Dear Faithful of Sacred Heart,

Before we dive further in to St. John Paul II's teaching on how we can truly enter into the deep levels of prayer, I would like to speak about a feast we recently celebrated in the Church that is near and dear to my heart; specifically, the Solemnity of the Holy Archangels: Michael, Gabriel and Raphael. St. John Paul II will also figure prominently into the equation.

One of the aids that God has given each of us in this life is the protection and guidance of the Holy Angels; those blessed spirits who chose to follow Him when they were created. These angels are now confirmed in goodness and are faithful and true protectors for us as we journey through this valley of tears. The Catechism of the Catholic Church states this: "From its beginning until death, human life is surrounded by their

watchful care and intercession. Beside each believer stands an angel as protector and shepherd leading him to life. Already here on earth the Christian life shares by faith in the blessed company of angels and men united in God." (CCC 336).

Having felt the sincere protection of the angels throughout my journey, this is something that I want to translate into the parish as a whole, calling on angelic protection together. St. John Vianney states this: "Private prayer is like straw scattered here and there: If you set it on fire it makes a lot of little flames. But gather these straws into a bundle and light them, and you get a mighty fire, rising like a column into the sky; public prayer is like that." I would like our prayers to join together in calling on angelic protection, especially as we are sent forth into the world. The most concrete way I know of doing this is to pray the prayer to St. Michael the Archangel after Mass has concluded. This is a prayer that was prayed after Mass for many years and in 1994 St. John Paul II encouraged the Church to return to it when he stated:

"The prayer can fortify us for that spiritual battle about which the Letter to the Ephesians speaks [of]: "Finally, draw your strength from the Lord and from his mighty power."(Ephesians 6:10). And to this same battle that the Book of the Apocalypse refers [to], recalling in front of our eyes the image of St. Michael the Archangel (cf. Revelation 12:7). Surely, this scene was very present to Pope Leo XIII, when, at the end of the previous century, he introduced to the entire Church a special prayer to St. Michael: "St. Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle; be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil..." Even if today this prayer is no longer recited at the end of the Eucharistic celebration, I invite all to not forget it, but to recite it in order to obtain help in the battle against the forces of darkness and the spirit of this world."

With JP II's words in tow, I invite you to recite the prayer to St. Michael with me after Mass has concluded. May he protect us as we are sent forth on mission. The words are as follows:

"St. Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle, be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil. May God rebuke him, we humbly pray, and do thou, O prince of the heavenly hosts, by the power of God cast into hell Satan and all the evil spirits who prowl about the world seeking the ruin of souls. Amen."


Kindergarten- They talked about the importance of us showing our love for God by following the commandments He gave us.

From the classroom

This past Sunday the Theology of the Body Class discussed what hope and redemption in Christ looks like. Corey started the night with a crisp new ten dollar bill and asked the class



who wanted it. Of course they all did. Next, Corey crumpled the bill and asked who wanted it. Finally he dropped the crumpled bill to the ground and stomped on it. He then picked up the bill and asked the class if the bill still had value. The class said the value had not changed. Corey explained that no matter how worthless they may feel or how many times they or someone else has “stomped on them” each one of them is still a person of great worth. The class also read and discussed the Prodigal Son from Luke 15. Yvonne led the class in the Dive In portion of the night and asked the youth to write down what about their lives they would be eager to show Jesus. She and Corey then took the class to the Chapel and asked the youth to reflect on how Jesus can turn their shame and hurt to forgiveness, peace and hope. After returning to the classroom the youth were reminded that it has been said “God knows your sins and calls you by name. The Devil knows your name, and calls you by your sins.” They discussed how the Sacrament of Reconciliation helps us to change the way we view God and view ourselves.


