The Food Center is especially in need of CANNED CHILI BEANS, PORK AND BEANS, PASTA SAUGE (e.g. Ragu), CANNED MEATS (e.g. chicken, ravioli, spaghetti with meat), CANNED FRUIT, CANNED VEGETABLES (e.g. beets, potatoes, mixed vegetables, spinach, carrots, etc.). Please NO canned green beans or corn as there is another source for those. Personal care items are always needed such as SHAMPOO, CON-DITIONER, TOOTHBRUSHES, TOOTHPASTE, DEODORANT. . Household items needed include DISH SOAP, LAUNDRY DETER-GENT, TOILET PAPER.

Homeless clients always need TUNA OR CHICKEN IN A POUCH, NUTRIGRAIN BARS, POP TARTS, SINGLE SERVE FRUIT JUICE, INSTANT COFFEE.

Remember to buy pop-top lid items if possible as many clients have no can openers.

Wonders of the Rosary



"In The Secret of the Rosary, St. Louis de Montfort recounts the following story about what happened when St. Dominic encountered a man possessed by 15,000 demons: While St. Dominic was preaching the rosary in Carcassone [France], a heretic made fun of the miracles and the fifteen mysteries of the holy rosary [this was before the Luminous Mysteries], and this prevented other heretics from being converted. As a punishment, God

suffered fifteen thousand devils to enter the man's body. His parents took him to Father Dominic to be delivered from the evil spirits.

He [St. Dominic] started to pray and begged everyone who was there to say the rosary out loud with him, and at each Hail Mary Our Lady drove one hundred devils out of the heretic's body and they came out in the form of red hot coals. Demons have a tremendous fear of the rosary. Saint Dominic knew this, and so he employed the rosary as a form of exorcism.

Our Lady had taught the founder of the rosary that in order to overcome the devil, he needed to fight fire with fire. The rosary is divine fire! Saint Bonaventure once put it this way: As wax melts before fire, so do the devils lose their power against those souls who remember the name of Mary and devoutly invoke it."

Hello, my name is Blake McBride. I am a sophomore in high school and enjoy being around my friends, fishing, spending time with my family, and learning about history and science.




