



All donations will be delivered after the upcoming Super Bowl which is scheduled to be played Feb. 13, 2022. The Food Center is especially in need of CANNED CHILI BEANS, PORK AND BEANS, PASTA SAUGE (e.g. Ragu), CANNED MEATS (e.g. chicken, ravioli, spaghetti with meat), CANNED FRUIT, CANNED VEGETABLES (e.g. beets, potatoes, mixed vegetables, spinach, carrots, etc.). Please NO canned green beans or corn as there is another source for those.

Personal care items are always needed such as SHAMPOO, CONDITIONER, TOOTHBRUSHES, TOOTHPASTE, DE-ODORANT. .

Household items needed include DISH SOAP, LAUNDRY DETERGENT, TOILET PAPER.

Homeless clients always need TUNA OR CHICKEN IN A POUCH, NUTRIGRAIN BARS, POP TARTS, SINGLE SERVE FRUIT JUICE, INSTANT COFFEE.

Remember to buy pop-top lid items if possible as many cli-

Dear Sacred Heart Family,



I would like to spend a significant amount of time talking about the 15 promises of the Rosary. You may have noticed that these are featured prominently on our new parish calendars for this year. According to tradition, these promises were given by Our Lady herself to Blessed Alan De La Roche.

The first promise that Our Lady gave to Blessed Alan to those who pray the Rosary faithfully is : *"Whoever shall faithfully serve me by the recitation of the Rosary, shall receive signal graces."* Signal graces are "signs and answered prayers... It's like trail markers or signposts that whisper in our ear: "This is the way, walk this path." We could easily view these as little encouragements that Our Blessed Mother obtains for us to speed us on the path to Heaven. What a gift it is to receive these little encouragements from our

Heavenly Mother!

I have received many of these little encouragements in day to day life, they are always reassuring that Our Lord and Our Lady are with me..and what a great feeling that is! For example, one that comes to mind is when I had been going to visit someone in the hospital. As I was approaching the building I kept hearing interiorly "I was sick and you visited me". This thought kept ringing through my head. When I entered the hospital that evening one of the first things that caught

my attention was a sign on one of the hospital walls that said "I was sick and you visited me"(Matthew 25:36). Little things like this warm the soul and give you fuel to keep pursuing the path that the Lord has traced out for you. I want to encourage you to pray the Rosary so that Our Lady may, in turn, encourage you on your journey.

While we are on this topic of walking through our earthly journey with Our Lady I want to pass on another little tool that I have received in my spiritual toolbox. Whenever I go on a trip, a journey or whatsoever I say a little beautiful prayer asking Our Mother to watch over me:

"Immaculate Heart of Mary, cause of our joy, be with us on our way for all your ways are holy and all your paths are peace."

Dear friends, it makes me feel good as the spiritual father of this community when I know that the children are being kept safe under the protective mantle of Our Lady, please fly to her protection so that she can protect us, as a family, all the way into the Heavenly gates.

Let me end with a pious story that brings this home. St. Peter is the saint who was given the keys to the Kingdom. One day Our Lord approached St. Peter and asked him about his duty as the Heavenly gatekeeper. Our Lord specifically asked St. Peter how so many people had gotten into Heaven who weren't on the list of entry. St. Peter replied "Lord, every time I close the door to someone, Our Mother opens a window."

May our beautiful Heavenly mother open the windows of God's grace to you through the recitation of the Rosary. Everyday. Be assured of my prayers for you and your families.

The saint I chose for confirmation is Saint Francis of Assisi. St. Francis of Assisi was born in Italy approximately in 1181. He was known for drinking and partying in his youth. He fought in a battle between Assisi and Perugia. After that he was captured and imprisoned for ransom and spent nearly a year in prison while waiting for his father's payment. While in jail he began getting visions from God. After being let out from prison, Francis began to hear the voice of Christ. The voice of Christ told him to repair the Christian church and live a life of poverty. He abandoned his old ways of partying and began to devote his time to his faith. His reputation began spreading all throughout the Christian world. Later in life He reportedly received a vison that left him with a stigmata of Christ. This made Francis the first person to receive such holy wounds. He was canonized as a saint on July 16 th of 1228. all animals and allegedly preached to even the birds. Saint Francis of Assisi's died on October 3, 1226. He was 44 years old.

When the man healed, he said he felt remorse and decided to reunite and reconcile with God. Another miracle St. Francis preformed was when there was a wolf attacking people and other animals in his province, he tried to tame it. The wolf charged St. Francis but he prayed and moved toward the wolf. The wolf obeyed St. Francis commands. St. Francis promised that the townspeople would feed the wolf regularly if the wolf would stop attacking people and other animals. The wolf never harmed another person or animal again.

What's Happening in PSR?

<u>Preschool</u>. They discussed baptism and learned that we are baptized with water but Jesus baptizes with the Holy Spirit. They also added their hands to the New Years Resolution board to remember to pray often in 2022.

<u>Second Grade-</u> The students learned that Jesus is their example of holiness and God the Father wants them to listen to Him. They read the Good News parable.


