pastures the Good Shepherd offers to each of us. After you have spent concerted amounts of time in the presence of the Living and Breathing Lord Jesus, where all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge are contained, those shiny things the world offers start to lose much of their luster.

Being still and knowing that He is God...dear friends, once again, this is true vacation, and it is offered to us everyday. I can't encourage you enough to pop in the chapel once a day, even for 5-10 minutes of true vacation...being in the presence of the Living God. Even the roots of the word vacation come out of this experience: being still in the presence of God. In Psalm 46:10 we read the very words I have been expounding upon : "Be still and know that I am God." If you read the passage in latin it says this : "Vacate et videte quoniam ego sum Deus." Notice the root of the word vacation : "vacate".

Prayer is an ever deepening pool where we journey into true vacation with the Lord of Angels. More pure enjoyment, peace and tranquility of soul is offered there than any other place in the world. I heartily encourage you to enter into the vacation of prayer everyday. Next week, John Paul II will instruct us on how we can achieve this more deeply. Be assured of my prayers for you and your families.
